

4 STAFF WINS SUNDAY

BRADBURY
AT HIS BEST

The Joburg Open in South Africa brings out the best in Dan Bradbury, who on Sunday captured his second trophy at the tournament that he first won in 2022.

His 5-under 65 in the final round at the friendly confines of Houghton Golf Club in Johannesburg matched the low round of the day to secure his third career DP World Tour crown.

Bradbury's win with a G440 LST driver was one of three titles Sunday with a G440 driver; the family has 11 wins this year, and the total number nears 70. See his *What's in the Bag, next page.*

SAKUMA SIZZLES AGAIN

Both arms raised in her characteristic winning celebration, a beaming Shuri Sakuma on Sunday picked up where she left off last season on the Japan LPGA Tour, taking the season opener, the Daikin Orchid Ladies Golf Tournament.

She won four times last year to claim the Mercedes Rankings points title, the

money crown, and was #1 in the key statistical categories.

Her victory at the Daikin, highlighted by a 10-under 62 in the second round, was earned with a G430 MAX 10K driver and a Scottsdale DS72 putter she's had in the bag for every title. Also among her PING technology were Blueprint S and T irons, and s259 wedges.

Berger shined at the Signature Event, making 22 birdies at a difficult Bay Hill relying on a G430 LST driver, Blueprint S irons, s259 wedges, and a PLD Custom Oslo putter to earn \$2.2 million.
