## Whispers in the Darkness The Reluctant Prophet Pt 1 Jonah 1-2

Weekly Memory Verse: "And the Lord appointed a great fish to swallow Jonah, and Jonah was in the stomach of the fish three days and three nights." Jonah 1:17
