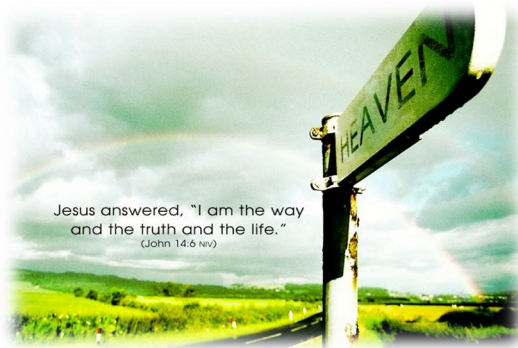
JESUS, THE WAY

All of us have experienced getting lost at some point and needing to ask for directions. We approach someone and ask, "How do I get to this place?" Usually, we receive one of three responses.

Sometimes the person says, "Sorry, I can't help you. I'm not from around here." That, of course, doesn't help. At other times, someone gives a long and complicated set of directions that only leaves us more confused. That isn't very helpful either.

But occasionally, we meet a kind person who says, "I know where it is. It's a bit complicated, so just follow me—I'll take you there." This person doesn't just give directions; they become our guide. It is refreshing and reassuring to meet someone like that.

In life, the most important journey we take is our journey to God. Many have found this path confusing. During the Last Supper, the apostle Thomas asked Jesus to show them the way to the Father. Jesus, who had a deep relationship with the Father, knew the way perfectly.



Instead of giving complicated instructions, Jesus offered something greater. He said, "I am the way. No one comes to the Father except through me." In other words, Jesus invites us to follow him, just as a guide leads someone to their destination.

Jesus continues to say to each of us, "I am the way." If we follow him, we will not be lost. He becomes our sure guide—like a star that never fades and a compass that never fails—leading us to the Father's house.

But what does it mean to follow Jesus? It means living according to his way. In the Bible, the word "way" often refers to a way of life. The early Christians even called themselves followers of "the Way," meaning they lived according to Christ's teachings.

At the Last Supper, Jesus spoke about "going away," which the apostles understood as his death. They were filled with sadness. Yet Jesus spoke not of an ending, but of going to the Father.

This reminds us that God is the true destination of our lives. Death is not the end, but a passage to our heavenly home. In the meantime, the Church is our spiritual home here on earth, built on Christ as its foundation. Within the Church, we are not alone, we journey together as brothers and sisters, encouraging one another as we make our way to the Father.

JESUS, EL CAMINO!

Todos hemos experimentado perdernos en algún momento y tener que pedir indicaciones. Nos acercamos a alguien y preguntamos: "¿Cómo llego a este lugar?" Normalmente, recibimos una de tres respuestas.

A veces la persona dice: "Lo siento, no puedo ayudarte. No soy de aquí." Eso, por supuesto, no ayuda. Otras veces, alguien da un conjunto largo y complicado de indicaciones que solo nos deja más confundidos. Eso tampoco ayuda mucho.

Pero de vez en cuando, nos encontramos con una persona amable que dice: "Sé dónde está. Es un poco complicado, así que sígueme—te llevaré allí." Esta persona no solo da indicaciones; se convierte en nuestra guía. Es refrescante y reconfortante conocer a alguien así.

En la vida, el camino más importante que hacemos es nuestro camino hacia Dios. Muchos han encontrado este camino confuso. Durante la Última Cena, el apóstol Tomás pidió a Jesús que les mostrara el camino hacia el Padre. Jesús, que tenía una relación profunda con el Padre, conocía perfectamente el camino.

En lugar de dar instrucciones complicadas, Jesús ofreció algo mayor. Dijo: "Yo soy el camino. Nadie viene al Padre sino por mi camino." En otras palabras, Jesús nos invita a seguirle, así como un guía a alguien hacia su destino.

Jesús sigue diciéndonos a cada uno de nosotros: "Yo soy el camino." Si le seguimos, no estaremos perdidos. Él se convierte en nuestro guía seguro—como una estrella que nunca se apaga y una brújula que nunca falla—guiándonos hasta la casa del Padre.

Pero, ¿qué significa seguir a Jesús? Significa vivir según su camino. En la Biblia, la palabra "camino" suele referirse a un modo de vida. Los primeros cristianos incluso se llamaban a sí mismos seguidores del "Camino", es decir, vivían según las enseñanzas de Cristo.

En la Última Cena, Jesús habló de "irse", lo que los apóstoles entendieron como su muerte. Se llenaron de tristeza. Sin embargo, Jesús no habló de un final, sino de ir al Padre.

Esto nos recuerda que Dios es el verdadero destino de nuestras vidas. La muerte no es el final, sino un paso hacia nuestro hogar celestial. Mientras tanto, la Iglesia es nuestro hogar espiritual aquí en la tierra, edificada sobre Cristo como su cimiento. Dentro de la Iglesia, no estamos solos, viajamos juntos como hermanos y hermanas, animándonos unos a otros mientras avanzamos hacia el Padre.

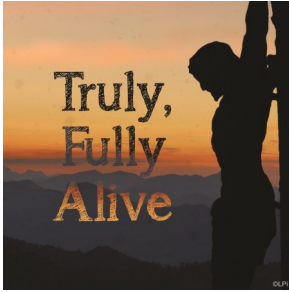

GOSPEL MEDITATION

May 3, 2026—5th Sunday of Easter

John 14:1-12



We generally approach life with the question, “What can this do for me?” We try a new workout, a low-carb diet, intermittent fasting, or a new career path, hoping it will make us healthier, stronger, happier. The assumption is that if I invest in this, I’ll eventually reap some benefit, or I won’t do it.

It is easy to think of faith the same way: if I really practice my faith, what will it do for me? Will it make me calmer, more moral, more successful?

But in today’s Gospel, Jesus says something astonishing. He doesn’t present himself as a teacher who shows us the way to life. He says, “**I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life.**” (John 14:6) He is not merely a guide toward some higher benefit. He *is* the benefit itself. To know him is to know Life.

Thomas Aquinas explains that every desire in the human heart — love, joy, meaning, all of our restless cravings — is really an indirect cry for life. Even despair testifies to this longing: people despair precisely because they feel they are not, and might never be, fully alive.

The good news is that Jesus is not simply the means to a better life; He is Life itself. To believe in him is to share in God’s own eternal vitality. Not simply later but even now. Faith is not a transaction that produces results — it is a union that fills us with joy. To be in communion with Christ is to be truly, fully alive.

The Way

A friend of mine who had family members belonging to several different religions once told me that there were as many different routes to Heaven as there were to the grocery store.

This was an analogy her family had used to remember that they all sought the same thing — God — even though they were going about the search in different ways.

I’ve thought a lot about her words in the years since she shared them with me. It’s not an untrue analogy — there are a lot of different routes to the grocery store. An infinite number, in fact. There is actually no “right” way to get to the grocery store, because it all depends on where you’re starting from and what other errands you have along the way.

And there are a lot of different routes to Heaven — likewise, an infinite number. It all depends on where you’re starting from. It all depends on what you have to do along the way.

There it is: the part that matters. **The way.**

Whether we’re talking about Heaven or the grocery store as our destination, all routes are not created equal. Some take too long. Some are impassable. Some are hard to navigate. Some are just plain made-up — the glitch of a GPS, the promise of a false prophet. And inevitably, if you take a less-than-ideal route, you will find yourself flagging down a pedestrian, asking, “I’m lost. Which way do I go?”

See, you can meander all you want. But in the end, you have to find The Way. And there’s only one. Don’t worry, though.

You’ll know him when you see him.

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

3 de mayo de 2026: V Domingo de Pascua

Juan 14:1-12

El amor de Jesús es tan grande por nosotros que quiere que estemos donde Él está. Cada una de sus palabras está llena de esperanza. Él se va a preparar un lugar para cada uno de nosotros: *“Y después de ir a prepararles un lugar, volveré para tomarlos conmigo, para que donde yo esté, estén también ustedes”* (Juan 14:3-4). Luego sigue mostrando su amor al decir: *“Yo soy el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida”*. No tenemos ninguna excusa para decir que no sabemos por dónde ir en la búsqueda de ser mejores. El único Camino es Jesús. Sin embargo, también existe la oportunidad de preguntar, como lo hicieron Tomás y Felipe. La tarea de Jesús es conducirnos al Padre; sus palabras nos dan serenidad y esperanza en la vida futura.



Es importante aprender, en nuestra vida cotidiana, que para llegar al Padre es por medio de Jesús. Jesús y el Padre son uno. Entonces, como bautizados, ¿cuál es nuestra tarea? Desde el tiempo de las primeras comunidades cristianas hasta nuestros días, la Iglesia ha tratado de seguir las enseñanzas de Jesús. Tenemos un Padre que nos ama, y confiar en Él nos da paz, aunque haya guerra y mucho sufrimiento en el mundo. Estamos llamados a luchar por la justicia y la paz, con acciones concretas cuando sea posible y con la oración, como nos lo recuerda el Papa León XIV:

“En verdad les digo: el que crea en mí hará las mismas obras que yo hago, y como ahora voy al Padre, las hará aún mayores” (Juan 14:12).

El Camino

Un amigo mío, cuya familia pertenecía a varias religiones diferentes, me dijo una vez que había tantas rutas diferentes hacia el Cielo como hacia el supermercado.

Esta era una analogía que su familia había usado para recordar que todos buscaban lo mismo — Dios — aunque la búsqueda fuera de diferentes maneras.

He pensado mucho en sus palabras en los años desde que me las compartió. No es una analogía falsa: hay muchas rutas diferentes para llegar al supermercado. De hecho, un número infinito. En realidad, no hay una forma "correcta" de llegar al supermercado, porque todo depende de dónde empieces y de las otras diligencias que tengas por el camino.

Y hay muchas rutas diferentes hacia el Cielo — igualmente, un número infinito. Todo depende de por dónde empieces. Todo depende de lo que tengas que hacer en el camino.

Ahí está: la parte que importa. ***El camino.***

Ya sea que hablemos del Cielo o del supermercado como destino, no todas las rutas son iguales. Algunas tardan demasiado. Algunas son intransitables. Algunas son difíciles de navegar. Algunas son simplemente inventadas: el fallo de un GPS, la promesa de un falso profeta. E inevitablemente, si tomas una ruta menos que ideal, te encontrarás haciendo señas a un peatón preguntando: "Estoy perdido. ¿Por dónde voy?"

Mira, puedes deambular todo lo que quieras. Pero al final, tienes que encontrar El Camino. Y solo hay uno. Pero no te preocupes.

Lo reconocerás cuando lo veas.

Witnesses for Jesus

This journey of faith is not always easy. Sometimes the greatest wounds are those we suffer when family members and friends wander away from God and leave us behind. The faith they had when they were younger is now strained, or they see the daily walking with Jesus to be too difficult. For them, Jesus becomes what Peter wrote about when he described Jesus as the stone that causes people to stumble and the rock that makes them fall. Our journey is hard enough, but watching a loved one stumble and fall is heart-breaking.

What are we to do in such a situation? Most importantly, we pray. We must realize that God is more powerful than us, and even if we can't make them see the truth, He can. Then we witness to the transformative power of Jesus by our own lives. We need to serve him in word and deed. We should let a joy of being a disciple enlighten our faces. Allow Jesus to work through us so that others may be drawn to him. Lastly, we must never lose hope. Many have walked long journeys alone only to find God far down the road. What will it take to bring someone to Christ? It might be an action, a word, or an emotion. We never know how certain people will be touched. That loved one is a gift from God in your life. Place them back in God's hands, and let Him pick them up if they have stumbled and fallen.

Testigos de Jesús

Esta travesía de fe no siempre es fácil. A veces, las heridas más grandes son las que sufrimos cuando los miembros de la familia y amigos se alejan de Dios y nos dejan atrás. La fe que tenían cuando eran más jóvenes ahora es tensa, o ven que el diario caminar con Jesús es demasiado difícil. Para ellos, Jesús se convierte en lo que Pedro escribió cuando describió a Jesús como la piedra que hace tropezar a las personas y la roca que los hace caer. Nuestro viaje es bastante difícil, pero ver a un ser querido tropezar y caer es desgarrador.

¿Qué debemos hacer en tal situación? Lo más importante, orar. Debemos darnos cuenta de que Dios es más poderoso que nosotros, e incluso si no podemos hacer que vean la verdad, Él sí puede. Luego, somos testigos del poder transformador de Jesús por nuestras propias vidas. Necesitamos servirle en palabras y hechos. Deberíamos dejar que el gozo de ser un discípulo ilumine nuestros rostros. Permite que Jesús trabaje a través de nosotros para que otros se sientan atraídos por él. Por último, nunca debemos perder la esperanza. Muchos han caminado largos viajes solos únicamente para encontrar a Dios mas adelante en el camino. ¿Qué se necesitará para atraer a alguien a Cristo? Puede ser una acción, una palabra o una emoción. Nunca sabemos cómo ciertas personas serán tocadas. Esos seres queridos son un regalo de Dios en tu vida. Colócalos de nuevo en las manos de Dios y deja que Él los levante si han tropezado y caído.

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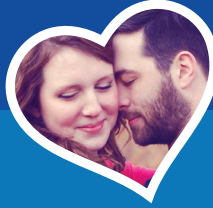


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
