

JUBILATION IN JAPAN



Ryuichi Oiwa's first victory on the Japan Golf Tour at the Casio World Open was won with flair. He birdied the 72nd hole to force a playoff, then won with a birdie on the second extra hole. In his bag were a G440 MAX driver and 4W, Blueprint S and T irons, s159 wedges, and a PLD Milled Oslo C putter.



Ai Suzuki earned her third major title on the Japan LPGA Tour and the 22nd victory of her career at the JLPGA Tour Championship Ricoh Cup. She won with a birdie in a playoff relying on a G440 LST driver and 3W, a G440 MAX 5W, G440 hybrids, Blueprint S irons, s159 wedges, and a G Le2 Echo putter.

SAKUMA WINS POINTS CROWN

Shuri Sakuma announced her presence in a big way on the Japan LPGA Tour this season, which concluded Sunday with Sakuma atop a number of rankings.

Her four wins (the first four of her career) made her the clear winner of the prestigious Mercedes

Ranking points title. She also finished #1 on the money list, in scoring average, number of birdies at 462, top-10 finishes with 19, and she fired 44 rounds in the 60's (T1).

She won all of her tournaments with a new Scottsdale DS72 putter.
