Mission District Convocation

THIS SATURDAY, October 18 **at Emmanuel**, 8AM, Stuff the Truck 9AM, Opening Worship Service Overall, 8AM-3PM

Mission District Convocation is THIS WEEK, and we still need lots of help to make it happen! We are most in need of help with Friday setup and mealtime help (servers, prep, grill). More details below!

How can I serve for the mission district convocation?

- 1. **Attend**. Just like local politics have big outcomes, so, too, do local, regional church events. We will begin with Stuff the Truck at 8am and then kick off convocation with a worship service at 9am.
- 2. **Bring** items, Bibles, & kits for Disaster Response. We will pack these Friday at 10AM and then load them in the truck Saturday at 8AM.
- 3. **Friday Setup at 10AM**. This will involve two things: (1) preparing kits for Stuff the Truck, and (2) moving furnishings/chairs in the Narthex, in Heritage Hall, and in Luther Hall in preparation for Saturday. We will also prep coffee and beverages. *We could use a few more people to help on Friday*.
 - We will need to set up 6 tables in Heritage Hall for displays, additional tables for snacks and beverages, and 2 tables (with a few chairs each) in the Narthex for registration.
 - We will also need to set up Luther Hall with 14 round tables (8 chairs each) and a buffet line (3-4 long tables)
 - A diagram of each space will be available to help with setup.
- 4. **Bring snacks** (savory and sweet) by 7:30AM on Saturday to Heritage Hall. These will be for anyone to enjoy, especially for breakfast fare and especially during session breaks. (We need to have these set up when people begin to arrive at 8AM, so please plan to have them here by 7:30!)
- 5. **Greet people** as they arrive: Saturday, 8-9AM. We will need a couple of people upstairs and downstairs helping to direct people where to go and help them find parking, bathrooms, etc. Registration will take place in the lobby and Stuff the Truck will be in the lower parking lot. Convocation will be in the sanctuary with refreshments in Heritage Hall and lunch in Luther Hall. Signs are posted around the church with more information!
- 6. **Worship** together. Join for worship at 9AM.
- 7. **Grill**, prep, and food readiness from 10AM-noon. After worship, help with prep work (onions, tomatoes, lettuce) and grilling. We will grill brats, burgers, and hot dogs. We will set up roasters to keep the meat warm.
 - We anticipate people will be coming to lunch around noon. We will therefore have the majority of the meats finished and delivered by 11:30.
 - We will need a food runner to assist the grillers with bringing the food into Luther Hall, setting up warmers, etc.
- 7. Help during mealtime, 11:30-1:30PM. Make sure the line runs smoothly, help

folks get meals who might have trouble, and keep an eye out for drink refills.

- Lunch will begin around noon. We will need to have the full buffet set up by then.
- Servers will be responsible for serving water and lemonade to people at their tables, keeping the buffet stocked, and getting food for anyone who has difficulty walking or standing in line.
- Lunch is set to conclude at 1:15, at which point cleanup will begin.
- 8. **Clean up.** 3PM onwards. We will need help with trash, cleanup, and rearranging after the convocation.
 - Luther and Heritage Halls will need to be cleared of trash, food put away, and tables and chairs restored to their regular configuration.
 - The sanctuary and Narthex will also need to be checked for trash and lightly cleaned.

What We Heard

No matter what forces, whether in the realm of the body or the spirit, are at work against the apostles and the Word, the Word nevertheless increases. Now to the complaint. This "murmuring" calls to mind the murmurs of the Israelites in the wilderness, which resulted in manna from heaven for daily bread and quail for meat (Exodus 16). But this murmuring also brought about the death of those who were unsatisfied with just the manna, and who demanded meat, resulting in a great plague that put them to death (see Numbers 11). The Israelites' murmuring ultimately resulted in that generation's not being allowed to enter the Land of Promise (Deuteronomy 1:26-27, 34; Numbers 14:26-30).

And so, they were made to wander until that generation—the same one that was liberated from Egypt!—died off. All this to say that murmuring is a dangerous and deadly thing for a congregation.

What We Reflected On

What can stop the spread of the gospel? *Nothing*. But we can be made to wither and wilt if we refrain from sharing the good news of the resurrection.
