Gift of Lent

Each year the church gives us an opportunity to reflect on the Paschal Mystery (Jesus' Life, Death and Resurrection) and its potential effect in our lives as Catholic's and as a Faith Community. The three pillars of Lent are Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving and it is the intent of these pillars to help us become more Christ like and become a vibrant, active faith community. This will only happen if we are intentional in our Lenten journey.

I believe prayer and fasting leads us into Spirit directed almsgiving (doing). It has been stressed in our Lenten journey about giving up things for Lent. This giving up is meant to be selfdiscipline but also gives us more time to pray and listen to the Holy Spirit leadings. The question I have for myself and for all of you is: "What is the Lord asking me **to do** this Lent in regards to alms giving (time, talent and treasures). If I give up screen time, what should I do in place? Pray, visit a neighbor, go to daily Mass, the list could go on and on. The Corporal and Spiritual works of mercy come to mind: Corporal: feed the sick, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, welcome the stranger, visit the sick, visit those in prison, bury the dead. Spiritual: Instruct the ignorant, counsel the doubtful, admonish sinners, bear wrongs patiently, forgive offenses patiently, comfort the afflicted and pray for the living and the dead. All these works of Mercy lead to encounter with others. We are to be Christ bearers to those around us. What is the Lord asking you to do? I would encourage you to journal your Lenten journey.

The Gospel is quite challenging this week. Jesus says, "remove the wooden beam from your own eye first, then you will see clearly." As we prepare for the Holy season of Lent, let us take time to reflect on the beam in our own eye so we can clearly see the Lord's plan for us as individuals and as community. May we remember we are beloved sons and daughters of the Father and have been given a message of hope, love and forgiveness to share with those around us. Be intentional this Lenten season. Peace!
