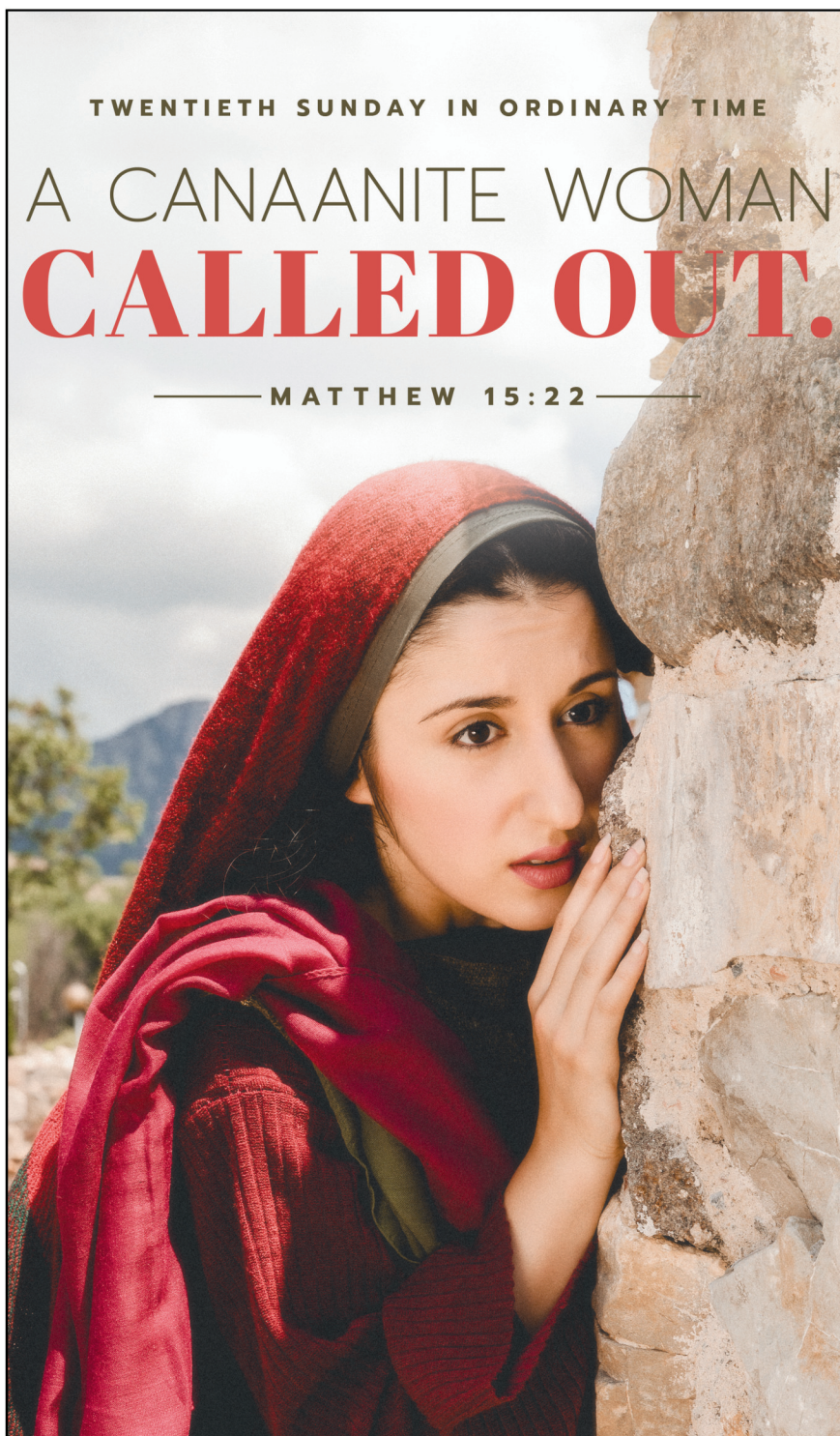

THOUGHTS FROM FR. EMMANUEL

Friends, in today's Gospel we can find three movements proper for our spiritual practice of faith! The first involves Canaanite woman's journey of faith. Leaving her own religion behind she turns to a Jewish rabbi, Jesus, and places her faith in Him. She looks to Him for a miraculous cure for her daughter. For her trouble, she received silence from Jesus, and the disciples, annoyed by the fact that she was bothering Him with her loud crying, seek to get rid of her. They want Jesus to send her away. So Jesus says to her, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." This can be related to the experience of asking God for a sign or something and silence is the only answer...

Then comes the second movement. The woman presses in on Jesus, and falling on her knees in front of Him she cries out, "Lord, help me." For her second effort Jesus tells her, "It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs." How utterly humiliating. In effect, her humility was turned into what appeared to be a terrible humiliation. People in the Middle East are very sensitive about such things. We are very aware of that in our dealings with them in our time. We also experience some kind of frustration when it comes to believing we deserve something and in return we receive nothing. However, God is always at work!

Then, it comes the final movement. In abject humility with her face in the dirt, stripped of her dignity, having abandoned her own religious background, she has nothing left, not even her pride. "Please, Lord," she softly insists, "even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters." What the Canaanite woman is saying is that she doesn't deserve anything. "But," she asks, "how about giving me scraps that accidentally fall from your abundance?" With that, the heart of Jesus is vanquished. The amazing act of our faith can always make the heart of Jesus granting all we ask for overflowing in every spiritual gift we need for the salvation of our souls!

As the woman in the Gospel lets us get close to Jesus and receive from him his divine love and miracles!

*As we begin our new academic year. I am excited to announce that beginning this week we are adding one more Mass with the school body, so our schedule will be as follows: Morning Mass with the school: Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays; to make the Eucharist an integral part of our daily schedule for the scholars and our faculty!

We also continue with the monthly Eucharistic procession and confessions; and all Fridays Eucharistic adoration from 9:15am until 2pm for personal prayer for each class!

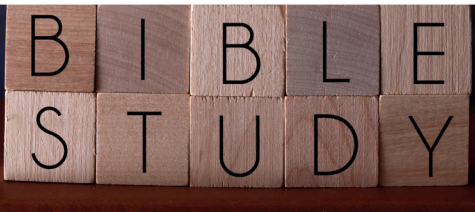


SCHOOL OF RELIGION SIGN-UP

PREPARING FOR A NEW SCHOOL YEAR: INVESTING IN OUR SCHOLARS

While our halls have been quieter this summer, the faculty and staff of St. Regis Academy have been busy preparing for the return of our scholars and another year of forming young people in faith, knowledge, and virtue.

As we celebrate our **60th anniversary**, we are especially mindful of our responsibility to continue building on the strong foundation of Catholic education that has been part of St. Regis for six decades.

This summer has been filled with opportunities for our faculty and staff to grow professionally and personally, enabling them to better serve our scholars.

On **May 26-27**, our faculty participated in a two-day workshop with the **Institute for Catholic Liberal Education (ICLE)** focused on *Bringing the Liberal Arts to Life in the Classroom*. This training challenged our educators to consider how the liberal arts tradition can come alive in daily instruction and how we can cultivate wonder, curiosity, and a love of learning in our scholars.

From **July 27-30**, St. Regis Academy was honored to host **Literacy Essentials training**. Our educators spent four days deepening their understanding of literacy instruction, including phonemes, orthography, spelling, reading, and lesson planning. We were also grateful to welcome educators from other schools who joined us for this important professional development.

The month of August has continued with training focused on the safety and well-being of our scholars. On **August 3**, our faculty and staff completed **American Heart Association Heartsaver CPR, AED, and First Aid training**, including instruction for adults, children, and infants.

August 10, our staff participated in **BIST training**, gaining additional tools and strategies to help create a safe, supportive, and positive learning environment for every scholar.

On **August 11**, our professional development continued with **Youth Mental Health First Aid**, providing our staff with skills to recognize and respond to the mental health needs of young people.

On **August 12**, the **Jackson County Health Department** led our staff in training on **substance abuse awareness and Narcan**. This important training will equip our team with knowledge and resources to help protect and respond to the needs of our school community.

Each of these opportunities represents an investment in our scholars. We know that preparing children for life requires more than academics alone. It means forming the whole person—mind, body, and soul—and ensuring that our faculty and staff have the knowledge, skills, and resources to walk alongside our scholars and their families.

We are grateful for the dedication of our teachers and staff, who have given so much of their summer to prepare for the year ahead. After months of planning, learning, and preparation, we are excited to open our doors and welcome our scholars back on **August 19**, the start of a new Academy year.

As we begin our **60th year of forming scholars rooted in faith**, we ask for the prayers and support of our parish community. May God bless our scholars, families, faculty, and staff and guide us throughout another wonderful year at St. Regis Academy!

REFLEXIONES DEL PADRE EMMANUEL

Amigos, en el Evangelio de hoy podemos encontrar tres movimientos propios para nuestra práctica espiritual de la fe. La primera trata sobre el viaje de fe de la mujer cananea. Dejando atrás su propia religión, se dirige a un rabino judío, Jesús, y deposita su fe en Él. Ella busca en Él una cura milagrosa para su hija. Por su molestia, recibió silencio de Jesús, y los discípulos, molestos por el hecho de que le molestara con su fuerte llanto, intentan deshacerse de ella. Quieren que Jesús la mande lejos. Entonces Jesús le dice: "Fui enviado solo a la oveja perdida de la casa de Israel." Esto puede estar relacionado con la experiencia de pedirle a Dios una señal o algo así, y el silencio es la única respuesta...

Luego viene el segundo movimiento. La mujer se acerca a Jesús y, cayendo de rodillas frente a Él, grita: "Señor, ayúdame." Para su segundo intento, Jesús le dice: "No es correcto tomar la comida de los niños y tirársela a los perros." Qué humillación tan absoluta. En la práctica, su humildad se convirtió en lo que parecía una humillación terrible. La gente en Oriente Medio es muy sensible con estas cosas. Somos muy conscientes de ello en nuestro trato con ellos en nuestro tiempo. También experimentamos cierta frustración cuando se trata de creer que merecemos algo y, a cambio, no recibimos nada. Sin embargo, ¡Dios siempre está en acción!

Entonces, llega el movimiento final. Con humildad absoluta, con el rostro en la tierra, despojada de su dignidad, habiendo abandonado su propio origen religioso, no le queda nada, ni siquiera su orgullo. "Por favor, señor", insiste suavemente, "incluso los perros comen las sobras que caen de la mesa de sus amos." Lo que dice la mujer cananea es que no merece nada. "Pero", pregunta, "¿qué tal si me das migajas que accidentalmente caen de tu abundancia?" Con eso, el corazón de Jesús queda vencido. El asombroso acto de nuestra fe siempre puede hacer que el corazón de Jesús, concediendo todo lo que pedimos, rebosi de cada don espiritual que necesitamos para la salvación de nuestras almas.

Así como la mujer del Evangelio nos permite acercarnos a Jesús y recibir de Él su amor divino y sus milagros.

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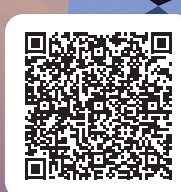
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
