LEE WINS FIRST

Yoollyn Lee made timely birdies on the 17th and 18th holes Sunday to force a playoff, which she won to earn her first victory on the Korea LPGA Tour at the Sangsangin Hankyung Wownet Open.

Lee won with a birdie on the fifth extra hole over PING pro Ji Young Park. Five staffers finished in the top 10.

In Lee's bag were two G440 hybrids, a G430 LST driver and G430 LST 3W, Blueprint S irons, s159 wedges, and a PLD Custom Tyne-C putter.



GARCIA EARNS CARD

Sebastian Garcia secured his DP World Tour card for 2026 with a playoff victory at the Hangzhou Open in Hangzhou, China.

His first victory on the HotelPlanner Tour is his third top 5 in four tournaments. He jumped to seventh place in points (the top 20 earn status). "Five weeks ago, I was 35th in the

rankings and my target over the last two weeks was to win, so this is a dream come true for me."

He has three wins on the Alps Tour, and played the seven previous seasons on the DP World Tour.

He capped his week with a chip-in for eagle on the 72nd hole to earn a T6. Hovland was T5 last month at the BMW PGA Championship on the DP World Tour, where he has two career victories. Farther up the leaderboard in India was Thriston Lawrence, who brought home a T3, his 65 on Sunday matching the low round of the day.

3 ADVANCE IN PLAYOFFS

Looking to build on their memorable seasons on the PGA Tour Champions, Miguel Angel Jiménez and Stewart Cink sit 1-2 in Charles Schwab Cup points as they prepare for the second playoff event this week, the Simmons Bank Championship. They are joined in the field of 54 who qualified on points by Ken Tanigawa.

Jiménez and Cink have been consistently stellar, Jiménez winning four times among 14 top 10's, while Cink has brought home two trophies and earned 13 top 10's (with three runners-up). Jiménez owns 17 Champions crowns.

The season culminates Nov. 13-16 at the Charles Schwab Cup Championship in Phoenix.
