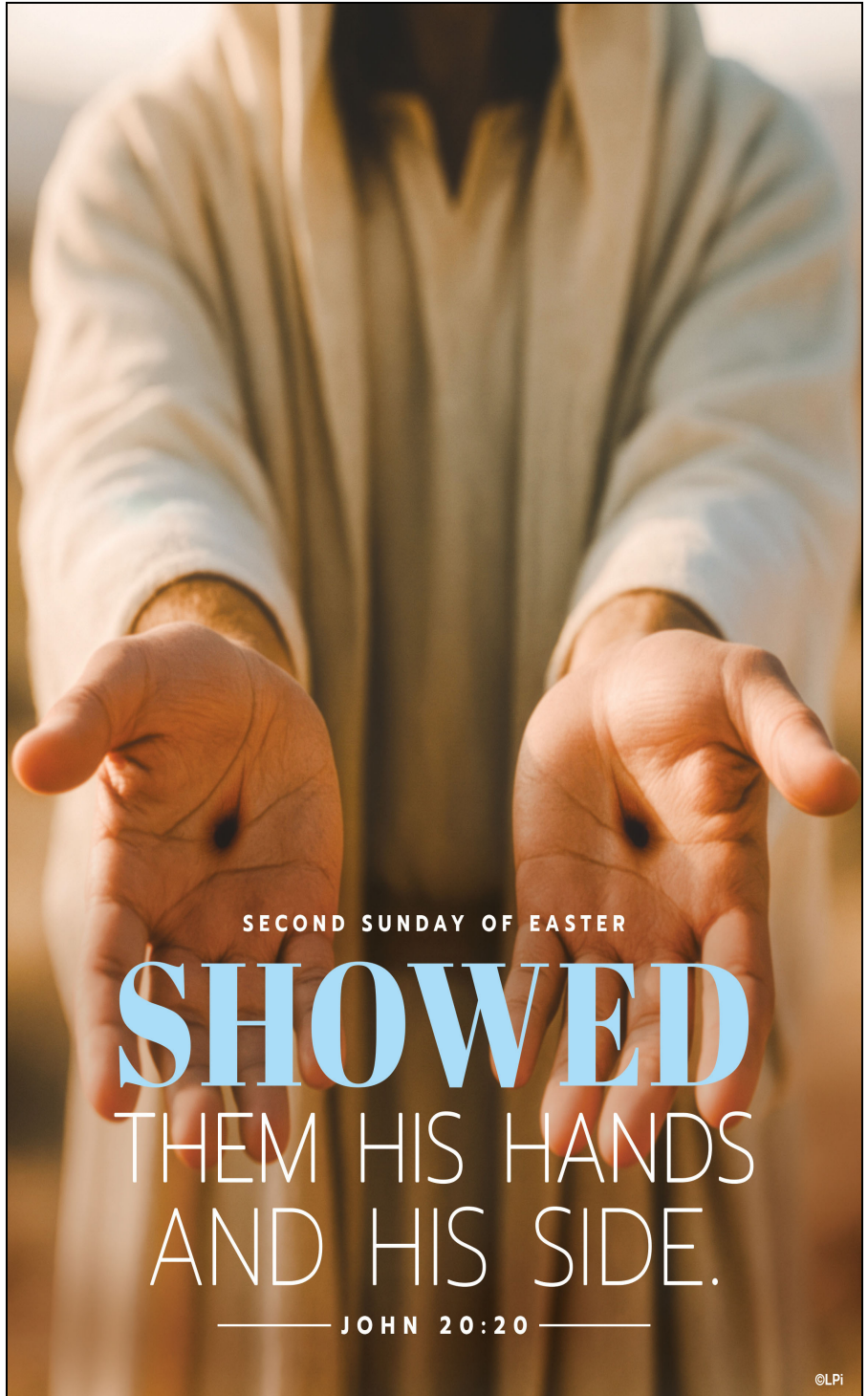

**THOUGHTS FROM FR. EMMANUEL**

Friends,

Divine Mercy Sunday is a feast based upon the private revelations of Jesus to St. Faustina. In extending this Feast to the entire Church, Pope John Paul II re-emphasized the resurrection context of Easter, citing St. Faustina’s diary: “Humanity will never find peace until it turns with trust to Divine Mercy.” In describing this feast, Blessed John Paul II says: “Divine Mercy! This is the Easter gift that the Church receives from the risen Christ, a gift which is offers to all humanity.”

The first epistle of St. John declares to the entire world that “God is love;” and in his encyclical letter Rich in Mercy, Blessed John Paul II wrote, “Mercy is love’s second name.” If we understand mercy in the Biblical sense, then without any fear of error contrary to the faith, it can be said, as John Paul II said, that mercy is the greatest attribute of God. This Biblically formulated relationship between love and mercy is expressed by St. Faustina when she says: “Love is the flower, mercy the fruit.”

Divine Mercy is the form that God’s eternal love takes when He reaches out to us in the midst of our misery and our brokenness. Whatever the nature of our need might be — sin, guilt, suffering, or death — He is always ready to pour out His merciful, compassionate love for us, to help us. Where there was only despair, loneliness, and heartache before, comes joy, fruitfulness, and abiding love. Let’s celebrate the Mercy of God and share it with our brothers and sisters!

## PENSAMIENTOS DEL P. EMMANUEL

Amigos,  
El Domingo de la Divina Misericordia es una fiesta basada en las revelaciones privadas de Jesús a Santa Faustina. Al extender esta Fiesta a toda la Iglesia, el Papa Juan Pablo II volvió a enfatizar el contexto de la resurrección de la Pascua, citando el diario de Santa Faustina: "La humanidad nunca encontrará la paz hasta que se vuelva con confianza hacia la Divina Misericordia." Al describir esta fiesta, el beato Juan Pablo II dice: "¡Divina misericordia! Este es el regalo de Pascua que la Iglesia recibe de Cristo resucitado, un don que ofrece a toda la humanidad."

La primera epístola de San Juan declara al mundo entero que "Dios es amor"; y en su encíclica Rica en Misericordia, el Beato Juan Pablo II escribió: "La misericordia es el segundo nombre del amor." Si entendemos la misericordia en el sentido bíblico, entonces, sin temor al error contrario a la fe, se puede decir, como dijo Juan Pablo II, que la misericordia es el mayor atributo de Dios. Esta relación bíblicamente formulada entre amor y misericordia es expresada por Santa Faustina cuando dice: "El amor es la flor, la misericordia el fruto."

La Divina Misericordia es la forma que adopta el amor eterno de Dios cuando Él se acerca a nosotros en medio de nuestra miseria y nuestra fractura. Sea cual sea la naturaleza de nuestra necesidad — pecado, culpa, sufrimiento o muerte — Él siempre está dispuesto a derramar Su amor misericordioso y compasivo por nosotros, para ayudarnos. Donde antes solo había desesperación, soledad y desamor, llegan la alegría, la fructificación y el amor duradero. ¡Celebremos la Misericordia de Dios y compartámosla con nuestros hermanos y hermanas!


