Greetings Saints of Emmanuel:

Judgment is coming.

As the end of the Church Year approaches, we are being reminded that Christ is Judge. Advent soon will begin, which continues this theme, for advent means *coming*. As we confess in worship: "Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again."

We perhaps may think of advent as *only* Christ's first coming, and indeed his incarnation as an infant in the womb of Mary is extraordinarily compelling and wonderful. In his first coming, he came to take *our* judgment upon himself -- and he did, giving his life in death on the cross for us.

But he will come again. When he returns, he returns to extend that same mercy to all who have placed their hope in him. That is the *favorable* judgment that we shall receive, though we do not deserve it. But his coming also means that those who did not place their hope in him will never receive his mercy. We tend to be a bit squeamish about proclaiming this part of the gospel, but we must not ignore it. From the sermon:

"Only God can separate someone from him, and he has given this power to Jesus — the power to banish those who have rejected Jesus and his resurrection and his forgiveness to eternity in hell. Hell is usually an uncomfortable idea to our ears, but this uncomfortableness does not make it any less true. Hell is real and true, and thus will be infinitely more uncomfortable for those who are banished from God's presence there, than us simply speaking of it in this life. It will do us no good to be afraid of speaking of any of those things which our Lord Jesus himself has spoken of."

For those who believe and love Jesus, judgment will be the *resurrection unto eternal life*. For those who have rejected Jesus, it will mean hell.
