A WORD FROM OUR AGENCY PRESIDENT

As we end another successful year, and settle into the old Blake's Creamery, I'm reminded that we are continuing the legacy of the Blake family as they began to deliver milk throughout our community over 120 years ago.

In 2024 we delivered over 350,000 containers of milk (along with nutritious meals) to the doors of some very grateful people all throughout Hillsborough County. If Mr. Blake was alive to see this happening today, I think he would be very pleased to know that our community is still reaping the benefits from what he started so long ago.

Still, our success has not come easy. By taking control of our supply of food, we have transformed our organization to better meet the rising need for our services. This move has improved the quality of our meals and sustainability of our mission, but added more complexity to our work.

This was recognized and addressed in our new strategic plan, as we will be investigating how technology can aid us in supply management.

Our program Goal for the 2025-2028 Strategic Plan reads: "Explore and implement digital systems to reduce complexity of operations, and solidify warehouse and food distribution procedures."

HOME DELIVERED

Meals on Wheels of Hillsborough County has proudly been delivering nutritious meals since 1977. With a name many know and trust, our home delivered program offers older and isolated neighbors more than a healthy meal.





Every visit is a wellness check, requiring our trained drivers to see and speak with every individual on their route. Any concerns about an individual during a visit are documented, and staff communicate with emergency contacts and/or refer participants to community resources.



In their words: Home Delivery Participant:

"Thank you for providing me a reliable and dependable meal 5 days a week! It helps me get fresh produce and nutrients I wouldn't be able to provide myself. I am without transportation, I have no way to get to a grocery store."

From our 2024 Home Delivered Survey:

98% Participants rate the program as good to excellent.

92% Participants feel safer knowing that someone is checking on them.
