


Fr. Kevin's Korner

God is our Security

As Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem, many people crowded around him to hear his teaching. A voice came out of the crowd asking Jesus to make a judgement in the case of two brothers fighting over an inheritance. The question had nothing to do with what Jesus had been teaching, so the brother who felt as if he was being cheated must not have been listening to anything that Jesus was instructing. However, the interruption gave Jesus the opportunity to speak on another topic: greed.

Greed is an excessive desire for wealth and possessions. We need things of course. We need clothes to wear, food to eat, a roof over our heads, etc., but our things can easily become a major preoccupation. It is not just the wealthy who can let greed and envy take control of their lives. It can be a personality trait in anyone, whether they are poor, middle class or quite wealthy, and when it does; then our possessions will end up owning us. One great harm greed does is it leads us to neglect other important facets of our lives, such as, spending time with our family and our God. I have even seen people lose all they had through gambling because they wanted to win the BIG prize. Psychologically, the greedy person measures their own self-worth by what they have, and the more wealthy that is theirs, the more important they think themselves to be.

God gave us a brain, he gives us talents, he gives us strength and energy, and he expects us to provide for ourselves and our loved ones. God put Adam and Eve in the Garden of Paradise and commanded them to cultivate it and care for it before they disobeyed God. When they were told there was one thing they were not allowed to have, they decided they had to have that too. Jesus gives us an illustration in this parable. The rich farmer was not portrayed as a sinful person; he did not steal or cheat his laborers. It was a good growing season that made him rich. Most probably he was honest, hardworking, and smart, but not smart enough to fully grasp reality. He had set himself up for many years of leisure and prosperity, but in one day, someone else would end up enjoying it all because



Jesus said, "this night the man's soul would be required of him." The man was rich in material things, but poor in the most important thing of all, his relationship with God. I know I am writing to people whom I suspect have discovered, as I have, that the more I help others with what I have been given, the more it seems to come back to me. I am writing to people who believe that our relationship with God is the most important thing in our lives, or you would not be here reading this article. Thank you for coming today and every week as you do.

El Padre Nuestro

Mientras Jesús se dirigía a Jerusalén, muchas personas se agolparon a su alrededor para escuchar sus enseñanzas. Una voz salió de la multitud pidiéndole a Jesús que hiciera un juicio en el caso de dos hermanos que peleaban por una herencia. La pregunta no tenía nada que ver con lo que Jesús había estado enseñando, por lo que el hermano que sintió que estaba siendo engañado no debe haber estado escuchando nada de lo que Jesús estaba instruyendo. Sin embargo, la interrupción le dio a Jesús la oportunidad de hablar sobre otro tema: la codicia.

La codicia es un deseo excesivo de riqueza y posesiones. Necesitamos cosas, por supuesto. Necesitamos ropa para ponernos, comida para comer, un techo sobre nuestras cabezas, etc., pero nuestras cosas pueden convertirse fácilmente en una preocupación importante. No son solo los ricos los que pueden dejar que la codicia y la envidia tomen el control de sus vidas. Puede ser un rasgo de personalidad en cualquier persona, ya sea pobre, de clase media o bastante rica, y cuando lo hace; entonces nuestras posesiones terminarán poseyéndonos. Un gran daño que hace la codicia es que nos lleva a descuidar otras facetas importantes de nuestras vidas, como pasar tiempo con nuestra familia y nuestro Dios. Incluso he visto a personas perder todo lo que tenían a través del juego porque querían ganar el GRAN premio. Psicológicamente, la persona codiciosa mide su propia autoestima por lo que tiene, y cuanto más rica es la suya, más importante se cree que es.

Dios nos dio un cerebro, nos da talentos, nos da fuerza y energía, y espera que nos mantengamos a nosotros mismos y a nuestros seres queridos. Dios puso a Adán y Eva en el Jardín del Paraíso y les ordenó que lo cultivaran y cuidaran antes de que desobedecieran a Dios. Cuando les dijeron que había una cosa que no se les permitía tener, decidieron que también tenían que tenerla.

Jesús nos da una ilustración en esta parábola. El granjero rico no fue retratado como una persona pecadora; no robó ni engañó a sus trabajadores. Fue una buena temporada de cultivo que lo hizo rico. Lo más probable es que fuera honesto, trabajador e inteligente, pero no lo suficientemente inteligente como para comprender completamente la realidad. Se había preparado para muchos años de ocio y prosperidad, pero en un día, alguien más terminaría disfrutándolo todo porque Jesús dijo: "Esta noche se le demandará el alma del hombre". El hombre era rico en cosas materiales, pero pobre en lo más importante de todo, su relación con Dios. Sé que estoy escribiendo a personas que sospecho que han descubierto, como yo, que cuanto más ayudo a otros con lo que me han dado, más parece volver a mí. Le escribo a personas que creen que nuestra relación con Dios es lo más importante en nuestras vidas, o no estarían aquí leyendo este artículo. Gracias por venir hoy y todas las semanas como lo haces.




IN THE PARISH**GOSPEL MEDITATION**

August 3, 2025 —18th Sunday in Ordinary Time
Luke 12:13-21

Recent studies suggest that millennials will be the first generation in America to be worse off than their parents in terms of financial earnings and job status. Many lament this. I propose that this week's Gospel provides a hopeful way to see the trend as good news.

The Lord Jesus says, "Take care to guard against greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist in possessions" (Luke 12:15). Greed damages us with the deception that we are what we possess. But to Jesus, this is simply not true. What makes us happy is who we are, who we become.

Does not the expectation that every generation should do better than their parents subtly mask the poison of greed? A similar attitude is mirrored in the man who demands that Jesus justly arrange his share of the family inheritance. Despite the injustice, Jesus will not play that game. In fact, he seems to prefer that the man have less than his parents. What good would having more be to this man if he becomes enslaved and miserable by greed? What good would it be for us to have more if it means we become much less?



In allowing the man to have less, Jesus opens a space for him to become more: a man free to love. In that much more meaningful sense, perhaps he was better off than his parents. Maybe the millennials will be, too. — Father John Muir

Lucas 12:13-21

A todos nos gusta hacer planes, tener metas y llegar a ellas. Eso nos pone contentos porque nos va bien en la vida y pensamos: "Qué bien, he luchado tanto que ya puedo disfrutar de lo que tengo". Pero nos olvidamos de lo más importante: en las metas nunca contamos contigo. Nos olvidamos de que sólo Tú, Señor, nos darás la auténtica libertad y felicidad. No está la vida en poseer bienes. "Eviten con gran cuidado toda clase de codicia, porque, aunque uno tenga todo, no son sus posesiones las que le dan vida" (Lucas 12:15).

Vale preguntarnos: ¿Cuál es el centro de tu vida? ¿Cuál es la meta en tu vida? ¿Está tu felicidad en lo que posees, en tu estatus social, en lo que dirá la gente de ti? Cuidado, nos advierte Jesús: "Esta misma noche vas a morir. ¿Quién se quedará con lo que has preparado?" (Lucas 12:20).

"Jesús percibe nuestros problemas, nuestras debilidades, nuestras necesidades; invita a convertirnos a la fe en la Providencia, saber compartir lo poco que somos y tenemos, y no cerrarnos nunca en nosotros mismos" (Papa Francisco). El tener muchos bienes y prestigio no es malo, lo que Dios desea es que aprendamos a ser desprendidos, es decir, generosos. No equivocemos el proyecto de nuestra vida; la abundancia es pasajera, todo se queda al morir. Solo las riquezas espirituales serán eternas. "Esto vale para toda persona que amontona para sí misma en vez de acumular para Dios" (Lucas 12:21).




