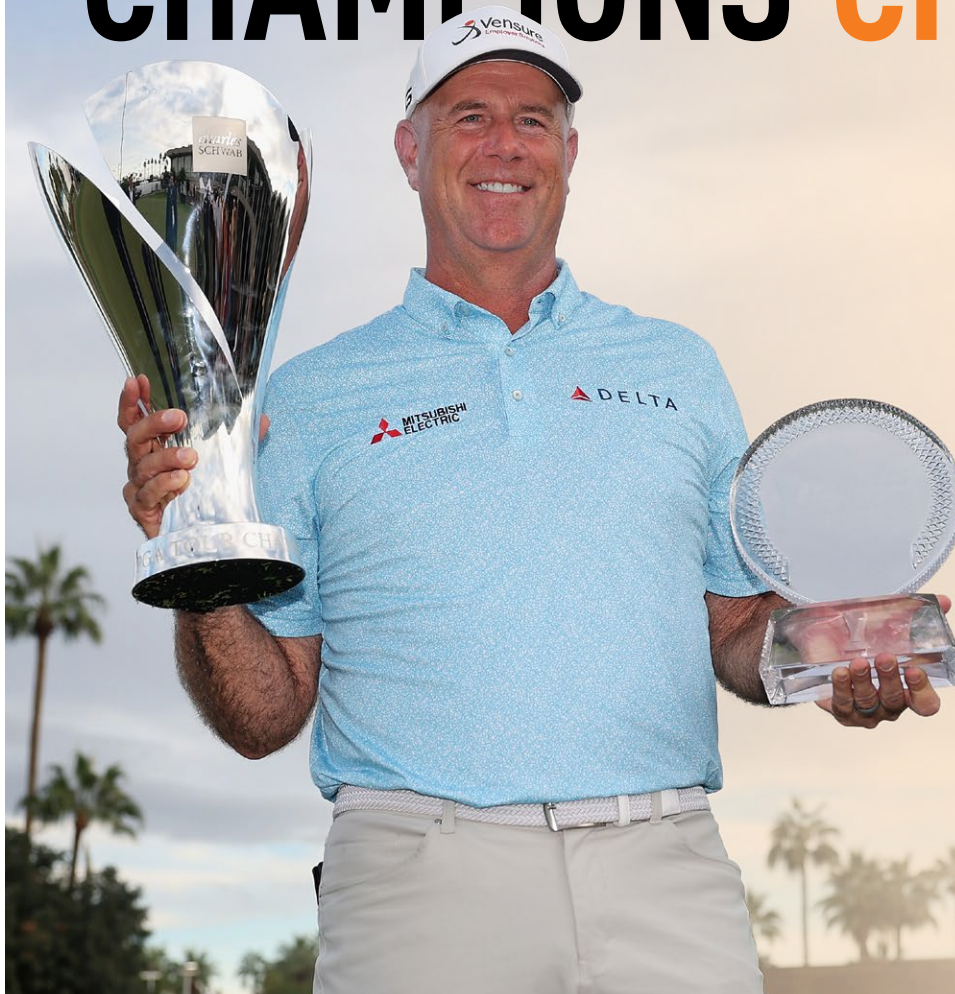

CHAMPIONS CHAMPION



Stewart Cink had his hands full of trophies Sunday on the PGA Tour Champions at Phoenix Country Club. He earned a two-shot victory at the season-ending Charles Schwab Cup Championship, and with that title he also won the Charles Schwab Cup points race.

The points crown was built on the strength of three wins and 15 top 10s in 21 starts.

At -20 he matched the lowest 72-hole score on the PGA Tour Champions this season. He relied on a G440 MAX driver and 3W, and a PING Vault 2.0 Ketsch putter, among his PING technology.

Miguel Angel Jiménez, the only four-time winner this season, finished third in points.

Stewart Cink's victory Sunday was his fourth on the PGA Tour Champions.

GRANT WINS ANNIKA

Linn Grant is back in the winner's circle, claiming her second LPGA Tour title at The Annika.

After an opening 68, Grant went on a tear, going 63-65-65 and was in complete control, ultimately winning by three over PING Pro Jennifer Kupcho.

She played a G430 LST driver, G440 MAX 4W, G440

hybrid, iDi driving iron, i210 irons, new PING prototype wedges, and a PLD Custom Prime Tyne putter.

Grant has won at least one tournament every year since 2020 across six tours, including the DP World Tour, which co-sanctioned the Scandinavian Mixed crown she won in 2022.

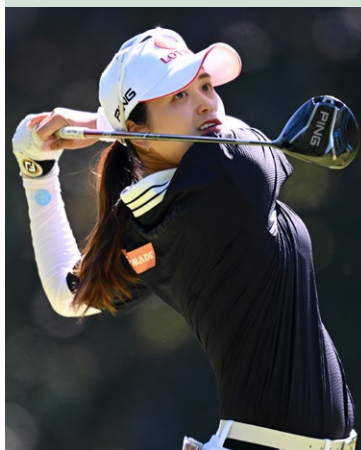

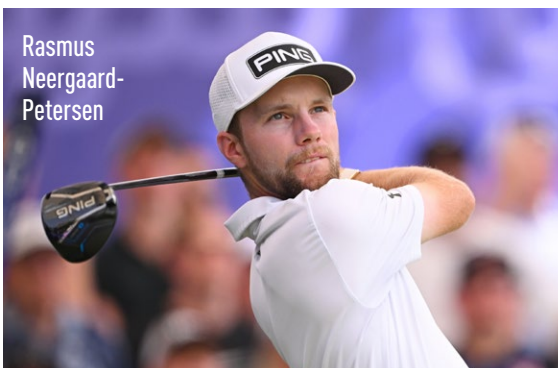

PROS EARN DUAL TOUR CARDS

Sunday was a Tour-card windfall for four PING pros, who scored dual membership on the PGA Tour and DP World Tour for finishing high in the final Race to Dubai Rankings.

Laurie Canter won for the second straight year on the DP World Tour (see story in Shot of the Week).

Rasmus Neergaard-Petersen birdied three of his final four holes Sunday at the DP World Tour Championship, his T3 helping him secure enough points to earn his cards.

In his first full season on the DP World Tour, he compiled eight top 10s.

Kristoffer Reitan's season highlight was firing a 62 in the final round of the Soudal Open, then winning in a playoff for his first DP World Tour victory. He also posted two seconds and a third.

John Parry earned his second DP World Tour victory, and posted four more top 3's. In seven PGA Tour starts, his best is a T16 at the 2025 Open Championship.
