LEE RALLIES FOR BIG WIN

The trophy held by Jung Hwan Lee at the Genesis Championship on Sunday carries a lot of weight.

His win, on home soil in South Korea, comes with a two-year exemption on the DP World Tour. A regular on the Korean Tour, Lee bested a strong field at an event co-sanctioned by the DP World Tour and KPGA Tour.

Four strokes back to start his final round, he rallied with a seven-under 64, low round of the tournament, to win by three. He played a G440 LST driver, G440 MAX 3W, an iDi driving iron, Blueprint S and T irons, s159 wedges, and a PLD Custom Prime Tyne S putter.

The win gets him into the first event of the DP World Tour Playoffs at the Abu Dhabi HSBC Championship.

SAKUMA DOMINATES

Sunday's 11-stroke, record-smashing victory, her fourth this year, was one more example of the special season being authored by Shuri Sakuma on the Japan LPGA Tour. She won wire-to-wire for the second time this season at the Nobuta Group Masters GC Ladies.

Sakuma set a tournament scoring record at 25-under by six strokes. The victory extends her points lead in the Mercedes Ranking, putting her in a strong

position for JLPGA Player of the Year honors.

Every victory has come with her Scottsdale DS72 putter. Also in her bag were a G430 MAX 10K driver, G430 MAX 3W, G430 hybrids, i240 (#5) and Blueprint S irons, and s159 wedges.

"I want to win five games to become queen of the year," Sakuma said, "so I would be happy if I could win one more."
