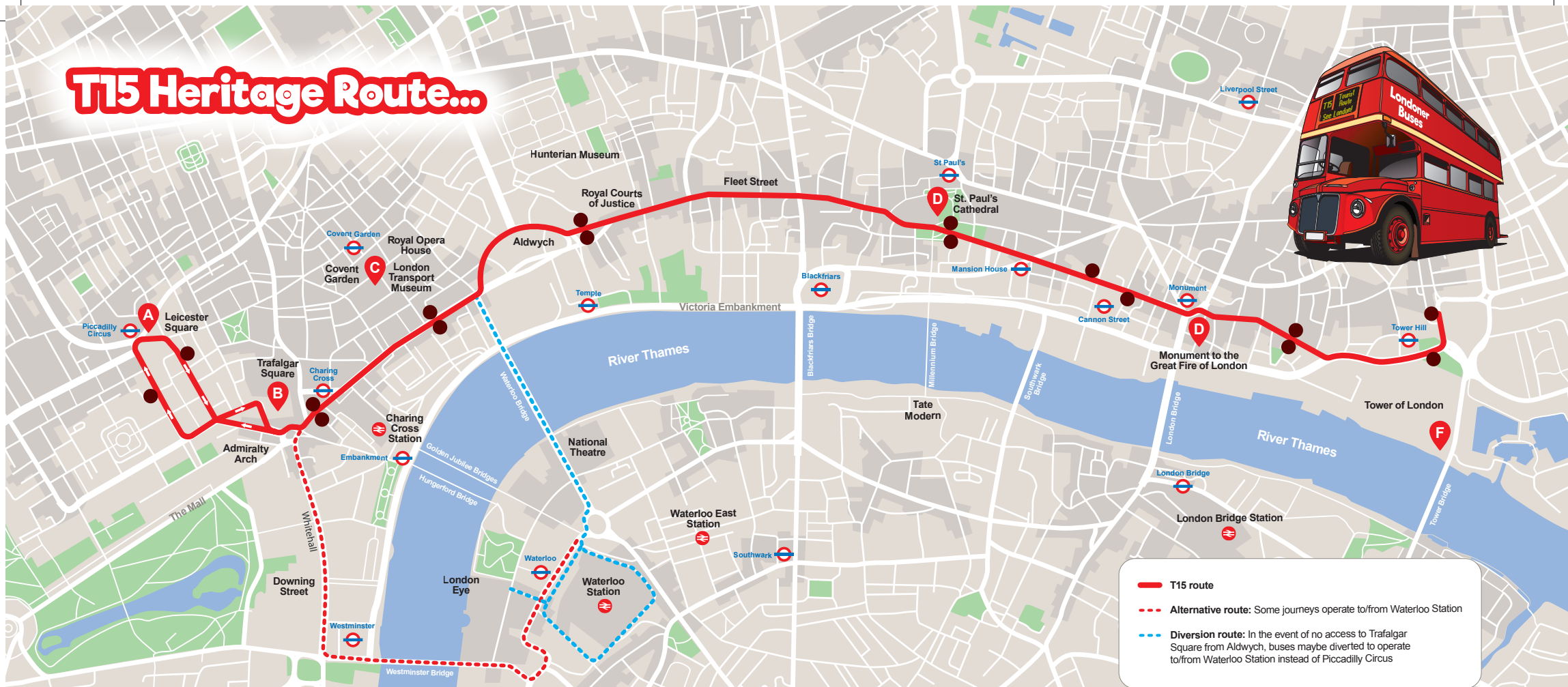

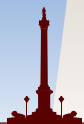

Piccadilly Circus

An iconic road junction and public space in the West End. Home to iconic bright lights, it's been lit up with advertising since 1908 with the Coca Cola sign being a feature since 1955. It's also home to the famous statue of Anteros; the Greek god of requited love.

Trafalgar Square

In the centre of London, 4 bronze lions sit guarding Trafalgar Square. Named after Lord Nelson's Naval victory in the battle of Trafalgar during the Napoleonic wars, a statue of the Admiral sits atop Nelson's column in the middle of the square.

Covent Garden

A vibrant shopping and entertainment hub, Covent Garden centres on the elegant, car-free Piazza, home to fashion stores, craft stalls and the Royal Opera House. Street entertainers perform by 17th-century St. Paul's Church, and the London Transport Museum.

St Paul's Cathedral

St Paul's, with its world-famous dome, is an iconic feature of the London skyline. Visitors are welcome to worship, to sightsee and to attend a dynamic programme of events – from orchestral performances to thought-provoking panel discussions.

Monument to the Great Fire of London

Stands at the junction of Monument Street and Fish Street Hill in the City of London. It was built between 1671 and 1677 to commemorate the Great Fire of London and to celebrate the rebuilding of the City.

Tower of London & Tower Bridge

Explore London's iconic castle and see the Crown Jewels, meet the Yeoman Warders and ravens and see the Tower. Or take in stunning panoramic views at Tower Bridge, London's Defining Landmark.
