We have 60 less registrations since 2018 and appears to be mainly in Net Set Go group.

Congratulations to all club executive for continuing to provide opportunities for people to play netball at Hawkesbury, particular congratulations to Huxley and Londonderry Clubs who were close to closing down and have come back with more teams this year.

A huge thank you to Jason who managed to change draws after quite a bit of regrading. It is important that we remain flexible with grading to try to give junior players the most equitable competition. By dividing 8 team divisions for semi finals we gave teams at least one extra game.

Suggestions for 2020 season

If possible a 15 week competition this is because most divisions have 6 teams needing 15 weeks without ½ games.

Clubs meet two weeks prior to final rego date to discuss teams / divisions.

Coaches and managers to be named prior to 1st game to check they are registered as we found unregistered coaches and managers this year which meant they were not insured if something happened at training or games.

Looking at A and A2 this year I think all A's together and split after one round into 6 or 4 possibly this should be played half of the games at 1 and the other half at 2:30 on a rotational basis to make it easier to provide umpires.
