Ministry Opportunities

We have been studying Acts in our Bible Study. Acts is a wonderful book, because it's intended by Luke (who wrote it) to be Part II to his gospel. Together, Luke and Acts form a two-part instruction manual for Christians; that's Luke's intent. We could view it as a discipleship guide or as a catechism, and both would be correct.

Acts is wonderful also as the primary source of the birth and unfolding of the Church. Jesus commissions his eleven apostles to wait and pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit. And before his Ascension, Jesus reveals that the Scriptures were about *him* — his suffering, his death, his resurrection, and for preaching repentance in his name. At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit comes, and the Church is born. Peter steps into the leadership that Christ gave him, when Jesus restored him (Feed my flock!) after Peter's denial of him. Three thousand souls are convicted of crucifying Jesus, repent, and are baptized. Then,

And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. (Acts 2:42, ESV)

The very next scene is Peter and John going to the Temple for a service of prayer. (They really did devote themselves to prayer!) But at the Temple, they are interrupted by a lame man asking for alms. He gets more than he bargained for; Jesus heals the man through Peter. The result? The man leaps up and begins praising God. The prayer service is interrupted by God's healing of this man. The stage is set for Peter to give his second sermon.

At both Pentecost and this healing, Peter takes advantage of the opportunities that present themselves to him. The Holy Spirit descends, Peter recognizes this, and helps his hearers see what has happened. Then, Jesus heals the man *through Peter* and the interest is piqued of all the people who know the man. Peter then uses this situation to tell the good news. Imagine he hadn't! People have gathered around him to find out what has happened; he must say something.

As we reflected together in Bible Study, so I invite you into this same question. Likewise, opportunities — albeit very different — present themselves to us. What opportunities have been presented to you for you to share your faith in Christ, to pray for someone, or to help someone see how God is at work in their lives?

Lutheran Week Volunteer Roles Needed

<u>Host:</u> Individuals in this role will act as greeters and provide information to attendees. They will be stationed in certain places throughout the building to help attendees find the meeting rooms, restrooms, meal areas, and display area.

<u>Registration:</u> Individuals in this role will welcome and check in attendees.

This includes distributing materials and nametags.

<u>Display Assistant:</u> Individuals in this role will assist the various ministries in setting up displays, getting materials to the display area, and finding their way around the hotel.

<u>Usher:</u> Individuals in this role will assist in all general sessions by checking credentials at doors, providing information or assistance, and accepting the offering as well as guiding attendees during communion during worship services.

<u>First Aid/Medical Response:</u> Individuals that may be in one of the other roles but are trained in First Aid/Medical Response and can also assist in case of an emergency.


