## Associate Artist - Simon Peter Green

Lambeth born and former firefighter, Simon Peter Green is a photographer interested in representation, portraiture, social documentary and visual sociology.

He aims to portray people in a progressive and dignified way.
He was awarded an MFA Photography (Distinction) at The University for the Creative Arts in 2022 and a BA (Hons) Photography (1st) at Coventry University in 2020.

In a creative partnership with Xuesheng Ma, he established the multi-media photography show Un asked.

He was the founder and production director of the London Street Photography Festival, championing young people, women and under-represented minorities. LSPF was the first street photography festival in the world to realise a majority of women in their management team, guest speakers and competition judges.

His array of accolades includes producer of the legendary pre-digital multi-media collective Raya, who held down a three-year residency at the Institute of Contemporary Arts in London and produced international multi-media events for the British Council.

Simon has directed large productions for diverse organisations, companies and festivals. Including Glastonbury, Love Music Hate Racism, the East End Film Festival and the United Nations (ITU) in Geneva.

He has designed and delivered creative industry courses to disadvantaged youth for the Prince's Trust, Hackney London Borough Council, Tower Hamlets, The National Portrait Gallery, Urban Development and many others. He has been a lead tutor for BBC Blast and a lecturer at Salisbury Art College.

Simon was a tour and production manager in the music industry, his clients included Wu-Tang Clan, Pusha T, Duke Dumont, Maya Jane Coles, TY, Lethal Bizzle, MOBO, Jammer BBK, LOTM, Desiigner, 360 Management, G.O.O.D Music and Rocnation.
