Last Weeks Services, 10 Holy Week is upon us.

I strongly encourage you to come, not only to Easter Sunday, but to Maundy Thursday and Good Friday as well. (And, a reminder, you're also invited to the Stations of the Cross on Holy Saturday, from 10AM-noon).

The evening of Maundy Thursday through Easter is considered one single event, and thus is accorded one single worship service, called The Three Days (or the Triduum). The betrayal, commandment, and Lord's Supper on Maundy Thursday, the death of Jesus on the cross on Good Friday, the resting in the tomb on Saturday (the Sabbath), and the rising from the tomb at dawn on Sunday are considered the single, central act of Jesus for our salvation.

Each reveals something distinct about salvation, and each has a distinct feel or character. Maundy Thursday is quite intimate; Good Friday is dark, melancholy; Easter is joyful.

And though the Easter joy is what we are promised and what we long for, yet on this side of the grave is still suffering and grief. The Lord's betrayal, suffering, and death sanctifies our own suffering and grief. His suffering gives our own suffering roots, depth, and meaning.

There is no Resurrection without Good Friday, no Good Friday without the betrayal and Lord's Supper of Maundy Thursday, no Maundy Thursday without Christ's entrance into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, no Palm Sunday without the intense ministry of Jesus' miracles & teaching over three years, no three-year ministry of Jesus without his Baptism, no Baptism without his birth and John's birth, no birth without the of Jesus without the prophets foretelling him, no prophets without God's promise to Abraham, no promise to Abraham without the Fall – and nothing at all without the Creation of the world and mankind.

All of human history comes to a point on Good Friday, and from that moment, all of human history forks in two. On one path is found all those who are like the criminal who mocked Jesus; on the other path is found all those who are like the other criminal who confessed from his cross that he was guilty and Jesus was innocent.

The criminal who cries out that Jesus was innocent – while the whole crowd was either mocking Jesus or silent – is a testament to his incredible faith. To be numbered with this criminal is a great privilege. To be numbered among the faithful is a great joy.

And so, if you have never come to Maundy Thursday or Good Friday, or if it has been some time, come. There is a richness, holiness, depth, and beauty present in this service that is lovely.

Come, let us worship him.
