

#### **Christmas Bird Count Results for 2023**

Another year has rolled on by and another Christmas Bird Count is in the books. On December 18th, three of us set out to cover the bird count circle that includes all of Parkwood and a couple areas just outside including PUD and portions of nearby side streets. This year the weather cooperated. We had reasonable temperatures and the rain didn't get serious un-



til we were finishing up. It was much better than the snow and biting wind of last year. The birds were not hunkered down as much this year and our total numbers reflected that. Last year the species count was 38 with 497 individual birds. This year we counted 39 species with 697 birds. This compares well when I pulled out the count for 2020 when we had 36 species and 617 individual birds. These two years are a better comparison. While the totals are close for 2023 and 2020, how we got to those totals is different. For example, this year we had 80 Canada Geese compared to 160 in 2020. A boost was the addition of 150 flashy Red-winged Blackbirds this year compared to zero in 2020. Dark-eyed Juncos, however, were down to 24 this year from 88 in 2020, But Bushtits picked up some of the slack with 40 this year instead of 9 in 2020. American Wigeons and Ring-necked Ducks also showed modest increases over 2020, as did Mourning Doves. While we didn't spot any rare birds, the continuing occurrence of the Wood Duck on a nearby pond is always a delight. Our circle is one of the few in the county to have Wood Ducks.

Two notable absentees this year were House Finches and Pine Siskins which were tallied at 42 and 27 respectively in 2020, but none were sighted this year. A possible reason for the absences could be the presence of skilled hunters such as Cooper's Hawks, Sharp-shinned, Red-tailed Hawks and a Merlin that we have seen on multiple occasions in the park over the last year. It would take more study to see if it was just an off day for the two species or if there truly is a decline. Anna's Hummingbirds were another species that showed a decline by half. Perhaps they are just more spread out as more nectar feeders have been noted in the park. I hope it's that easy to explain. You might keep track of hummingbird visits and do your own study to see if you notice a change from previous years. Of course the recent cold snap and ice this year will have an effect in the short term. They will sometimes move to a warmer area temporarily in search of more of their main source of nutrition-bugs! While they love nectar and it gives them quick energy, which is important on frosty mornings when they emerge from torpor, insects are what keeps them flying high and fast. We'll be looking out for them in the mean time and awaiting the return of the Rufous this spring.



We enjoy doing the Christmas Bird Count each year and contributing to the big picture of bird science in our own small way. You too can help by posting your bird counts on ebird.org. It doesn't have to be a special occasion. Daily counts can go a long way to track the overall health of our beloved flying friends.
