Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

Opinion

We have audited the financial report of HAWKESBURY CITY NETBALL ASSOCIATION (the association), which comprises the Statement by Members of the Committee, the Income and Expenditure Statement, Balance Sheet as at 31 August 2025, a summary of significant accounting policies and the certification by members of the committee on the annual statements giving a true and fair view of the financial position and performance of the association.

The financial report has been prepared to assist the association to meet the requirements of Associations Incorporation Act 1991. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Responsibilities of the Committee for the Financial Report

The committee is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1991 and for such internal control as the committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial report, the committee is responsible for assessing the association's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the committee either intends to liquidate the association or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Limitations of Instagram include a 10 photo limit on a post and links posted in comments are not functional. Readers can copy and paste them into a browser but cannot click directly from the app or website. Our increase in interactions on Instagram will be due to the increased number of posts compared to 2024, however our primary method of social media will continue to be Facebook as this is the most accessible and sharable by the clubs, especially in cases where information needs to be quickly disseminated.

This year the notices function on PlayHQ was also utilised when we needed to quickly alert members in cases of parking or weather updates. With this function, we are able to push out an instant notification to every user who registered a player at HCNA and has the NetballHQ app downloaded.

A big thank you to everyone who sent content to share, especially to Tammy Graham of Londonderry who took the most beautiful photos at opening day and grand finals and sent them to me. Any photos of teams that have people with no permission to publish have been emailed to the club.
