THE CHRISTIAN VOCATION

Today the Church rightly reflects often on vocations, most especially to the priesthood. While this is an essential and vital calling, it is not the only vocation, nor the most fundamental one. The first and most important vocation in the Church is the one shared by all the baptized: the Christian vocation—the call to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. All other vocations find their meaning in relation to this core calling. At Baptism, each of us responds to Jesus' invitation: *"Come, follow me."*

Sadly, many who are baptized live little differently from those who are not. Faith can become routine or merely external. What the Church needs today are Christians who follow Christ out of personal conviction—believers who are Christian not only in name, but in the way they live.



The Christian vocation is a call, in the words of the Gospel, to be *"salt of the earth and light of the world."* Christianity is not only about what we believe, but about how we live. Faith must be put into action. As Catherine de Hueck Doherty wisely said, *"Don't bother proclaiming that you believe, unless you act accordingly."*

As Christians, we have something vital to offer the world—something deeply needed, even if it is not always welcomed. We should not be hesitant or apologetic about our role. To live our vocation faithfully requires courage and boldness.

Following Christ means living as a Christian wherever we are and whatever our profession may be. There are many ways to serve the Gospel, but before all else, we are called not to activity, but to discipleship.

While answering Christ's call may not always make life easier, it makes life fuller. Jesus reminds us, *"I came that they may have life, and have it to the fullest."* The Christian vocation lifts our vision toward a higher way of life and calls us to sacrifice, service, love, and courage.

This task is not meant to be lived alone. We are called to witness to Christ as members of a believing and supportive community. Through Baptism, we are welcomed into the Church, the Body of Christ.

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord invites us to remember our own baptism and to renew our commitment to live out our Christian vocation with faith and generosity.

LA VOCACIÓN CRISTIANA

Hoy la Iglesia reflexiona con razón a menudo sobre las vocaciones, especialmente hacia el sacerdocio. Aunque esta es una vocación esencial y vital, no es la única vocación, ni la más fundamental. La primera y más importante vocación en la Iglesia es la que comparten todos los bautizados: la vocación cristiana—la llamada a ser discípulo de Jesucristo. Todas las demás vocaciones encuentran su significado en relación con esta vocación fundamental. En el Bautismo, cada uno de nosotros responde a la invitación de Jesús: *"Venid, seguidme."*

Lamentablemente, muchos de los bautizados viven poco diferente a los que no lo son. La fe puede convertirse en rutina o simplemente externa. Lo que la Iglesia necesita hoy son cristianos que sigan a Cristo por convicción personal—creyentes que sean cristianos no solo de nombre, sino en la forma en que viven.

La vocación cristiana es un llamamiento, en palabras del Evangelio, a ser *"sal de la tierra y luz del mundo."* El cristianismo no trata solo de lo que creemos, sino de cómo vivimos. La fe debe ponerse en práctica. Como sabiamente dijo Catherine de Hueck Doherty: *"No te molestes en proclamar que crees, a menos que actúes en consecuencia."*

Como cristianos, tenemos algo vital que ofrecer al mundo—algo profundamente necesario, aunque no siempre sea bienvenido. No deberíamos dudar ni pedir disculpas por nuestro papel. Vivir nuestra vocación fielmente requiere coraje y audacia.

Seguir a Cristo significa vivir como cristiano dondequiera que estemos y sea cual sea nuestra profesión. Hay muchas formas de servir al Evangelio, pero ante todo, no estamos llamados a la actividad, sino al discipulado.

Aunque responder al llamado de Cristo no siempre facilite la vida, la hace más plena. Jesús nos recuerda: *"He venido para que tengan vida, y la tengan en pleno."* La vocación cristiana eleva nuestra visión hacia una vida superior y nos llama al sacrificio, al servicio, al amor y al valor.

Esta tarea no está pensada para vivir solo. Estamos llamados a dar testimonio a Cristo como miembros de una comunidad creyente y de apoyo. A través del Bautismo, somos bienvenidos en la Iglesia, el Cuerpo de Cristo.

La Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor nos invita a recordar nuestro propio bautismo y a renovar nuestro compromiso de vivir nuestra vocación cristiana con fe y generosidad.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

January 11, 2026—The Baptism of the Lord

Matthew: 3:13-17



Apple ran a commercial not long ago called “Behind the Mac – Greatness.” It shows artists and creators, such as Kendrick Lamar, Billie Eilish, and Lady Gaga, working behind their MacBooks. The narration says, “There’s a certain kind of person who doesn’t wait for greatness. They make it.” It’s a compelling message. There’s beauty in using our gifts with passion and purpose. But there lies a hidden weight in that idea: If you are what you make, what happens when you can’t anymore? When the project fails, the passion fades, or the spotlight moves on, where is greatness then?

Today’s Gospel offers a differing vision of greatness. Jesus steps into the Jordan River. He hasn’t preached, healed, or performed a single miracle. Then the heavens open, and the Father speaks: “You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.” It’s not a reward for success. It’s not earned. Before he does anything “great,” Jesus receives the greatness of his identity from the Father.

And so do you. At your baptism, God said the same thing over you: “You are my beloved.” That is your true identity, not constructed or earned but received. When we see ourselves and others this way, everything changes for the better. We discover a greatness that can never be taken away.

This week, reflect on your baptism: look up the date, thank God for it, pray for those baptized with you, or visit the church where it happened. Let your identity be rooted there.

Virtues, Explained! **JOY**

Mini Explanation

Joy is the experience of achieving what we most desire — and what we most desire is love. God made us in love and for love, and so, in the same way that a flower seeks the sunlight, our souls seek the warmth of true, selfless love.



Joy, Explained!

Though it is often used as a synonym for happiness, joy has far more to do with the choices we make than the emotions we feel.

Joy is the experience of achieving what we most desire — and what we most desire is love. God made us in love and for love, and so, in the same way that a flower seeks the sunlight, our souls seek the warmth of true, selfless love. The virtue of joy, therefore, is a fruit of the virtue of love, or charity (CCC 1829).

“We are meant to have our human joys: the joy of living, the joy of love and friendship, the joy of work well done,” said Saint Pope John Paul II. “We who are Christians have a further cause for joy: like Jesus, we know that we are loved by God our Father. This love transforms our lives and fills us with joy.”

11 de enero de 2026: La Bautismo del Señor

Mateo 3:13-17

Las lecturas de hoy nos presentan al prometido por Dios desde el Antiguo Testamento. Al ser bautizado por Juan, Jesús asume su misión pública, nada fácil, por cierto. Sin embargo, no está solo. El Espíritu Santo lo acompañará a lo largo de su vida y misión. “En ese momento se abrieron los cielos y vio al Espíritu de Dios que bajaba como una paloma y se posaba sobre él. Al mismo tiempo, se oyó una voz del cielo que decía: ‘Este es mi Hijo, el Amado; en él me complazco’”. (Mateo 3:16-17). La liturgia de este domingo nos invita a descubrir la magnitud de nuestro bautismo. Desde ese día, el Espíritu Santo nos acompaña y guía en cada momento de nuestra vida. Solo basta con dejarlo actuar, y hará maravillas en nosotros. ¿Sabes la fecha y el día de tu bautismo? ¿Conoces el nombre del sacerdote que te dio el sacramento?



“Los bautizados se han revestido de Cristo” (Gálatas 3:27). “Por el Espíritu Santo, el bautismo es un baño que purifica, santifica y justifica” (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, #1227).

Gracias, Señor, por amarnos tanto, porque por nuestro bautismo nos acogiste y abrazaste en tus brazos, y nos manifestaste ante la comunidad para formar parte de la familia cristiana.
