Advent Fr. Kevin's Korner

BLESSED IS THE ONE WHO DOES NOT LOSE FAITH IN ME

Today's readings offer us words of deep comfort and hope. In Isaiah we hear: "*Courage! Do not be afraid—God is coming to save you.*" St. James encourages us: "*Be patient... do not lose heart.*" And in the Gospel, Jesus speaks those tender words to John the Baptist: "*Blessed is the one who does not lose faith in me.*" These words are spoken to us as well. They strengthen us in the moments when life feels heavy or uncertain.

1. Faith in Times of Darkness

John the Baptist, a faithful servant of God, found himself imprisoned and facing death. Even those closest to God can experience fear, confusion, and doubt. When life's burdens make us question God's nearness, Jesus' words remain our anchor: "*Blessed is the one who does not lose faith in me.*"

2. When Life Changes Suddenly

Sometimes everything seems to be going well—until a sudden "storm" arrives: a job loss, a serious illness, or a family tragedy. Such moments shake our sense of stability and may even shake our faith. Isaiah's message is especially meant for these seasons: "*Courage! Do not be afraid.*"

3. For Those Working for Peace

We long for peace in our world, and many dedicate their lives to building it. Yet the slow pace of change can be discouraging. To all peacemakers, St. James offers this encouragement: "*Be patient! Do not lose heart.*"

4. When We Face the Mystery of Death

Death is the greatest test of faith. For all who live with grief—especially those who have recently lost a loved one—Jesus gives His consoling promise: "*Blessed is the one who does not lose faith in me.*"

5. For Parents Carrying the Pain of Children Stepping away from Faith

Some parents grieve when their children step away from the practice of the faith, despite every effort to guide them well. To these parents, St. James again speaks gently: "*Be patient... do not lose heart.*"

Each of us knows what it is to be afraid. Fear is a human feeling—we cannot avoid it. But we can choose not to let fear stop us. True courage is not the absence of fear, but the decision to walk forward in faith despite it.

Our faith can feel fragile at times. Doubts may arise, and God understands this. Yet blessed indeed are we when we hold on to faith in Jesus. And even more blessed are we when our faith inspires us to live with love, mercy, and compassion—mirroring the heart of Christ in our world. ©LPi

BENDITO SEA EL QUE NO PIERDE LA FE EN MÍ

Las lecturas de hoy nos ofrecen palabras de profundo consuelo y esperanza. En Isaías escuchamos: *"¡Coraje! No tengáis miedo—Dios viene a salvaros."* Santiago nos anima: *"Ten paciencia... No pierdas el ánimo."* Y en el Evangelio, Jesús pronuncia esas palabras tiernas a Juan el Bautista: *"Bienaventurado el que no pierde la fe en mí."* Estas palabras también se nos dicen a nosotros.

Nos fortalecen en los momentos en que la vida se siente pesada o incierta.

1. Fe en tiempos de oscuridad Juan Bautista, un fiel siervo de Dios, se encontró encarcelado y enfrentándose a la muerte. Incluso quienes están más cerca de Dios pueden experimentar miedo, confusión y duda. Cuando las cargas de la vida nos hacen cuestionar la cercanía de Dios, las palabras de Jesús permanecen como nuestro ancla:

"Bendito el que no pierde la fe en mí."

2. Cuando la vida cambia de repente veces todo parece ir bien, hasta que llega una "tormenta" repentina: una pérdida de empleo, una enfermedad grave o una tragedia familiar. Estos momentos sacuden nuestra sensación de estabilidad e incluso pueden sacudir nuestra fe. El mensaje de Isaías está especialmente dirigido a estas estaciones:

"¡Valor! No tengas miedo."

3. Para quienes trabajan por la paz Anhelamos la paz en nuestro mundo, y muchos dedican sus vidas a construirla. Sin embargo, el ritmo lento del cambio puede ser desalentador. A todos los pacificadores, Santiago ofrece este estímulo:

"¡Tened paciencia! No pierdas el ánimo."

4. Cuando enfrentamos el misterio de la muerte; La muerte es la mayor prueba de fe. Para todos los que viven con dolor —especialmente aquellos que han perdido recientemente a un ser querido— Jesús hace su promesa consoladora:

"Bendito el que no pierde la fe en mí."

5. Para los padres que soportan el dolor de que los hijos se alejen de la fe. Algunos padres lloran cuando sus hijos se alejan de la práctica de la fe, a pesar de todos los esfuerzos por guiarles bien. A estos padres, Santiago vuelve a hablar con suavidad:

"Tened paciencia... No pierdas el ánimo."

Cada uno de nosotros sabe lo que es tener miedo. El miedo es un sentimiento humano—no podemos evitarlo. Pero podemos elegir no dejar que el miedo nos detenga. El verdadero valor no es la ausencia de miedo, sino la decisión de avanzar con fe a pesar de ello.

Nuestra fe puede parecer frágil a veces. Pueden surgir dudas, y Dios lo entiende. Sin embargo, somos realmente benditos cuando mantenemos la fe en Jesús. Y aún más bendecidos somos cuando nuestra fe nos inspira a vivir con amor, misericordia y compasión, reflejando el corazón de Cristo en nuestro mundo.

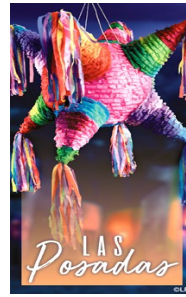

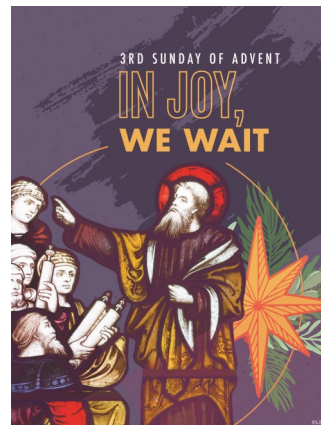

GOSPEL MEDITATION

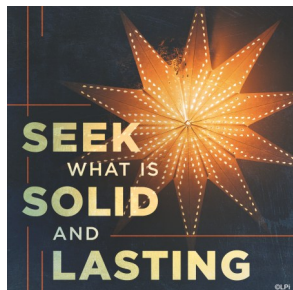
December 14, 2025—Third Sunday of Advent

Matthew: 1:2-11

When I was 11, I was riding my bike on a Friday night in Scottsdale, Arizona. I saw giant spotlights swirling in the sky. Something amazing had to be happening. I pedaled after them with excitement. Sweaty and tired, I arrived, only to find a used car lot. Bright lights, flapping banners, inflatable balloon men swaying wildly in the wind. I stood there, heart sinking. All that spectacle, and all my effort ... for this?

As life proceeds, we learn what it is like to pursue promising but fruitless searches. This week we hear Jesus ask the crowds regarding John the Baptist: “What did you go out to the desert to see? A reed swayed by the wind?” (Matthew 11:7). He’s not just describing the crowd’s mis-aimed pursuit. He’s naming our tendency to chase after what’s flashy but flimsy.

What are our swaying reeds? For me, it is endless video reels on my phone, worldly pleasures, entertainment in sports, and the good opinion of others. Inflated distractions that bend whichever way the wind blows. But they can’t satisfy my soul. What are your flimsy reeds?



John the Baptist wasn’t a swaying reed. He was rooted, grounded, unafraid to speak the solid truth. The people went to see him because, deep down, they were starving for something real.

This Advent, the Church asks us to reassess: What are we really looking for? Are we chasing the dazzling but hollow? Or are we seeking what is solid and lasting — that which points to Christ?

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

14 de diciembre de 2025: III Domingo de Adviento

Mateo 1:2-11

¿Dónde está nuestra esperanza en este tercer domingo de Adviento? ¿En qué se basa nuestra alegría? Este domingo es llamado el domingo de la alegría, porque ya estamos acercándonos a la Navidad. En latín se conoce como Gaudete, que significa “alegría” o “regocíjense”. El verdadero gozo consiste en el nacimiento del Salvador, siendo este nacimiento la causa profunda de nuestra alegría. A veces perdemos mucho tiempo en las tiendas, comprando regalos, sin siquiera darnos cuenta de que el tiempo pasa y se va sin provecho alguno para nuestra alma. Miremos al cielo, de donde nos llega la esperanza y la gracia. Ahí es donde está Dios.

El Evangelio nos narra que Juan estaba en la cárcel y quería saber si era verdad lo que había escuchado sobre Jesús. La respuesta para Juan fue la siguiente: "Vayan y cuéntenle a Juan lo que ustedes están viendo y oyendo: los ciegos ven, los cojos andan, los leprosos quedan limpios, los sordos oyen, los muertos resucitan, y una Buena Nueva llega a los pobres" (Mateo 11:5). Con esta respuesta, Juan quedó lleno de esperanza, seguro de que el Reino de Dios ya estaba presente.

Juan predicaba la conversión, un cambio de mentalidad radical, válido tanto entonces como ahora. Para nosotros, la venida del Salvador es un hecho seguro y esperanzador. Sin embargo, solo los pobres de espíritu logran visualizarlo en el horizonte de la Navidad. Aguardemos con paciencia los regalos de la gracia de Dios: la paz y el amor entre nosotros, que tanto necesitamos. ¡Ven, Señor Jesús!

BENEATH THE SURFACE

We go to Mass. We go to Confession. We pray. We read Scripture. In doing all these things, again and again, we go out to the desert. Why? What are we expecting to see?

What We See in the Desert ...

I've always wanted to see a real desert.

I know all about frigid, snowy winters and warm, wet summers. I grew up on rich soil that yields lush vegetation and bountiful harvests. But I've never experienced a desert, not in my own country or abroad, and I'm curious.

I know there must be something magical about the desert for it to feature so heavily in Scripture, for it to provide a backdrop to so many crucial moments of salvation history. The Israelites following the cloud, the temptation of Christ, the voice crying out: "Prepare the way for the Lord."

Why do these moments have to happen in a desert? Why do they make so much less sense in a tropical rainforest or a verdant forest? I think it's because the desert doesn't have anything to offer us, at first glance. No one longs for the physical sensation of a dry heat and a beating sun. But the vast emptiness and the almost mystical harshness — even if we don't desire and delight in it, this is a setting that we understand, somehow, intrinsically. We know it deep within our soul. God is there.

We go to Mass. We go to Confession. We pray. We read Scripture. In doing all these things, again and again, we go out to the desert. Why? What are we expecting to see? If we expect to be entertained, we will be disappointed. If we expect reassurance, we will be disappointed. If we expect to feel pleasant and safe and sheltered, we will be disappointed. The desert is there to challenge us. The desert is there to show us who we are, and who we can be.

So go.
