DeRouchey's Delight

Dear Faith Family,

I will be leaving following Sunday masses for the annual Clergy Days in Chamberlain. ALL the active clergy of the diocese are expected to attend this annual event and our retired clergy are encouraged to attend.

This year's main presenter will be Dr. Mark Giszczak, Professor of Sacred Scripture, who recently joined the faculty at Saint Paul Seminary. He specializes in Old Testament Wisdom Literature as well as biblical theology and Catholic biblical interpretation. I am looking forward to his presentation.

In addition to Dr. Giszczak's presentation, we will have presentations from the diocese on vocation and canon law. Also, we honor those clergy who are celebrating a jubilee anniversary as well as acknowledge all those who have served our Diocese since its foundation in 1889. The festivities conclude with Bishop Donald DeGrood's remarks on Thursday.

Therefore, there are no masses scheduled for Monday through Thursday nor will there be our Thursday brown baggin' Bible study. Our regular schedule will resume on Friday.

This past week we celebrated memorial masses for the archangels and guardian angels. These celebrations open the question why we don't pray the Prayer of Saint Michael's like other parishes do at the end of Mass. The easy answer – we seek the intercession of the angels with the Mass. For example, within the preface of the Eucharistic prayer, we often seek the intercession of the nine orders or choirs of angels (Seraphim, Cherubim, Thrones, Dominations, Virtues, Powers, Principalities, Archangels and Angels). Therefore, why add to the beautiful prayer of the Mass when we have already sought Saint Michael's intercession? Was he not listening?

Additionally, often people will say when a person dies: he/she is now an angel in heaven. No. No one can become an angel. God created angels as pure spirit, meaning with no body. Therefore, we cannot EVER become an angel, but we are ALL called to be saints. However, just like us, angels were gifted with intelligence and will. Therefore, they have the ability to sin and be removed from the presence of God. It is believed that their choices were made before God created our world. Saint Thomas Aquinas believed that the angels were given a glimpse of the Word-made-man, which was too much for some of them to accept as many humans struggle to accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior.

Construction updates:

Saint Paul the Apostle – windows are completed and the tuckpointing should be finished this week. Next, it was suggested at the last finance meeting that we should consider renovating the east foyer as previously proposed with handicap bathrooms and the installation of the Saint George stained-glass window.

Sacred Heart – the hall/kitchen renovation has begun. Additionally, the parking lot project will begin this Monday. Pews/carpets will be replaced in January 2026.

Saints Peter & Paul – a proposal has been put forth to add handicap bathrooms and a lift to the east side of the church. Additionally, we will need to fix current plumbing and drainage issues.

We walked through the "whys" during the Teaching Mass but what about the "whats?" Over the next couple of weeks, we will explain in the bulletin the whats of the liturgy. For example: what are the sacred vessels:

- 1. Chalice the cup which holds the wine for consecration and communion.
- 2. Paten the plate that holds the host or altar bread.
- 3. Ciborium the covered cup which is used to store unused consecrated hosts in the tabernacle. It is also used in the distribution of the Precious Body during communion.
- 4. Tabernacle is the place where the Blessed Sacrament is reserved for the sick and for adoration.
- 5. Monstrance the vessel designed to hold and display the consecrated host when it is exposed for adoration upon the altar or carried in procession.
- 6. Pyx a small metal case in which the consecrated hosts are carried to the sick.
- 7. Oil stocks containers for the holy oils.
 - a. O.C. Oil of Catechumens blessed by the bishop during the Chrism Mass and used for baptism during the Rite of Exorcism.
 - b. S.C. Sacred Chrism consecrated by the bishop during the Chrism Mass and used in rites of baptism, confirmation, and holy orders as one receives an indelible mark upon one's soul.
 - c. O.I. Oil of the Sick (Infirmed) blessed by the bishop during the Chrism Mass and used in anointing of the sick.
