### GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Before I was a priest, I was a lazy worker for a retail Apple store. Hearing a rumor that my boss was going to fire me, I secretly sold iPhones for half-price, gave away dozens of free iPads, and donated several brand-new laptops to managers in other stores in the mall. After a week, my boss called me into his office. He knew what I was up to. He said I had cost the store thousands of dollars. "Really great work, John," he said. "I am going to recommend you to be my assistant manager and double your pay." I was amazed. And so are you. Which is understandable because it never happened. How could it? My tall tale is a retelling of Jesus' brow-furrowing parable we hear this week. A lazy, dishonest steward defrauds his boss and then the "master commended the dishonest servant for acting prudently" (Luke 16:8). What is the Lord saying to us? Most of us treat our spiritual lives like a lazy teenager at an Apple store. We really don't care. We go through the motions. Then, if we are lucky, something happens that shakes us to spiritual action; to employ whatever time, money, and resources we have to build around us a strong network of love. Every saint did that. Our Lord is so good he wants us to use his stuff to forgive debts and to bless others. He wants us to ensure our future. So do it! — Father John Muir

# **DeRouchey's Delight**

Dear Faith Family,

Thank you to ALL the volunteers who generously give of their time and talents to share the faith with our youth. With three parishes and three religious education programs, we needed many to set forward. Your generosity is a true witness to our faith family of your devotion to the growth of our faith community. Again, thank you. Your presence is truly appreciated!

This weekend we also acknowledge those who give of themselves as Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Communion or as lectors. By the authority granted to myself by Bishop Donald DeGrood, I will commission those who have participated in the proper training for Eucharistic Ministers. Their commissioning is for three years. A special blessing and recognition of our lectors will also be extended. Thank you for your generosity of self in proclaiming the Word of God and assisting in the distribution of the Blessed Sacrament.

The date has arrived! Monday, September 29<sup>th</sup> – the Peutz crew will begin the renovation of the hall and kitchen. To prepare for the construction, we will ask our youth to assist with the teardown of the tables and chairs on Wednesday following religious education. Also, they will be asked to assist in moving the boxes from the kitchen into storage. Those who have asked for the cabinets/counter tops, they will be placed in the parking lot on Monday and will need to be picked up that day. Additionally, the hall bathrooms will not be available; therefore, I encourage our students to use the bathroom before coming to Mass or religious education. Please be patient in this time of transition. We are looking forward to its completion.

### Waddling Ducks

Soren Kierkegaard, the Danish philosopher, once told a story about a make-believe country where only ducks lived. On Sunday morning ALL the ducks came into Church, waddled down the aisle, waddled into their pews and squatted. Then the duck minister came in, took his place behind the pulpit, opened the Duck Bible and read, "Ducks! You have wings, and with wings you can fly like eagles. You can soar into the skies! Ducks! You have wings!" All the ducks yelled, "Amen!" and then they all waddled home. NO ONE FLEW or even tried.

Isn't there too much truth to this little fable? Last Sunday's Gospel and the celebration of the Triumph of the Holy Cross challenged us to see that it is time for us to quit waddling. It is time for us to soar by using wisely our God-given talents and blessings for the welfare of others, thus glorifying God and becoming eligible for our eternal reward.

We walked through the "whys" during the Teaching Mass but what about the "whats?" Over the next couple of weeks, we will explain in the bulletin the "whats" of the liturgy. For example: What are the liturgical colors?

- 1. White is used in liturgies of the Easter and Christmas seasons; feasts and commemorations of the Lord; feasts and memorials of Mary, the angels and saints who are not martyrs. It is also the liturgical color for first communion, baptism, weddings, and funerals.
- 2. Red is used on Passion (Palm) Sunday and Good Friday, Pentecost, the celebrations of the Lord's passion, feasts of the apostles and evangelists (except for St. John's) and the celebration of martyrs. It may be used for the sacrament of confirmation.
- 3. Green is used in the liturgies of Ordinary Time.
- 4. Violet or Purple is used during Lent and Advent. A purple stole is worn for the sacrament of reconciliation and anointing of the sick.
- 5. Black may be used in liturgies for the dead.
- 6. Rose may be used on the Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday) and the Fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare Sunday).


