From Father Robert

- I continue to be blessed by your generous welcome. As I've now been here at Grace & St. Stephen's for about 2 1/2 months, I am recognizing more and more what the Spirit had in mind in drawing us together and I remain excited and honored to joyfully embrace our future. Truly, I am grateful for this call and thrilled to be here.
- As you hopefully read in the email that went out earlier in November, I'm thrilled to welcome the Rev. Katie Presley to serve with us as a Priest Associate. She'll be helping to lead worship once a month, will preach quarterly, and will occasionally lead some formation classes/discussions.
- I'm excited to announce that John Herman will move into the role of Interim Director of Music on January 1. Having John's experience with our parish, the St. Nicholas Choir, and Taylor Choir will be a huge blessing to us in the music ministry search.
- I'm also very grateful that Susan Paulson has agreed to serve as Interim Organist and am thankful that she will be offering her gifts to help us sing praises to God.
- We will have a reception after the 10:30 Eucharist on December 14 to celebrate Joel, thank him for his ministry here, and send him off with our well wishes. Joel's final Sunday with us is December 21 and his final day is Christmas Eve.
- Speaking of the music search, I've put together a search committee to help me in the process. We'll begin with creating a job description and posting and will then begin the process of interviewing candidates. Given the rhythms of the Church Year, it is not likely that we will have a new Director of Music before Easter, but it is my goal to have someone hired in the season of Eastertide. A similar process and timeline will be true for an Assistant Rector search (though we're waiting on updates from the Annual Giving campaign to make sure the budget will be able to support that).
- In January, the Sunday morning 9:15 formation hour will be three "listening sessions" for me to learn more about the findings in the Holy

Cow Survey that was conducted during the Rector Search process. I've read the report and watched the presentation, but hope to dig a bit further into some of the desires and hopes for this parish as I am planning for the Vestry's retreat in February. The topics will be:

- January 4: Listening Session about Christian Formation & Discipleship
- **January 11:** Listening Session about Parish Life and Fellowship
- **January 18:** Reflection Session on what I've seen, heard, and observed in my first few months at Grace and St. Stephen's
- **January 25 & February 1:** We'll be starting a series for Black History Month and in these first two sessions, we'll be reading through and discussing Martin Luther King's Letter from a Birmingham Jail.
- As we head into a season that is full of parties, stress, and traditions, I ask that you please pray for our staff, clergy, and ministry leaders. I'm quite excited about celebrating my first Advent and Christmas with you all at Grace and St. Stephen's. Together, I look forward to experiencing the joys of the season in story, song, and Sacrament.

Catechumenate Program for Adult Baptism

If you or someone you know is interested in Baptism as an adult, Father Robert will be beginning a Catechumenate program in January that will conclude with Baptism at the Easter Vigil on April 4. The Catechumenate is a process that has been used since the earliest day of the Church and prepares adults for becoming a part of the Body of Christ through study, prayer, and mentorship. The program includes selecting a Baptismal sponsor/mentor, regular meetings with Father Robert, some self-guided reading, and being formally admitted as Catechumens during Sunday worship. To enroll in this program and prepare for adult Baptism, **please let Father Robert** know of your interest by December 20.








Women's Book Group
