## **COACHING CONVENOR & PLAYER DEVELOPMENT – Heather Smith**

All coaches should be aware of the standard of the team under their care. Every Division has a winner and a loser and a coach must never lose sight of the improvement they can add to a team by good coaching throughout the season.

Netball is not beneficial to a team when the team is consistently winning by major scores and improvement can only be gained by playing in a stronger competition. Likewise, a team being beaten consistently each week only attaining low scores benefits by playing in a competition more suited to their level. As Coaching & Playing Development Coordinator my congratulations to Registrar Judy Burns, her knowledge of every player and record of their developing skills is unparalleled in the Association.

Premierships can be the reward for a team at the end of the season however the improvement of each player must be uppermost in the Coach's mind and should be the reward each Coach aims for at the end of the competition coupled with selection in a Representative team. NetSetGo received a boost when Netball NSW invited Hawkesbury Association to select a team of 7 NetSetGo players to participate in the half time activities in the Round 4 game NSW Giants v Queensland Firebirds on Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> May at Quay Centre Homebush. A difficult situation the solution was given to Poppets who had 2 teams on equal points and 7 players were selected and with their Coach Charmaine Dimech enjoyed the experience

I commenced the 2018 season with a Coaching Workshop divided into 3 segments.

1. Introduction to Netball-Heather Smith.
2. Improving your Daughters' Skills at Home – Cheryl Hornsby
3. Coaching a Junior Team – Sharon Bell

An excellent response came from club coaches with 7 clubs represented by 14 coaches.

In response to many requests our next Workshop was followed by a session conducted by Sally Cain. Sally is one of the most capped players and coaches currently in Hawkesbury. An A Grade Player Sally has represented at both State and National level and is currently the State Coach of Combined High schools. Using the theme of "How to Coach a Goal Shooter" the response from Coaches was excellent.

Unfortunately, as the season progressed the interest from coaches waned and our next workshop covering "Coaching Defence Play" was poorly attended and it was obvious Coaches were looking for more these

workshops provided. However those coaches who did attend were rewarded with an excellent one -on -one session for their players.

Following discussion at Executive level I believe Hawkesbury has to embrace new systems of coaching to keep up with the digital age. Coaches now have access to not only the best of Australian coaches but also information from around the world via Internet whether it be a computer, iPad or mobile phone. The old system of coaching workshops aimed at club level must be upgraded and we must tap into outside sources to encourage our Coaches to seek new ideas this end HB ex are coming up with new ideas.
