## Alzheimer Society Peel is the first in Canada to become MUSIC CARE Certified and celebrates Gold

**Mississauga, ON** — On Tuesday, August 22<sup>nd</sup>, Alzheimer Society Peel (ASP) became the first organization in Canada to become **MUSIC CARE Certified**. They have achieved a gold standard.

MUSIC CARE CERTIFY™ is a groundbreaking achievement program developed by the Room 217 Foundation that recognizes care organizations who demonstrate excellence in music care delivery. Music becomes integrated and sustained into daily routines and practices for better care outcomes.

Using Room 217's inclusive and integrated model of music care, music becomes a person-centred solution to organizational challenges. ASP specifically addressed the design of their sound environment within their community services programming. Results showed less wandering and confusion of clients, increased engagement, improved staff wellness, and deeper relationships within the circle of care.
