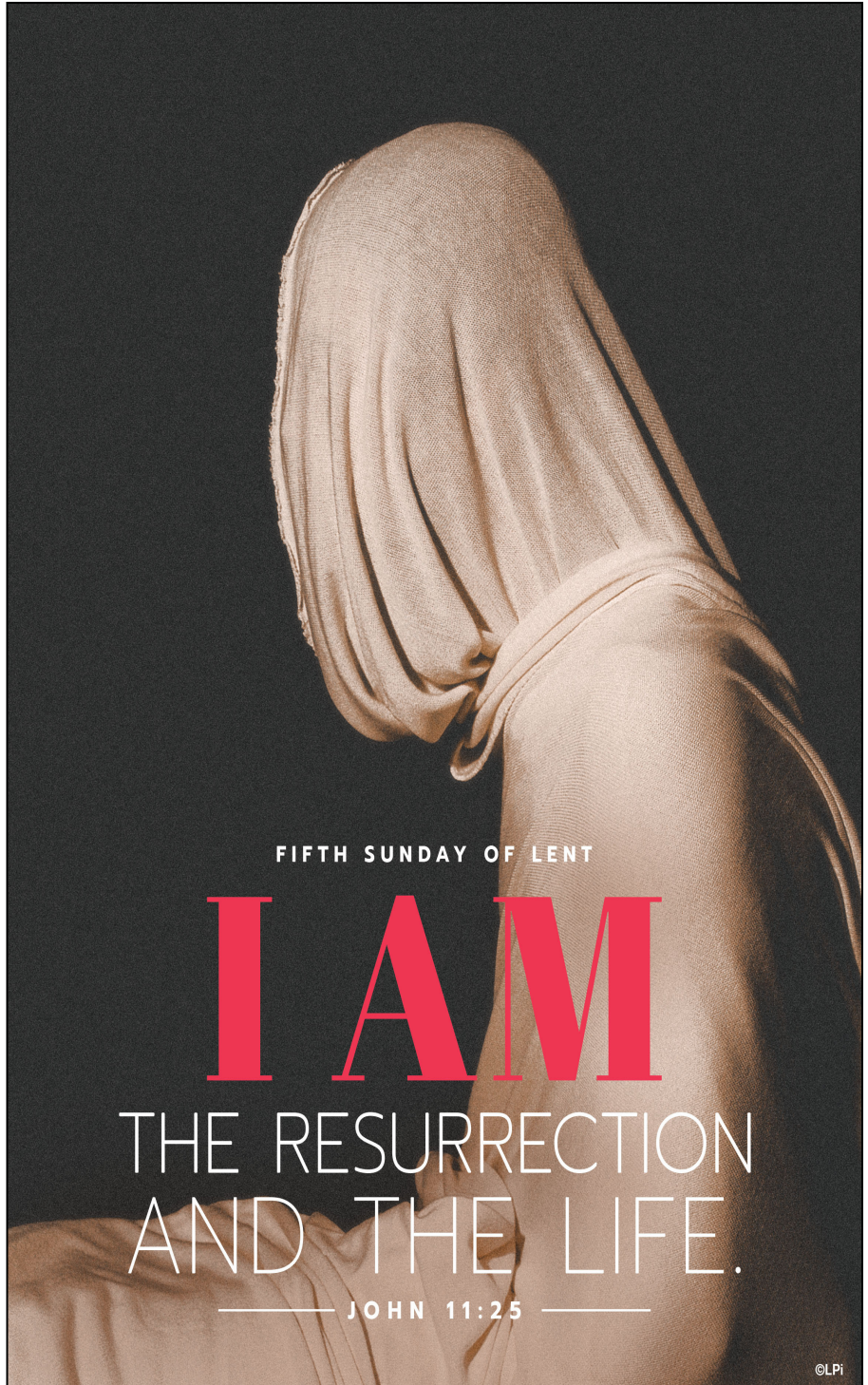

THOUGHTS FROM FR. EMMANUEL

Friends,

In today's Gospel, the raising of Lazarus, the "sixth of seven Signs" that Jesus will work to demonstrate that he is the promised Messiah, is a symbolic narrative of his Final Victory over death and sin at the cost of his human life, and a sign anticipating his Resurrection.

Describing this great miracle, the Church assures us that we, too, will be raised into eternal life after our battle with sin and death in this world. Thus, Resurrection Hope is the central theme of the Scripture readings for this Fifth Sunday of Lent.

Jesus' message is clear: "Lazarus, come out!" and is addressed to us as an invitation to share in his glory and enjoy of a new life in his love.

Finally, consider attending the Chrism Mass with the Bishop at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception downtown Kansas City this Thursday March 26th at 7pm. For parking and more information please check the Cathedral's website.
