COACHING CONVENOR & PLAYER DEVELOPMENT – Heather Smith

This year with the emphasis on NetSetGo coaching the first coaches meeting was held on March 19th with a good turnout of interested coaches and club Convenors. The theme for this workshop was the introduction of netball to new young players and especially the coach's role to introduce their players an understanding of court positions.

On April 12th Hawkesbury held a very successful School Holiday Clinic at the complex with 45 children from Hawkesbury and the metropolitan area spending the day with Netball NSW coaches' further sharing skills of netball.

Our next workshop in June got off to a rocky start first scheduled for 24th July a Sunday morning (not a good idea) nil attendance we followed up with a workshop after training (6.30pm) on 2nd Aug., with 2017 Development coaches Sharon Bell and Brittany Hughes much more successful attendance.

The emphasis on this discussion was the importance of all coaches to understand when they sign the Rep Nomination Form they take responsibility that the player they are presenting is capable of performing at a competent level of skills required by a Representative player. Coaches who nominate a player for Representative team at all levels are encourage to attend selection and discuss with the coaches the skills of the individual player and why they thought they were of Representative standard. When a player is selected in a Rep. team the coaches job is to weld those players into a cohesive group, hone their skills and introduce court systems. A Rep coach should not have to teach a player how to catch, throw and stepping rules.

This year we were able to watch several sessions of Lisa Beehag the Head Coach of Penrith and Panthers indoor training at Windsor Indoor Centre and it was great to see 2 Hawkesbury girls Angela King and Jade Smallcombe in the PPL group. Also congratulations to Lara Cook who has been selected for further coaching at the Western Sydney Academy of sport.

Another commitment I fulfilled was the launch of "Walking Netball" a program to remove barriers to participation for older people to experience health and social benefits of the sport. I reserve my judgment on this venture by Netball NSW and NSW Department of Family and Community Services.

Finally congratulations to Alana Taufu and Mandy Bell who were awarded Junior and Senior Coaches Awards respectively for 2017.

This shows a small increase and it appears we are improving with juniors and seniors.

In 2016 we had 130 teams 2017 there are 131 the extra players seem to be taken into teams historically most teams had 8 or 9 players now it is more common to have 10 or more. Possibly clubs could form more teams as the teams fill up after registration.

I do believe the process was used in the way it was meant to. It helped teams fill teams, replace injured players and allowed some younger players experience in an older/ stronger division. I allowed an injured player to be deregistered as a dual registration so the club could then bring up another player, the original player was allowed to return to her first registered team once she was able. This may be an area to discuss. Some dual registered players played in two finals /

grand finals as was agreed on. I feel it is up to clubs to ensure those players are fit enough to play both.

Competition Comments / Issues

10 to 13 teams should be organised into junior grades rather than ages, this doesn't mean graders would place 10 year olds against 13 year olds, it would allow clubs to form teams of mixed ages into ability groups. So we could have a top 10/11 division then a less strong 10/11 and an inexperienced 10/11. If a club had an exceptional 11/12 team it could play with 12/13. The same as we have a registrars meeting to help clubs organise the intermediate divisions they could compare junior teams to decide where to ask for them to be graded. It also allows graders to move teams between divisions. Our intermediate divisions have grown because of the change from set 14 / 15 divisions and I feel this change will bring about better more equitable competitions for our younger players.

I feel where possible grades should be 6 or 8 teams. 5 teams in a grade is very disruptive to players as they play 4 games then 1 off and when holidays, state age etc occur some teams may have 4 weeks without a game. I felt it worked well in C1 and 12 Years divisions this year where everyone played each other twice then played two finals series. This meant every team was in the finals, games were close and during the rounds teams weren't playing the same teams constantly.

During the finals series NET SET GO should have their divisional bye on semi-final day to free up courts and umpires.

I am happy to hear any other suggestions as to how our competitions can be improved to give all players enjoyment and equitable games.

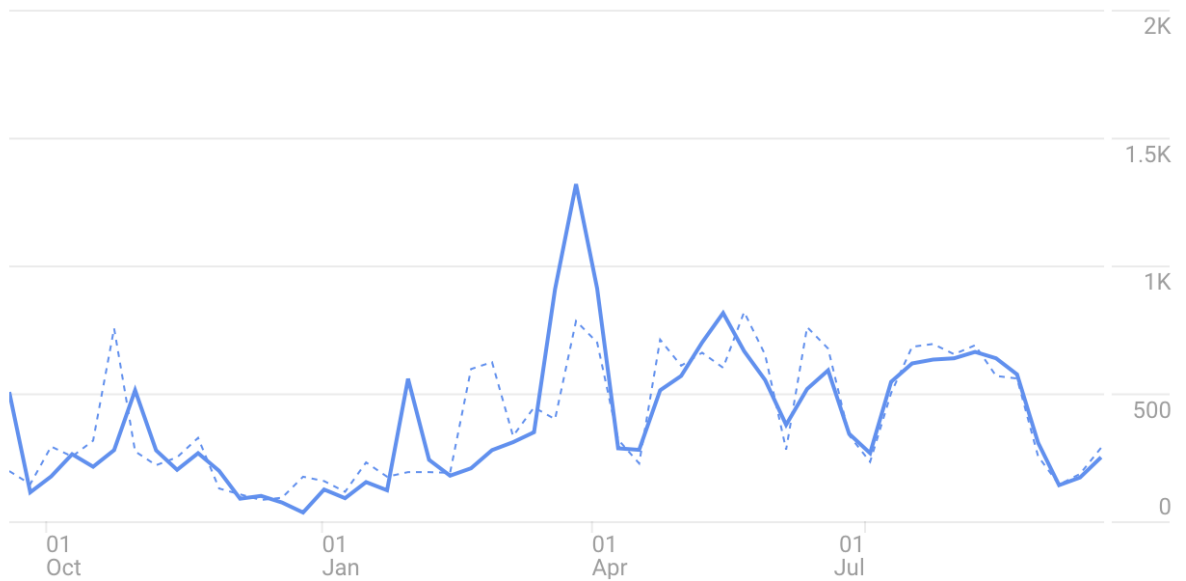

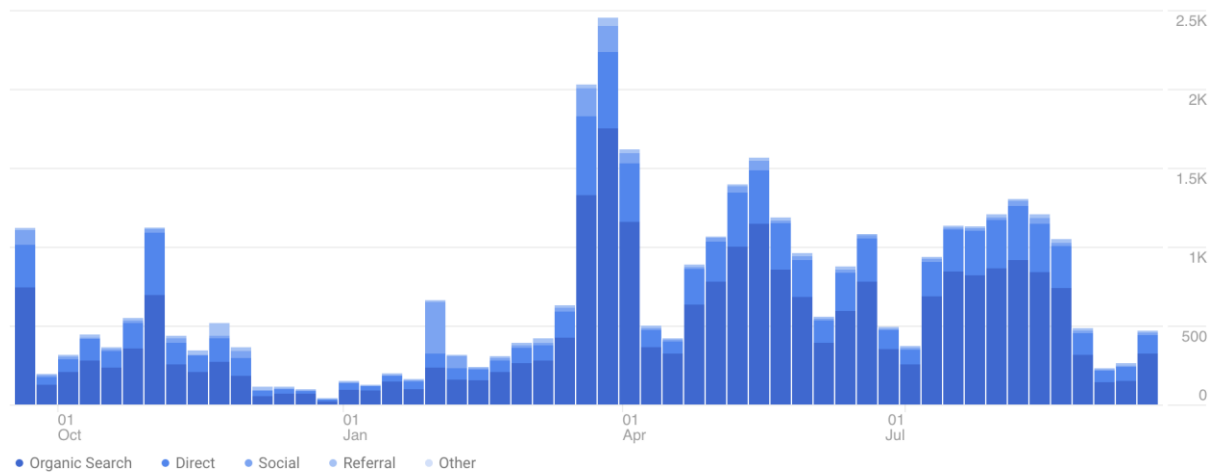
This year we had an increase in website traffic which is represented in the charts below. (12 Month period)
