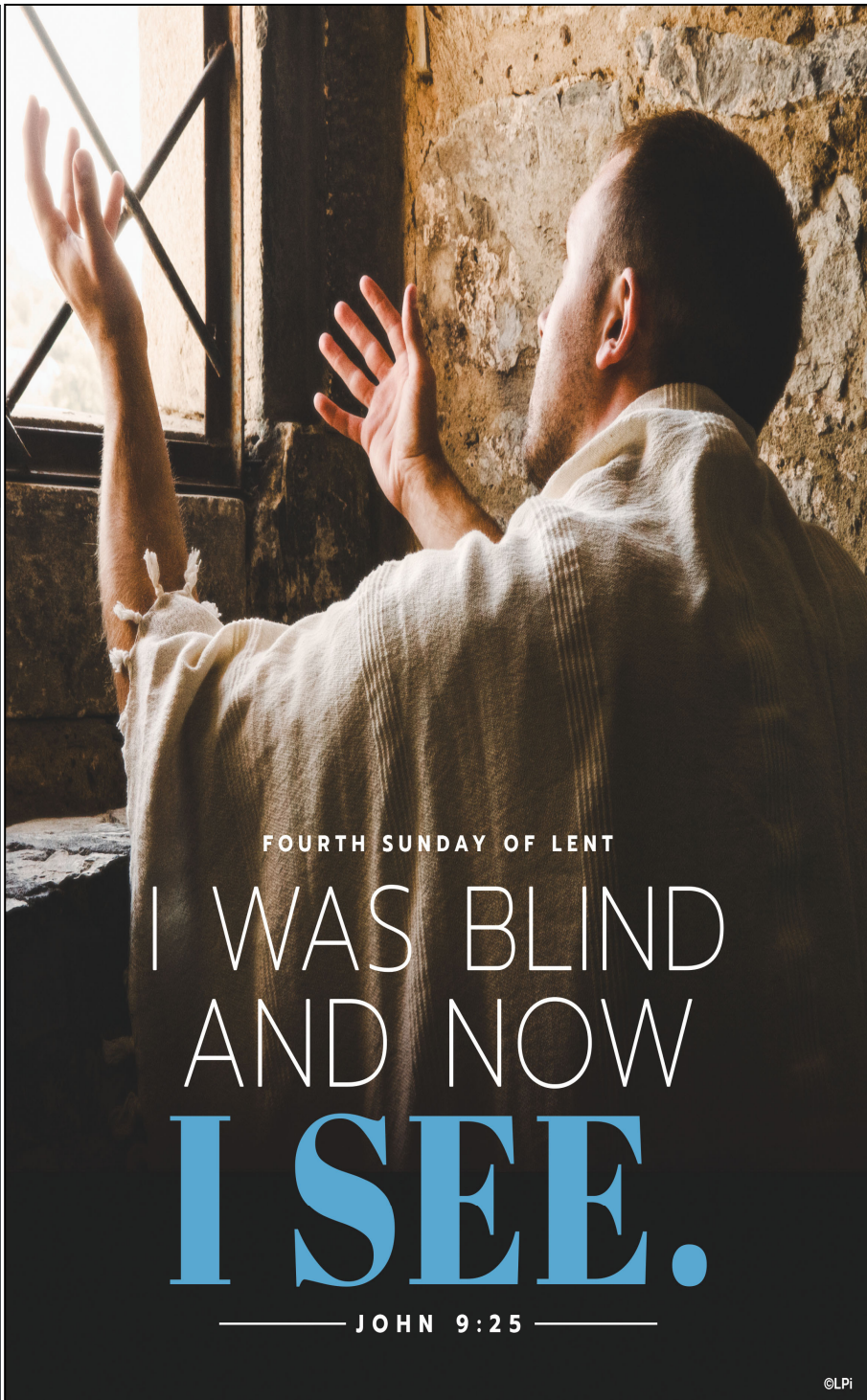

THOUGHTS FROM FR. EMMANUEL

Friends, in the Miracle performed by Jesus healing the blind person, we see Jesus revealing his power and the authority he owns. People started gathering with anticipation, aware of the growing rumors that he might be the Messiah. Yet because he was "one of them," they struggled to see beyond the familiar. They measured him by what they thought they already knew. How often do we do the same?

We live in a culture that subtly trains us to evaluate others by productivity, appearance, independence, or social ease. Those living with disabilities or mental illness often bear this burden most heavily. They may be reduced to diagnoses, limitations, or stereotypes rather than embraced as whole persons—beloved, gifted, and created in the image of God.

But Jesus never stops at the surface. Throughout the Gospels, he consistently sees the person before him—not a category, not a condition, not a reputation. He looks upon the heart. He restores dignity. He calls people by name. And in doing so, he reveals the heart of God.

Jesus is the only one who can restore our sight to see everyone as our brothers and sisters to build with them the kingdom of heaven! May this time of Lent be of renewal of the love and grace of God in our hearts so we can be one family together!

Remember this Wednesday March 18, we have confessions service beginning with prayer at 5:30 pm and confessions 6-8pm!

CONSECRATION TO THE SACRED HEART

The most popular of all the saints named Margaret, with the exception of that of the Scots and their own Queen St. Margaret, is St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, the “Beloved Disciple of the Sacred Heart.” She was born in Lhautecour, France, on July 22, 1647. Margaret, from her earliest years, lived a penitential life exhibiting an extraordinary devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. Our Lord rewarded her love for suffering by appearing to her more than once covered with wounds as the Ecce Homo. In 1671, Margaret was received into the Visitation order at Paray-le-Monial. Jesus opened His Heart and expressed His sadness over the lukewarmness of the vast majority of the practicing faithful and especially those who had vowed themselves by religion to have no other love but His.

FEED YOUR FAITH

Join **Feed Your Faith** tomorrow night, March 16th for a corned beef and cabbage dinner in the MEC at 5:30 in honor of St. Patrick and St. Joseph. Wearing green is optional :). After a scrumptious meal we honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus in prayer, then continue our **Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary** series with The Crowning of Thorns and The Carrying of the Cross. Humiliating Jesus by pounding a cap made of thorns into His precious head was simply to mock His Kingship. It was a line in the sand between the Kingdom of God and the kingdom of the world. Jesus does not fight against them – He fights *for* them as He also carried the shame of cross, made heavier by our sins - to His death. He calls us also to unite our crosses to His and carry them with the same sacrificial love to save souls.
