Religious Life Sunday - January 18, 2026

You may have noticed parishioners in black or brown robes or habits. There are a few "religious" in our congregation, people who have chosen to follow Christ in community. Not all of us wear our habits in church, so you might be surprised to find yourself sitting next to a member of a religious community.

The Episcopal Church (TEC) designates one Sunday in January every year as *Religious Life Sunday*.



What is Religious Life? TEC recognizes two distinct forms under the canons: Religious Orders and Christian

Communities. Religious Orders take the traditional form that most people think of when they think of monks and nuns – vowed monastics living in community, usually in a monastery. In contrast, Christian Communities live in their own homes, either alone or with their families. Either way, "many are called to join together with others for mutual support in their spiritual journeys, for growth in their life in Christ, and for extension of mission". We will celebrate Religious Life Sunday in our church on January 18th at the 10:30 service. Here is a [link](#) to more information.


