*Weekly Memory Verse: "So God heard their groaning; and God remembered His covenant with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob"*

*Ex 2:24*

Moses (Moshe) is chosen by God out of obscurity (the tribe of Levi) to lead His people. How do we see God repeatedly using unexpected people and places to display His glory?

How does Moses compare the Ark of Noah and the basket of Moses? Why are they compared? How do you see in each a picture of Jesus salvation?

Moses is forced to choose between the two worlds in which he lived. (Heb 11:24-25) How difficult do you think that choice was for him? How difficult is it for you?

Moses in his early life shows a passion for Mishpat and Tse'dakah. How does he apply both without spiritual formation? Is it possible for us to apply the right things with the wrong heart before we are properly formed by God?

Why do you think God chooses the desert (a symbol of tohu) to form Moses spiritually. How does this compare to Luke 4:1-12?

Verse 24 says God heard their cry (Ze'akah) yet it took another 40 years (one generation) before relief would come and two generations before the promised land would be reached. What does this say about our own trials and tribulations?
