GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today commemorate All Souls' Day, a day of deep remembrance and profound hope. A day in which we stand before the mystery of death not with despair, but with faith. Not with finality, but with promise. Not in silence, but in prayer.

We celebrate it because we love. We celebrate it because we remember. We celebrate it because, as Christians, we believe in the mercy of God and in the resurrection of the dead. We celebrate it for our beloved dead, for those whose names are etched in our hearts, whose pictures rest on our altars at home, whose voices still echo in our memory.

Death is a mystery that touches every human life. It visits every home, every family, every age. And it brings with it grief, silence, and sometimes doubt. But the Church does not run from death. She enters into it boldly, because Christ entered into it first.

Today, as we remember the dead, we are reminded of our own mortality. "Remember, man, that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." These words, often spoken at the beginning of Lent, echo in our hearts today. They are not meant to instill fear, but to awaken wisdom.

As the Book of Wisdom tells us, "The souls of the just are in the hand of God, and no torment shall touch them." (Wisdom 3:1) Even though they seemed, in the eyes of the foolish, to have died, they are at peace.

So many people today deny the afterlife. They live as if this life is all there is, chasing wealth, pleasure, success, acclaim, as if these things can shelter us from the grave. But Christians see more. We see through death. For us, death is not the end, but the threshold. The door through which we pass into eternity.

Today we pray for those not yet in heaven, who are undergoing final purification in Purgatory. Yes, Purgatory is real. It is not a second chance, but a gift of mercy. It is the final cleansing of the soul from all that is unworthy of God. For Scripture tells us, "Nothing unclean shall enter the presence of God." (Revelation 21:27)

Even if we die in God's grace, our soul may still need healing, from selfishness, pride, attachments, sin. Purgatory is not a place of punishment, but a place of love. The love that burns away what still separates the soul from perfect union with God.

Think of gold refined in fire. It must be purified to shine. So too the soul. Pope Benedict XVI once said: "Purgatory is the inward fire of love which makes the soul ready for the vision of God."

And here is where our prayers matter. The Catechism teaches that the faithful on earth can help the souls in purgatory "by offering prayers in suffrage for them, especially the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass." (CCC 1032)

Every Mass we offer, every Rosary we pray, every indulgence we obtain, these are acts of mercy, spiritual works that assist those still being purified.

All Souls' Day is not about sorrow alone. It is about hope. In the Gospel of John, Jesus says, "This is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day." (John 6:40)

We are a resurrection people. We do not mourn as those who have no hope. (1 Thess. 4:13)

Yes, we grieve. Jesus Himself wept at the tomb of Lazarus. But beyond the tears, we see the empty tomb. We see the risen Christ, who has conquered death and opened the way to eternal life. Because He lives, we shall live also.



Advent Candles & Wreaths




