My Response:

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*Weekly Memory Verse: "God said to Moses, I AM WHO I AM"; and He said, "thus you shall say to the sons of Israel, I AM has sent me to you." Ex 3:14*

For two generations (80 years) the people of Israel waited for the baby in the ark to be formed into a deliverer. Is it tempting when you sit in the darkness without answers to believe that God is not working? How might we see beyond the veil to know that God is working in our darkness?

Can you give expression to your "Divine encounter" with God. How did you meet God and what has your journey looked like?

Read Psalm 8 alongside this passage. Do you deal with inadequacy in your own calling? If so, what can we learn from these passages to help us in our partnership with God?

The text indicates strongly that the Angel of the Lord (v1) is in fact the pre-incarnate Messiah. When you set this incident alongside Paul's writing in Col 1:13-20 how does it help you to better understand the name YHWH (I AM)?

The great question for all of us after we meet God is "what then shall I do?" What is God calling you to do as His partner in Shalom and how are you accomplishing that calling?
