

### OUR MISSION STATEMENT

To honor the Lord as Servants of Christ and Stewards of the mysteries of God by spreading his message of Love, Hope, Faith and Respect. In trusting his message, our diverse community will always remain united and be guided by the Holy Spirit, to encourage and support the development of the Sacramental Life and by being a community open to others that are coming in search of Christ's love and teachings.

### GOSPEL REFLECTION

On this Feast of the Holy Family, the Church invites us to step inside the home of Nazareth not as visitors or historians, but as disciples. The Holy Family Jesus, Mary, and Joseph is not held up as an unreachable ideal, but as a living pattern for our own families: imperfect, struggling, learning, but capable of holiness because God dwells with us.

Today's Gospel shows us the anxious search of Mary and Joseph for Jesus in Jerusalem. It is one of the few glimpses Scripture gives us of Jesus' hidden years. Yet in this very ordinary and very human moment parents searching for a lost child we learn something profound: holiness is often found in moments we would prefer to avoid. The Holy Family faced stress, confusion, financial hardship, social displacement, danger, and misunderstanding. They were refugees fleeing Herod. They lived under foreign occupation. They worked hard simply to survive. Their life did not look like a Christmas card.

And so the Church gives us this feast right after Christmas to remind us: God is not looking for perfect families. He is looking for faithful families. If your family is loud, messy, complicated, wounded, or imperfect congratulations. You are exactly the sort of family God loves to work with.

And then, Mary doesn't understand why Jesus stayed behind in the Temple, yet she "treasured all these things in her heart." She models a love that does not control but instead trusts and ponders.

In our homes today, we often respond too quickly, speak too harshly, or cling too tightly. Mary's example whispers to us: Listen. Reflect. Give space. Trust that God is at work in the ones you love.

Mary reminds us that every family needs a "heart of contemplation" to keep love alive.

Joseph speaks no recorded words in Scripture, yet his life speaks volumes. He listens to God in dreams, protects his family, works with his hands, and lives faithfully even when he does not fully understand.

Today, we live in a noisy world phones buzzing, opinions shouting, schedules overflowing. Joseph is the saint of those who serve quietly: the parent working two jobs, the caregiver for an elderly parent, the spouse who keeps forgiving, the sibling who keeps helping. True love rarely announces itself; it simply shows up again.

The Son of God spent 30 years in a family before preaching a single sermon or performing a single miracle. Why? Because ordinary family life, its tensions, joys, disappointments, and celebrations is where we learn to love like God loves. Forgiveness is learned when siblings fight and reconcile. Patience is learned when a child tests boundaries. Compassion is learned when someone in the family is sick. Sacrifice is learned when parents give their time, sleep, money, and energy again and again.

This is why Pope Francis calls the family "the first place where we learn to love." Your kitchen table, your living room, your family van, your WhatsApp group these may be the holiest places in your life.

Some families today carry deep burdens: broken relationships, mental health struggles, financial pressure, addiction, children drifting from faith, loneliness, grief. The Holy Family does not stand far from these struggles. They *walk with us through them*. Jesus knows what it is to worry his parents. Mary knows what it is to lose and find, to fear and to hope. Joseph knows what it is to carry responsibilities that feel heavy. You are not alone. The Holy Family intercedes for you.
