LOVE AND OBEDIENCE



In today's Gospel, we hear part of Jesus' farewell discourse at the Last Supper. In those final hours with His Apostles, He spoke of what matters most and prepared them for life after His departure. Among His words is this simple but profound command: *"If you love me, keep my commandments."*

Jesus is not speaking only of a list of rules, but of a way of life—a call to true Christian discipleship. To be His disciple means more than words; it requires that we listen to Him and strive to live as He taught. Our faith is made visible in how we live each day.

It is important to understand that we do not keep His commandments in order to earn His love. Rather, we keep them because He already loves us. At that same supper, Jesus told His disciples, *"Love one another as I have loved you."* His love comes first—freely given, faithful, and without condition.

Each of us longs for this kind of love, yet we sometimes struggle to believe that God loves us so completely. We may think His love depends on our goodness. But the truth is simpler and far more powerful: God loves us because He is good. Our very lives are a sign of that love. This is the Good News—that we are loved first, and always. Our response is to return that love.

Jesus Himself lived this perfectly. Knowing the Father's love, He responded with total obedience, even to the point of giving His life. In the same way, we are called to show our love for Jesus through obedience—by hearing His word and putting it into practice. To love is to obey, and to obey is to love.

Words alone are not enough. Many profess love for Christ, but it is our actions that reveal the truth. Others come to know us not by what we say, but by what we do.

Living as a disciple is not easy, in any age. That is why Jesus gives us the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit strengthens us in weakness, comforts us in sorrow, and guides us in truth. When we struggle, we are never alone.

The Apostles knew they were loved by Jesus, and we share in that same love today. His love warms our hearts, gives purpose to our lives, and draws us closer to God and to one another. It is the very atmosphere in which we are called to live.

In the end, everything is summed up in this command of the Lord: *"Love one another as I have loved you."*

AMOR Y OBEDIENCIA

En el Evangelio de hoy, escuchamos parte del discurso de despedida de Jesús en la Última Cena. En esas horas finales con sus Apóstoles, habló de lo que más importa y los preparó para la vida tras su partida. Entre sus palabras está este mandato simple pero profundo: *"Si me amas, guarda mis mandamientos."*



Jesús no habla solo de una lista de reglas, sino de una forma de vida: un llamado al verdadero discipulado cristiano. Ser Su discípulo significa más que palabras; requiere que le escuchemos y nos esforcemos por vivir como Él nos enseñó. Nuestra fe se hace visible en cómo vivimos cada día.

Es importante entender que no guardamos Sus mandamientos para ganarnos Su amor. Más bien, los conservamos porque Él ya nos ama. En esa misma cena, Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: *"Que se amen los unos a los otros, como yo los he amado."* Su amor es lo primero: dado libremente, fiel y sin condiciones.

Cada uno de nosotros anhela este tipo de amor, pero a veces nos cuesta creer que Dios nos ame tan completamente. Podemos pensar que Su amor depende de nuestra bondad. Pero la verdad es más simple y mucho más poderosa: Dios nos ama porque es bueno. Nuestras propias vidas son un signo de ese amor. Esta es la Buena Noticia: que somos amados primero y siempre. Nuestra respuesta es devolver ese amor.

El propio Jesús vivió esto perfectamente. Conociendo el amor del Padre, respondió con total obediencia, incluso hasta el punto de dar su vida. De la misma manera, estamos llamados a mostrar nuestro amor por Jesús a través de la obediencia— escuchando Su palabra y poniéndola en práctica. Amar es obedecer, y obedecer es amar.

Las palabras por sí solas no son suficientes. Muchos profesan amor por Cristo, pero son nuestras acciones las que revelan la verdad. Otros nos conocen no por lo que decimos, sino por lo que hacemos.

Vivir como discípulo no es fácil, a ninguna edad. Por eso Jesús nos da el don del Espíritu Santo. El Espíritu nos fortalece en la debilidad, nos consuela en la tristeza y nos guía en la verdad. Cuando luchamos, nunca estamos solos.

Los Apóstoles sabían que Jesús les amaba, y hoy compartimos ese mismo amor. Su amor calienta nuestros corazones, da propósito a nuestras vidas y nos acerca a Dios y a los demás. Es la atmósfera misma en la que estamos llamados a vivir.

Al final, todo se resume en este mandato del Señor: *"Que se amen los unos a los otros, como yo los he amado."*

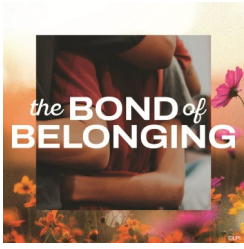

GOSPEL MEDITATION

May 10, 2026—5th Sunday of Easter

John 14:15-21

In my family, we can hardly speak about orphans without tears. My father was adopted as a baby. He frequently told us stories of how his parents welcomed him not just into their home but into their hearts. It was never merely a relocation or a legal transaction. It was the joy of being chosen, of receiving a family, a name, and a place where he belonged forever. Even in his later years, recalling that gift still moves him to tears of tender gratitude.

That is the kind of tenderness behind Jesus' words in today's Gospel: **"I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you."** (John 14:18) He is going away, but not abandoning us. Instead, he sends us the Advocate, the Holy Spirit — his own Spirit, shared with the Father — who dwells in us. Through the Spirit, Christ is present in us, and we are present in him. His Spirit gives us a home and a family.

We deepen this knowledge in the sacraments, in prayer, and in the daily life of the Church. The Spirit is the bond of belonging, the power that makes us God's sons and daughters, not spiritual orphans. And this is not a one-time event. There is always a deeper outpouring of the Spirit available to us, a fresh appropriation of the promise that we are never abandoned. If only we could be as grateful as my dad is for his adoption, realizing that we have been adopted by God Himself. In Christ, we are never left as orphans.

The Christ You See

"What if you are the only version of Christ someone sees today?" a friend once asked me.

My blood ran cold. *Jeez, I thought. That would be...really unfortunate.*

The world cannot accept the Holy Spirit, Christ tells us, because the world cannot see and know the Holy Spirit (John 14:17). But the world can see us. The world can know us. In this way, we accomplish the Great Commission: we go forth, and we make disciples of all nations. In all that we are and all that we do, we offer an explanation for our hope (1 Peter 3:15).

We face a unique situation, 2,000 years after the Resurrection, because our mission field is full of people who have already heard about Christ.

And they have *zero* interest, thanks-and-please-get-off-my-porch.

This Christ they've seen? He puts himself first. He's suspicious of other people. He's not interested in mixing with the wrong crowd. He's been known to lie, to abuse trust, to protect himself.

Here's the problem: they haven't seen Christ at all. They've only seen Christians.

It's easy to blame the obvious culprits: the priest consumed in public scandal, the parish trustee who stole from the coffers. But these are only larger versions of the same failure of which I am guilty each time I shiver at the thought of someone associating my behavior, my words, and my attitude with my Savior.

I am not Christ. I am nowhere close. But I am fortunate enough to be a member of his Body.

We all fail, of course. Every apostle, every saint, every bishop, every priest, every man and woman in the pews: we are all broken. We are all in need of redemption. When we accept that redemption, however, we also accept responsibility. Because now, we become what the world sees of Christ.

Am I ready to be the only version of Christ someone sees today?

EN LA PARROQUIA

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

10 de mayo de 2026: VI Domingo de Pascua

Juan 14:15-21

Las palabras de Jesús en la liturgia de hoy son como un testamento que se cumple con la llegada del Consolador: *“Si ustedes me aman, guardarán mis mandamientos, y yo rogaré al Padre y les dará otro Protector que permanecerá siempre con ustedes”* (Juan 14:15). ¿Qué nos toca cumplir a nosotros ante la petición de Jesús? Solamente una cosa: cumplir los mandamientos; es decir, vivir según el Evangelio, siendo caritativos y generosos. Aunque nos cueste dejar el egoísmo, la misericordia puede vencer por medio del amor.



“Cuántas personas se han alejado, por ejemplo, de la parroquia o comunidad por el ambiente de habladorías, de celos, de envidias que han encontrado. También para un cristiano, el saber amar no es un dato adquirido una vez para siempre; hay que volver a empezar cada día, hay que ejercitarse para que nuestro amor hacia los hermanos y hermanas que encontramos se vuelva maduro y purificado de aquellos límites o pecados que lo hacen parcial, egoísta, estéril e infiel. Cada día se debe aprender el arte de amar” (Papa Francisco, 21 de mayo de 2017). Más claro que el agua no puede ser: el Espíritu Santo nos acompaña, y la muestra de nuestro amor a Jesús está en practicar los mandamientos. Pidámosle a Jesús que nos ayude con su gracia a ser dóciles a la voz de Dios. La vida es difícil; se presentan muchas cosas cada día, pero por lo menos seamos coherentes en la fe.

Mini-reflexión: Todos necesitamos redención. Sin embargo, cuando aceptamos esa redención, también aceptamos una responsabilidad. Porque ahora, nos convertimos en lo que el mundo ve de Cristo.

El Cristo Que Ves

"¿Y si eres la única versión de Cristo que alguien ve hoy?" me preguntó una vez un amigo.

Se me heló la sangre. *Vaya, pensé. Eso sería... muy desafortunado.*

Cristo nos dice que el mundo no puede aceptar al Espíritu Santo porque el mundo no puede ver ni conocer al Espíritu Santo (Juan 14:17). Pero el mundo nos puede ver. El mundo puede conocernos. De este modo, cumplimos la Gran Comisión: avanzamos y hacemos discípulos de todas las naciones. En todo lo que somos y en todo lo que hacemos, ofrecemos explicación para nuestra esperanza (1 Pedro 3:15).

Nos enfrentamos a una situación única, 2,000 años después de la Resurrección, porque nuestro campo misionero está lleno de personas que ya han oído hablar de Cristo.

Y no tienen *ningún* interés, gracias y, por favor, fuera de mi porche.

¿Este Cristo que han visto? Se pone a sí mismo primero. Desconfía de los demás. No le interesa mezclarse con la gente equivocada. Se sabe que miente, abusa de la confianza, se protege a sí mismo.

Aquí está el problema: no han visto a Cristo en absoluto. Solo han visto cristianos.

Es fácil culpar a los culpables evidentes: el sacerdote consumido en un escándalo público, el administrador parroquial que robó de las cajas. Pero estas son solo versiones mayores del mismo fracaso del que me siento culpable cada vez que me estremezco al pensar que alguien asocie mi comportamiento, mis palabras y mi actitud con mi Salvador.

Yo no soy Cristo. Estoy muy lejos de eso. Pero soy afortunada de ser miembro de su Cuerpo.

Todos fracasamos, por supuesto. Cada apóstol, cada santo, cada obispo, cada sacerdote, cada hombre y mujer en los bancos: todos estamos rotos. Todos necesitamos redención. Sin embargo, cuando aceptamos esa redención, también aceptamos una responsabilidad. Porque ahora, nos convertimos en lo que el mundo ve de Cristo.

¿Estoy preparado o preparada para ser la única versión de Cristo que alguien ve hoy?

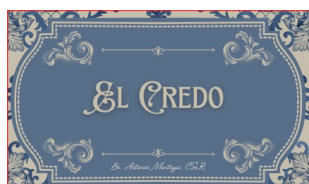

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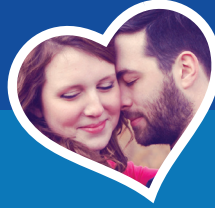


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
