GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

I lost my wallet this year. It was such an annoyance to replace everything in it. A friend, moved by sympathy, gave me a beautiful new one. One month later I lost that one, too, with all my newly replaced cards. No matter what I did, I couldn’t find what I had lost. I resigned myself to never seeing either of my wallets again.

Fortunately, the Lord Jesus is not like me in this regard. In today’s Gospel (John 6:37–40), he says, “This is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me.” Jesus, unlike me, is ever vigilant with what the Father has given him. He searches for every lost soul — as the shepherd leaves the ninety-nine to pursue the one lost sheep, or the woman rejoices upon recovering a lost coin — and even descends to the depths of loss on the cross and into the realm of the dead to recover that which seems forever lost. On All Souls’ Day, as we remember our faithful departed, these words kindle a hope beyond hope in our hearts. Even the dead are not lost to Jesus, though they may seem so to us. Nothing entrusted to him by the Father is ever truly lost. So, we may hope that every soul, no matter how wandering or forgotten in life, is secure in his loving care and destined to be raised on the last day. DeRouchey’s Delight

Dear Faith Family,

Throughout the month of November, the Book of Remembrance will remain in the sanctuary as an invitation to include the names of our loved ones who have died in our prayers. At each mass, a petition will be offered for those listed. Additionally, November is a time when we are encouraged to visit cemeteries. The Church’s tradition of visiting cemeteries comes with indulgences. As stated in the Rites book, “an indulgence is granted to the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the dead. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls in purgatory. This indulgence is a plenary one from November 1 through November 8 and can be gained on each one of these days. On the other days of the year this indulgence is a partial one.” So, what is an “indulgence?” An indulgence is the remission in the eyes of God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose culpable element has already been taken away. Meaning --- the remnants of the sins confessed will be cleansed from our soul. To gain indulgences, one must have at least the general intention of doing so and must perform the acts enjoined at the time stipulated and in the manner required according to the tenor of the grant. God does not force His grace upon anyone. Beside the exclusion of all attachment to sin, even venial sin, the requirements for gaining a plenary indulgence are the performance of the indulgenced work and fulfillment of three conditions: sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion, and prayer for the pope’s intentions. These three conditions may be carried out several days preceding or following performance of the prescribed work. The condition requiring prayer for the pope’s intention is satisfied by reciting once the Our Father and Hail Mary for his intentions; nevertheless all the faithful have the option of reciting any other prayer suited to their own piety and devotion.

Prayer for the Deceased

God our Father, you formed us in Your likeness, and You love us all because You are the Father of us all. Hear the prayers that follow our beloved ones upon their unseen way. According to the greatness of Your mercy, welcome them and all the faithful departed into paradise. Amen.

On Thursday, we continue our stroll through the Gospel of Matthew at noon for our brown baggin’ Bible study. All are welcome!
