



*My time at IDT was one of the most important turning points in my life. When I first arrived, I was struggling with direction, discipline, and confidence. I knew I needed structure and accountability, but I didn't yet believe how much my life could truly change. The house gave me more than just a safe place to stay — it gave me a foundation to rebuild myself step by step.*

*The daily expectations, routines, and support from staff and other residents helped me develop consistency and responsibility. Living around others who were also committed to recovery showed me that progress was possible and that setbacks didn't have to define my future. I learned how to manage my time, show up for commitments, and take ownership of my actions.*

*With that stability, I was able to focus on my goals. I enrolled in school and completed my associate's degree in industrial maintenance, something I once thought was out of reach. The encouragement and accountability I received pushed me to keep going even when it felt overwhelming. I also secured steady employment and worked my way up to become a Maintenance Supervisor. That achievement means a lot to me because it represents trust, leadership, and reliability — qualities I built during my time in sober living.*

*Today I have purpose, steady work, and pride in what I do. IDT didn't just help me stay sober — it helped me build a life worth protecting. I'm grateful for the structure, support, and second chance I was given.*

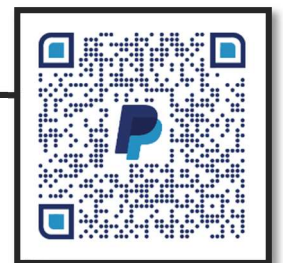
