GOSPEL REFLECTION

In the Gospel of Gospel of Matthew 9:36–10:8, we stand at a turning point in the ministry of Jesus Christ. Up to this point, Jesus has been moving from town to town preaching, healing, forgiving sins, restoring the broken, and revealing the mercy of God. But now something changes. The mission begins to widen. The compassion of Christ becomes a mission entrusted to others. The heart of the Shepherd becomes the vocation of disciples.

The Gospel begins with a deeply moving sentence: "At the sight of the crowds, his heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd."

This is one of the most revealing lines in all of Scripture because it allows us to see not merely what Jesus does, but what Jesus feels. Before He teaches, before He heals, before He sends the apostles, He first looks upon humanity with compassion.

Christ still looks upon the crowds today. He looks upon families burdened by division. He looks upon young people searching for identity. He looks upon the poor, the forgotten, the addicted, the grieving, the elderly who feel invisible, the sinner who believes forgiveness is impossible, the believer struggling to remain faithful in a cynical age. And His heart is still moved with compassion.

The danger is that we may cease to see people as Jesus sees them. Modern life can harden us. Constant exposure to suffering can make us numb. We begin to classify people instead of loving them. We reduce human beings to political labels, social categories, economic usefulness, or moral failures. But Jesus never looks at people merely as problems. He sees wounded sheep longing for a shepherd.

Then Jesus says something striking to His disciples: "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few."

Even in a sinful and confused world, hearts remain hungry for truth, goodness, and God. Beneath cynicism, beneath rebellion, beneath indifference, there is often a hidden thirst. Many people are waiting sometimes without even realizing it for someone to bring them hope, truth, mercy, and meaning.

And so Jesus commands: "Ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." Mission begins in the heart of God. Vocations are born from prayer. Evangelization without prayer becomes ideology or self-promotion. But prayer unites us to the compassionate heart of Christ.

The Gospel lists ordinary men. These are not powerful elites. They are fishermen, tax collectors, ordinary laborers, flawed men with weaknesses and fears. Yet Jesus entrusts them with divine authority.

This reveals an enduring pattern in salvation history: God works through imperfect people. That should encourage every Christian. Many people think holiness or mission belongs only to extraordinary saints, clergy, scholars, or mystics. But the Gospel repeatedly shows God using fragile instruments so that His power may be revealed more clearly. The apostles are sent not because they are perfect but because they are called.

The same is true today. Every baptized Christian receives a share in the mission of Christ. Not everyone is called to the priesthood or religious life, but every believer is called to witness. Parents evangelize children. Friends evangelize friends. Workers evangelize through integrity. The sick evangelize through faithful endurance. Teachers, nurses, laborers, students, and grandparents all become laborers in the harvest when they live with faith and charity.
