GOSPEL REFLECTION

This Gospel is not just about a miracle, it's about a response. Ten are healed, but only one returns. Ten are cleansed, but only one is made whole. Ten receive a gift, but only one gives thanks. We live in a time when gratitude is easily overlooked. In our fast-paced world, we often expect blessings without acknowledging the Giver. Today, Jesus calls us to deeper reflection, not just on what He can do for us, but how we respond to His grace.

The Gospel begins with Jesus traveling between Samaria and Galilee, a borderland, both geographically and spiritually. Borderlands are places of tension, uncertainty, and encounter. And it is there that ten lepers meet Him.

Leprosy in biblical times was not just a physical illness it was social and spiritual exile. Lepers were outcasts, forced to live apart, cut off from worship, community, and even family. They had to cry out "Unclean!" to warn others to stay away.

But these ten cry out something different: "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" They don't ask for healing directly. They ask for mercy. That cry, "Have mercy!" is one of the most powerful prayers in all of Scripture. It is the cry of the poor, the broken, the sinner, the desperate. And it is always heard by Jesus. Even though they remain at a distance, Jesus sees them. Jesus sees those the world forgets. You may feel invisible in your suffering, but Jesus sees you.

Jesus gives them a curious command: "Go, show yourselves to the priests." In Jewish law, only a priest could certify someone as clean and allow them to re-enter society. But notice: they are not healed immediately. The miracle happens as they go. This is the essence of faith, trusting and obeying before the answer comes. How often do we wait to believe until we see results? But real faith moves forward even in uncertainty. The ten lepers begin walking still wounded, still marked, still outcast. But as they obey, they are cleansed. Healing begins when faith starts walking. Perhaps you're still in that "in-between" stage still waiting for healing, still walking with your pain. Don't stop. Jesus is working as you go.

Then comes the turning point in the Gospel: "One of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice." Only one returns. And he was a Samaritan, a foreigner, despised by Jews, an outsider.

Why is it the outsider who shows gratitude? Perhaps because **he knew more deeply what it meant to be excluded**. He understood what had been restored to him, not just health, but hope.

He comes back not just with polite thanks, but with **praise** and **worship**. He falls at Jesus' feet, a gesture of love, reverence, and surrender.

Gratitude is not just a nice feeling. It is an act of worship. To give thanks is to say: "This healing didn't come from me. I am not the center. God is." Jesus asks a haunting question: "Were not ten made clean? Where are the other nine?" It's not that Jesus needs our thanks, but He desires our hearts.

The other nine got the blessing, but missed the relationship. They were healed in body, but they didn't return to the Healer. They received the gift, but ignored the Giver. This is the tragedy of so many souls: we pray desperately when we need help, but forget God when things go well. We cry out in suffering, but grow silent in comfort.

Ingratitude is spiritual amnesia. It forgets who saved us. It forgets we are not self-made. And it slowly hardens the heart.

Today, He waits for you to return. Not because He needs thanks, but because **He wants relationship**. Let us be that one. Let us return to Jesus not just when we need something, but every day, in gratitude and faith. Because when we return, we don't just find healing, we find **salvation**.
