SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM

A safe environment protects our children from harm, including sexual abuse and child molestation. It allows them to feel confident and secure in the classroom, at church, and all parish sponsored programs and events.

At St. Paul Parish, we are committed to providing a safe environment for our children, and will relentlessly focus on that goal. Anyone who volunteers in **any capacity** at St. Paul Parish or School, is **required by the diocese** to complete a Safe Environment Training online session and background check.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT TRAINING ONLINE WORKSHOP

The Diocese of Springfield mandated that each parish make available and/or offer the “Safe Environment Training online” session to **ALL** parishioners to create and promote a safe environment for everyone. The policy of our diocese now **REQUIRES that ALL** persons (**Catholic and Non Catholic**) who seek to serve or volunteer in the church in any capacity **MUST** attend the “**Safe Environment Training online**” seminar and also have a **background check** taken by our diocese.

Training Required: All servers must attend an initial training session as scheduled. Boys and girls must also be willing to attend any extra meetings or practices for special liturgies or Masses. Safe Environment Training online **required** for adults over 18.

A Eucharistic Minister shares the Bread of Life with others.

Responsibilities: Must fulfill monthly or daily assignments (as preferred through Ministry Scheduler Pro (MSP)) for distribution of Holy Communion or be willing to secure a substitute. Appropriate dress is required. Must be a practicing, fully initiated (Confirmed) Catholic.

Helpful Attributes: A strong commitment to Christ and the church as evidenced by a life lived in conformity with all that the church teaches.

Time Commitment: Typically scheduled monthly at their preferred Mass time, or daily Mass as scheduled.

Training Required: Eucharistic Minister Training session as scheduled. Safe Environment Training online **required**.

Meeting Schedule: Refresher training sessions as scheduled.

Responsibilities: Read, practice, prepare for oral reading at the ambo. Be able to practice and pronounce difficult words. At the ambo, read in a deliberate, slow, audible and clear voice so that the words on the page come alive for those listening. Appropriate dress is required. Must be practicing, fully initiated (Confirmed) Catholics.

Helpful Attributes: Enjoy, and/or be comfortable with, public speaking. Have a willingness to take the time to prepare to meet responsibilities.

Time Commitment: Preparation time before Mass. Once trained, you can choose to be the lector during the week or only on weekends at your preferred Mass or both.

Training Required: Attend Lector training session and read for Lector coordinator, attend additional refresher sessions as scheduled. Safe Environment Training online **required**.

Goals and Purpose: This choir enhances and supports the sung prayer of the assembly and adds to the dignity and beauty of the liturgy through the voices and instruments of our parish children and teens.

Responsibilities: This choir sings a few times a year at a Christmas Eve Mass, possibly an Easter Sunday Mass, and other special occasions.

Helpful Attributes: Singers and instrumentalists aged 3rd Grade through High School. Members should enjoy singing and/or playing instruments in a group setting. Note: Instruments especially encouraged to join are: flutes, violins, clarinets, keyboard, guitars, percussion. Others welcome as music allows.

Time Commitment: A rehearsal schedule is sent out via email once the masses are scheduled. Rehearsals are in the evening, and typically 2 are held for each mass to be prepared. A performance schedule will be sent via email, as well. High School students who are interested in participating but unable to attend practices should contact Andrea for alternate possibilities. ALL YOUTH OF THE PARISH ARE INVITED TO PARTICIPATE!
