TENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Today's music traces a path from 'holy fire to faithful focus'. We begin with Vangelis's iconic Chariots of Fire, a sound-world of steady stride and radiant lift that sets Hebrews' call to "run with perseverance" in our ears. We ask the 'Spirit's purifying presence' to descend and send us, then sing trust in God's sometimes 'mysterious' providence. Bach's C-minor Prelude and Fugue gives disciplined momentum to our offering. At Communion, Come Down, O Love Divine prays for flame that refines desire, and we go forth beholding the enthroned Lord—eyes fixed on Jesus—ready to bear the 'costly, cleansing' fire Christ brings.

PRELUDE

Chariots of Fire (from Chariots of Fire) by VANGELIS Arranged by: Francesco Parrino Anna Keiserman, Solo Piano

Greek composer Vangelis wrote the 1981, Academy Award—winning score whose buoyant, pulsing theme has come to symbolize endurance and purpose—an apt prelude to Hebrews 12's "race set before us." This piano arrangement by Francesco Parrino distills the synth-led theme into a singable, luminous keyboard lyric, keeping the sense of forward stride. Use it to frame the day's movement from call to perseverance.


THE GATHERING

WELCOME OPENING SONG

O Spirit of the Living God

Tweedy's Pentecost text (first published 1935) prays for 'fire, wind, and speech'—language that dovetails with Jeremiah's "word like fire" and readies us to witness with clarity amid division (Luke 12). The folk tune 'FOREST GREEN'—an English melody collected/arranged by Ralph Vaughan Williams for The English Hymnal (1906)—gives the petition a warm, communal lift. Sing it as our congregational "Come, Holy Spirit."

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CHILDREN'S SERMON

A READING FROM

JEREMIAH 23:23-29

Because Jeremiah preaches the unpopular message of God's judgment, he suffers rejection. Today's reading distinguishes between the true prophet, like Jeremiah, who speaks God's word, and the false prophet who misleads the people through dreams. One is like wheat; the other like worthless straw.

Am I a God near by, says the Lord, and not a God far off? Who can hide in secret places so that I cannot see them? says the Lord. Do I not fill heaven and earth? says the Lord. I have heard what the prophets have said who prophesy lies in my name, saying, "I have dreamed! I have dreamed!" How long? Will the hearts of the prophets ever turn back—those who

prophesy lies and who prophesy the deceit of their own heart? They plan to make my people forget my name by their dreams that they tell one another, just as their ancestors forgot my name for Baal. Let the prophet who has a dream tell the dream, but let the one who has my word speak my word faithfully. What has straw in common with wheat? says the Lord. Is not my word like fire, says the Lord, and like a hammer that breaks a rock in pieces?

A READING FROM

HEBREWS 11:29 - 12:2

The author of Hebrews presents us with rich stories of faith. In a long list of biblical heroes, we find examples of trust in God that enabled them to face the trials of life faithfully. In addition to this "cloud of witnesses," we have Jesus, the perfect model of faithful endurance.

By faith the people passed through the Red Sea as if it were dry land, but when the Egyptians attempted to do so they were drowned. By faith the walls of Jericho fell after they had been encircled for seven days. By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had received the spies in peace.

And what more should I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets, who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, quenched the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, were made strong out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Others were tortured, refusing to accept release, in order to obtain a better resurrection. Others suffered mocking and flogging and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned to death; they were sawn in two; they were killed by the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, persecuted, tormented of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains and in caves and holes in the ground.

Yet all these, though they were commended for their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had provided something better so that they would not, apart from us, be made perfect.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.



THE GOSPEL READING

LUKE 12:49-56

(CONGREGATION STANDING)

L: The Holy Gospel of St. Luke, beginning in the twelfth chapter.

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

[Jesus said:] "I have come to cast fire upon the earth, and how I wish it were already ablaze! I have a baptism with which to be baptized, and what constraint I am under until it is completed! Do you think that I have come to bring peace to the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division! From now on five in one household will be divided, three against two and two against three; they will be divided: father against son and son against father, mother against daughter and daughter against mother, mother-in-law against her daughter-in-law and daughter-in-law against mother-in-law."

He also said to the crowds, "When you see a cloud rising in the west, you immediately say, 'It is going to rain,' and so it happens. And when you see the south wind blowing, you say, 'There will be scorching heat,' and it happens. You hypocrites! You know how to interpret the appearance of earth and sky, but why do you not know how to interpret the present time?"

HYMN OF THE DAY

O God, in a Mysterious Way

Poet William Cowper's classic text (1773) counsels trust when God's ways confound us—fitting after a Gospel that burns through false peace and calls for discernment. The sturdy psalm tune 'DUNDEE' originated in the 1615 Scottish Psalter and was later harmonized in Thomas Ravenscroft's 1621 Whole Booke of Psalmes, giving the hymn an ancient, steadying frame for courageous faith.


THE OFFERING

MUSICAL OFFERING

Praeludium und Fuge c-Moll BWV 847

from 'Das wohltemperierte Klavier I' by Johann Sebastian Bach Anna Keiserman, Solo Piano

Bach's compact C-minor pair—No. 2 of Book I—moves with focused, clear-eyed energy: the **prelude** a steady motor, the **fugue** a purposeful pursuit of its subject. It sonically mirrors Hebrews' exhortation to **'run with perseverance'** and to order our steps under the Word that tests and refines.

LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

HOLY COMMUNION

We practice "Open Communion," acknowledging that Jesus welcomes all persons, sinners and saints alike, to the table. All means ALL. Please come forward by the center aisle and receive the Sacrament in a continuous line, exiting by the side aisles. Communion is by intinction. We offer a chalice of wine and a chalice of white grape juice in which you may dip the bread. Gluten-free wafers are available; please ask for them at the altar, if needed. The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you. The communicant may say: Amen.

Infants who are not yet ready to receive food will receive a blessing. Parents who have questions about the practice of open communion may instruct their children to receive just a blessing.

Communion can be served to those who are not physically able to join us for worship. Please speak with an usher if you know of someone who would desire communion from Sunday's table brought to them.

This beloved prayer (a 14th-century Italian lauda translated in 1867) asks the Spirit to "freely burn ... till earthly passions turn to dust and ashes"—a direct, gentle image of purifying fire for the Table. Vaughan Williams composed the soaring tune DOWN AMPNEY for The English Hymnal (1906), naming it after his birthplace; its lyric rise invites a quiet gaze toward Christ (Heb 12:2) and welcomes Jeremiah's refining flame.

SENDING HYMN I See the Lord

A contemporary worship setting rooted in Isaiah 6, this song trains us to behold the enthroned Lord—"exalted and lifted high"—so we can go out with undivided allegiance (Luke 12) and eyes fixed on Jesus (Heb 12:2). Written by Smith, Sooter, Maher, and Hoagland and popularized by Vertical Worship, it's a strong sending acclamation of holiness before mission.
