GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today we come to the final Sunday of the liturgical year, the great Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It is a feast that reminds us of who truly reigns over all creation, not a political power, not a worldly empire, not even death itself, but Jesus Christ, crucified

And yet, the Gospel passage given to us today is not what many would expect on a feast about kingship. We do not hear of Jesus walking on water or rising in glory. We do not see a triumphant entry or a shining throne. Instead, we see a cross.

We hear mockery, jeers, blood, and pain. We see Jesus, beaten and broken, hanging between two criminals, barely able to breathe. And we're told: This is the King. What kind of King is this?

The rulers sneer: "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Christ of God, the Chosen One!" The soldiers mock: "If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself!" One of the criminals even joins in: "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us!" Everyone is asking Jesus to prove his power by coming down from the cross. But Jesus doesn't come down. Not because He is powerless, but because He is full of mercy. Because He is truly King.

We see, the world thinks kingship is about domination, about showing your strength, defeating your enemies, asserting your will. But the kingdom of Christ is not like that. His throne is the cross. His crown is made of thorns. His royal decree is not a command to kill, but a prayer of forgiveness: "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." Christ reigns not by force, but by self-giving love. He does not save Himself so that He can save

As Jesus hangs dying, two men hang beside Him—two criminals, two sinners, both suffering, both close to death. But they respond to Jesus in very different ways.

The first joins in the mockery: "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us!"

His prayer—if we can call it that—is not one of repentance, but of accusation. His idea of a messiah is someone who can get him off the cross—someone useful, powerful, who can fix his situation. But he doesn't see his own need for mercy. He wants relief, not redemption.

But the second criminal—traditionally called the "Good Thief," or St. Dismas—makes a different choice. He rebukes the other: "Do you not fear God?" He admits his guilt: "We are receiving what we deserve." And then

he turns to Jesus with the most humble and beautiful of prayers: "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

That's it. No excuses. No demands. Just trust.

And Jesus replies with one of the most stunning promises in all of Scripture: "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

The King answers with mercy. In that moment, Jesus opens the gates of His kingdom—not to the powerful, not to the proud, but to a dying man who asked to be remem-

This is what our King is like.


