Fr. Kevin's Korner

CELEBRATING CHRISTMAS

How should we celebrate Christmas? Two extremes should be avoided. The first is to regard Christmas as a purely religious feast to be celebrated only in Church. The other extreme is to see Christmas as a purely secular event without any spiritual meaning.

In reality, our celebration of Christmas has many layers to it.

The top layer is the consumer Christmas; incessant Christmas carols, reindeer and Santa Claus, and the aggressive merchandising of all kinds of goods. It encourages acquisitiveness among children, and creates anxiety about over-spending and fatigue among adults. It is a Christmas with a hollow core. To eliminate the religious aspect of Christmas is to remove the heart and soul of Christmas.

Next is the Charles Dickens layer; cards depicting snowy scenes, roaring fires, turkey and ham, plum puddings and mince pies, family get-together's, goodwill to all, philanthropy and expansiveness. These values have a lot to be said for them. Most people have a shot at this version of Christmas. But, in the absence of faith, what does it amount to? Maybe a little up-lift, a few pious phrases, a few gifts given and received...then everything goes on as before.

The third level is that of the Nativity; which depicts, for us, what Christmas is all about. This is the layer of the school Nativity play, reenacting the Christmas story, which, in all its simplicity, can be deeply moving.

The fourth and deepest layer is the spiritual one; it is the story of how, in Israel, 2000 years ago, a baby was born. In the person of this baby, God's Son took our nature upon himself and entered our world in weakness and in love. He came to remind us that we are God's children, and we have an eternal destiny.

There is a tendency to dismiss, or even condemn, the first three layers, and to see the spiritual layer as the only true one. This is based on the supposition that the spiritual and the material are opposed to one another.

There can be no such thing as a purely spiritual Christmas. Christianity includes matter as well as spirit. What we have to do is find a connection between the secular marketplace and the spiritual content of the feast. Much of the buying and selling that occurs at Christmas fosters gift giving, good works, joy, and the affirmation of family ties.

We tend to make a clear division between the sacred and the secular, but you will not find that in Christmas. At Christmas, these are so interwoven that they seem to be one and the same thing. The Christmas story (as related in the Gospel) is set, not in a church or temple or synagogue, but in the everyday world.

The birth of Jesus, in a crowded Bethlehem, is a reminder, to the secularists among us, that God cannot be kept out; to the religious among us, it is a reminder to avoid any notion of confining God within our institutions, because God cannot be kept in either.

CELEBRANDO LA NAVIDAD

¿Cómo deberíamos celebrar la Navidad? Se deben evitar dos extremos. La primera es considerar la Navidad como una fiesta puramente religiosa que solo debe celebrarse en la iglesia. El otro extremo es ver la Navidad como un evento puramente secular sin ningún significado espiritual.

En realidad, nuestra celebración de la Navidad tiene muchas capas.

La capa superior es la Navidad del consumidor; villancicos incesantes, renos y Papá Noel, y el mercadeo agresivo de todo tipo de productos. Fomenta la avaricia entre los niños y genera ansiedad por el exceso de gasto y la fatiga entre los adultos. Es una Navidad con núcleo hueco. Eliminar el aspecto religioso de la Navidad es quitar el corazón y el alma de la Navidad.

A continuación viene la capa de Charles Dickens; Tarjetas que muestran escenas nevadas, fuegos crepitantes, pavo y jamón, pudines de ciruela y tartas de carne, reuniones familiares, buena voluntad hacia todos, filantropía y amplitud. Estos valores tienen mucho que decir a su favor. La mayoría de la gente tiene una oportunidad en esta versión de la Navidad. Pero, en ausencia de fe, ¿a qué se traduce esto? Quizá un poco de ánimo, unas pocas frases piadosas, algunos regalos dados y recibidos... Luego todo sigue como antes.

El tercer nivel es el de la Natividad; que para nosotros representa de qué va la Navidad. Esta es la capa de la obra de Nacimiento escolar, recreando la historia navideña que, en toda su sencillez, puede ser profundamente conmovedora.

La cuarta y más profunda capa es la espiritual; es la historia de cómo, en Israel, hace 2000 años, nació un bebé. En la persona de este bebé, el Hijo de Dios tomó nuestra naturaleza sobre sí y entró en nuestro mundo en debilidad y amor. Vino a recordarnos que somos hijos de Dios y que tenemos un destino eterno.

Existe una tendencia a descartar, o incluso condenar, las tres primeras capas, y a ver la capa espiritual como la única verdadera. Esto se basa en la suposición de que lo espiritual y lo material están opuestos entre sí.

No puede existir una Navidad puramente espiritual. El cristianismo incluye tanto la materia como el espíritu. Lo que tenemos que hacer es encontrar una conexión entre el mercado secular y el contenido espiritual de la fiesta. Gran parte de la compra y venta que se produce en Navidad fomenta el intercambio de regalos, las buenas acciones, la alegría y la afirmación de los lazos familiares.

Tendemos a hacer una clara división entre lo sagrado y lo secular, pero no lo encontraremos en Navidad. En Navidad, están tan entrelazadas que parecen ser lo mismo. La historia de Navidad (tal como se relata en el Evangelio) no está ambientada en una iglesia, templo o sinagoga, sino en el mundo cotidiano.

El nacimiento de Jesús, en un Belén abarrotado, es un recordatorio, para los secularistas entre nosotros, de que Dios no puede ser excluido; para los religiosos entre nosotros, es un recordatorio para evitar cualquier noción de confinar a Dios dentro de nuestras instituciones, porque Dios no puede ser retenido en ninguna de las dos.

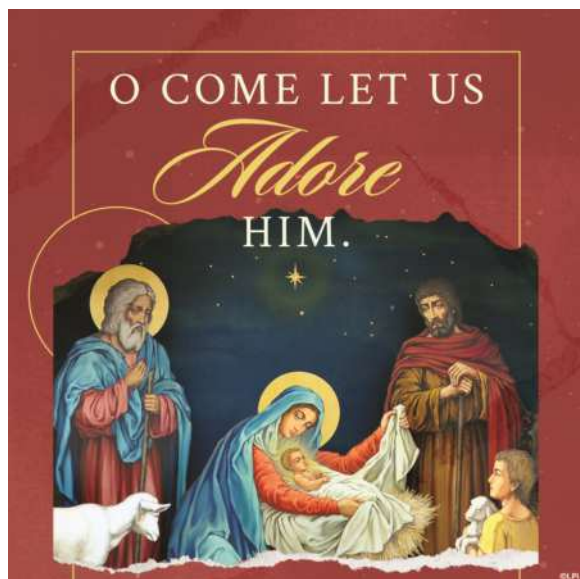

The Nativity of the Lord



Our hearts are aglow with the joy of Christmas! Our senses are alive with the season, from the rich smells of evergreen and gingerbread to the feel of crisp air on our skin and the warmth of a loved one's embrace. At some point in the holiday hustle and bustle, take a few moments of quiet. In the silence, reflect on the other senses of the season. Imagine the cool damp of an animal stable, the earthy smell of hay and feed, and the crisp night air blowing in softly. Imagine kneeling beside an exhausted, joyful mother and a relieved, protective father. Imagine an infant wrapped in cloth scraps held out to your open arms. Imagine holding the infant Jesus. As his eyes meet yours, welcome into your heart the greatest gift of Christmas.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

December 21, 2025—Fourth Sunday of Advent

Matthew: 1:18-24

A priest friend recently told me a remarkable story. One of his cousins reported having a vivid dream in which an angel told him the family needed to exhume their grandmother's body from a cemetery in New York and return it to her birthplace in Romania. She had been dead nearly 10 years. As you might expect, the family thought it was, well, crazy. But astonishingly they exhumed her body. It was incorrupt, showing no signs of decomposition. That experience sparked healing, faith, and reconciliation throughout the family.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Joseph also receives a dream. He's confused, afraid. But in the quiet of sleep, God speaks: "Do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home" (Matthew 1:20). When he wakes, Joseph acts. He doesn't overanalyze or dismiss the message. He trusts, and acts.



God still speaks — not necessarily through literal dreams but through those deeper intuitions of the heart. St. Ignatius of Loyola taught that God's voice draws us into peace, courage, and love. But we have to listen to it. Advent is a time for stillness. As we prepare for Christ's coming, we're invited to enter that quiet space where God's voice can be heard.

When and how do you become most receptive to God? Is it in silence? In prayer? In nature? At Mass? This week, go there. Be still. Listen. And like Joseph, have the courage to act on what God shows you. *Father John Muir*

21 de diciembre de 2025: IV Domingo de Adviento

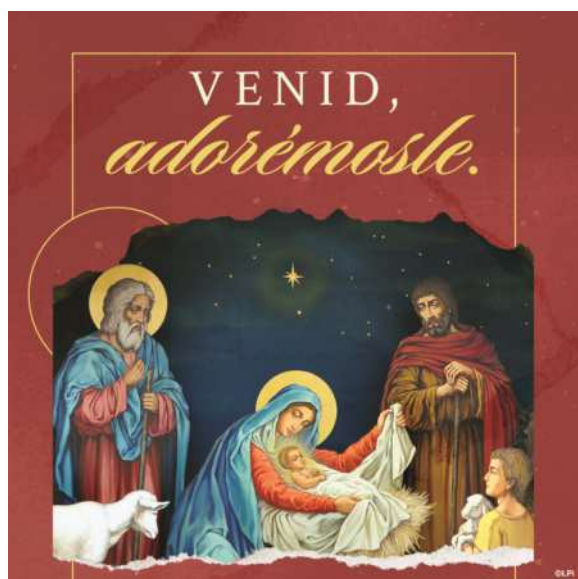
Mateo 1:18-24

En este último domingo de Adviento, Emmanuel, Dios con nosotros, está por nacer. Esta es la Buena Noticia que debe alegrarnos: comprender que el nacimiento de Jesús es la garantía de que Dios cumple su promesa con la llegada de su Hijo al mundo. El Evangelio nos da la oportunidad de contemplar el paso de la historia de la salvación en la humanidad. Dios se mezcla entre nosotros, se une a nuestros triunfos y fracasos. Ya no hay nada que temer: Jesús llega para iluminar nuestras tinieblas. “La virgen concebirá y dará a luz un hijo, y le pondrán por nombre Emmanuel, que significa: Dios con nosotros” (Mateo 1:23).

También la liturgia de hoy nos permite admirar a José, esposo de la Virgen, y tomar ejemplo de su valor, de su capacidad para guardar silencio y de su forma de actuar ante ella. José tomó la difícil decisión, en medio de la situación que vivía, de no difamar a María y repudiarla en secreto. Protegerla a ella y al niño fue su prioridad. “Tú eres el que pondrás el nombre al hijo que ella dará a luz. Y lo llamarás Jesús, porque él salvará a su pueblo de sus pecados” (Mateo 1:21). Gracias a esa prudencia y justo silencio de José, Jesús pudo nacer de María. ¿Cómo es mi prudencia ante los acontecimientos que atravieso en mi vida? ¿Sé guardar secretos para no destruir la vida de los demás? ¿He guardado espacios de silencio en este Adviento que me ayuden a mi crecimiento espiritual?

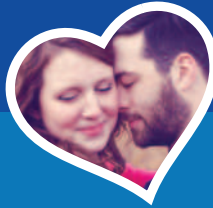


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
