
How to Measure Your Kitchen



Roughly draw your layout.

Put as much detail as you can including doors, windows, boilers, plumbing and gas outlets and anything else you can think of that will affect your kitchen design.





Measure Windows, Doors and Arches.

Measure from the outside of architraves and window sills. For the floor plan, show the widths.

You may find it easier to draw a wall plan for each elevation. Pick a point and work round the room clockwise.


Mark All Fixed Points.


Take note of any fixed point in the room and measure the height, width and distance to nearest point and from the floor.

- Boilers.
- Radiators.
- Water outlets. Soil pipes.
- Gas pipes.
- Boxing in.

Meters.

You can mark light switches with an X. For double sockets use XX You might find it useful to draw each wall facing it.





Remember to included slopes in your plan and mark lights if they will affect your design.

Things to remember.

- Your plan doesn't need to be perfect for an estimate.
- Take photos from lots of angles and of anything you want to ask about.
- Nothing has to stay the same. Almost anything can be moved.
