SMALL BEGINNINGS, GREAT GRACE

Today, the Catholic Church embraces more than a billion faithful throughout the world. From every nation, language, and culture, believers gather as one people of God. Anyone who has visited places such as Sanctuary of Our Lady of Lourdes or Rome can sense the beauty and strength of belonging to something far greater than ourselves. It is a powerful experience to feel united in faith with so many others across the world.

Pentecost marks the birth of the Church. On that day, the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles in the form of wind and fire. Wind symbolizes the power of God, while fire represents the love of God. Together, they remind us that the greatest power of all is divine love.

Before Pentecost, the apostles remained hidden in fear behind closed doors. But once filled with the Holy Spirit, they emerged with courage and conviction, going forth to proclaim the Gospel to the world.

Although Scripture describes the coming of the Spirit in dramatic terms, the beginnings of the Church were actually very humble. The first Christian community possessed no buildings, no wealth, and no worldly influence. Their only strength was their faith in Christ and their openness to the Holy Spirit. In fact, the entire community could gather together in a single room. The Church must never forget these simple beginnings.

What those first believers lacked in numbers and resources, they made up for in faith, prayer, unity, and charity. The true strength of the Church has never depended on buildings, structures, or statistics, but on the holiness and faithfulness of its people.

While it is inspiring to belong to a worldwide Church, our faith is most deeply lived and nourished within the local community. We need the closeness of a parish family — a place where we know and support one another, pray together, and serve one another in love.

Here at St. Anthony de Padua, we already possess all that truly matters. Though we may not have great grandeur or worldly importance, we have the essentials of the Gospel: a community gathered around the Word of God and the Eucharist, remembering Christ in the breaking of the bread.



Most importantly, we have the Holy Spirit. The Spirit was not given only to the early Church long ago; the Holy Spirit remains with us today. The Spirit guides the Church, lives within each believer, and calls us to holiness. As St. Paul reminds us, "Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you?" (1 Corinthians 6:19).

It is the Holy Spirit who unites us as one family of faith, strengthens us in love, and gives us the courage to witness to Christ in our daily lives.

PEQUEÑOS COMIENZOS, GRAN GRACIA

Hoy en día, la Iglesia Católica acoge a más de mil millones de fieles en todo el mundo. De cada nación, idioma y cultura, los creyentes se reúnen como un solo pueblo de Dios. Cualquiera que haya visitado lugares como el Santuario de Nuestra Señora de Lourdes o Roma puede percibir la belleza y la fuerza de pertenecer a algo mucho más grande que nosotros mismos. Es una experiencia poderosa sentirse unido en la fe con tantos otros en todo el mundo.

Pentecostés marca el nacimiento de la Iglesia. Ese día, el Espíritu Santo descendió sobre los apóstoles en forma de viento y fuego. El viento simboliza el poder de Dios, mientras que el fuego representa el amor de Dios. Juntos, nos recuerdan que el mayor poder de todos es el amor divino.

Antes de Pentecostés, los apóstoles permanecían ocultos por miedo tras puertas cerradas. Pero una vez llenos del Espíritu Santo, emergieron con valor y convicción, yendo a proclamar el Evangelio al mundo.

Aunque las Escrituras describen la venida del Espíritu en términos dramáticos, los comienzos de la Iglesia fueron en realidad muy humildes. La primera comunidad cristiana no poseía edificios, ni riqueza, ni influencia mundana. Su única fortaleza era su fe en Cristo y su apertura al Espíritu Santo. De hecho, toda la comunidad podría reunirse en una sola sala. La Iglesia nunca debe olvidar estos simples comienzos.

Lo que a esos primeros creyentes les faltaba en número y recursos, lo compensaban con fe, oración, unidad y caridad. La verdadera fortaleza de la Iglesia nunca ha dependido de edificios, estructuras o estadísticas, sino de la santidad y fidelidad de su pueblo.

Aunque es inspirador pertenecer a una Iglesia mundial, nuestra fe se vive y se nutre más profundamente dentro de la comunidad local. Necesitamos la cercanía de una familia parroquial: un lugar donde nos conocemos y apoyemos, oremos juntos y nos sirvamos con amor.

Aquí en San Antonio de Padua, ya poseemos todo lo que realmente importa. Aunque quizá no tengamos gran grandeza o importancia mundana, tenemos lo esencial del Evangelio: una comunidad reunida alrededor de la Palabra de Dios y la Eucaristía, recordando a Cristo en la partida del pan.

Lo más importante es que tenemos al Espíritu Santo. El Espíritu no fue dado solo a la Iglesia primitiva hace mucho tiempo; el Espíritu Santo permanece con nosotros hoy. El Espíritu guía a la Iglesia, vive dentro de cada creyente y nos llama a la santidad. Como nos recuerda San Pablo: "¿No sabéis que vuestro cuerpo es un templo del Espíritu Santo dentro de vosotros?" (1 Corintios 6:19).

Es el Espíritu Santo quien nos une como una familia de fe, nos fortalece en el amor y nos da el valor para dar testimonio a Cristo en nuestra vida diaria.

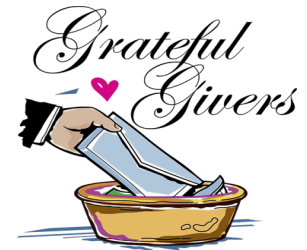

GOSPEL MEDITATION | May 24, 2026—Pentecost Sunday | John 20:19-23 (Father John Muir)

“He breathed on them and said to them, ‘Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained.’” (John 20:22–23)

For those of us who go to confession regularly, there is often a familiar frustration: “Why do I keep confessing the same sins?” It can feel like a loop, cleansed but unchanged.



Pentecost reveals a hopeful perspective. When the Risen Jesus breathes on his ashamed and fearful disciples and gives them the Holy Spirit, he echoes Genesis, when God breathes life into Adam. This is not just primarily the removal of guilt, but new creation.

In confession, we receive more than forgiveness. We receive a fresh outpouring, the breath of the Spirit, and a renewed mission. Jesus does not say to us, “You’re forgiven, now go back to your old life.” He says, so to speak, **“As the Father has sent me, so I send you.”** (John 20:21)

That is why penance is not just saying a few prayers. It is reorientation. It is the Spirit summoning us to live differently: with mercy and healing.

Just as Adam was sent into the world, and the Apostles were sent out after Pentecost, so too we are sent from the confessional — not just clean, but consecrated.

Pentecost Challenge: After your next confession, ask the Holy Spirit for one way you can participate in Christ’s healing will for you. Then take one small, concrete step, and do not look back.

Mini reflection: Much of what Jesus does in his resurrected Body is extraordinary and superhuman. He’s passing through locked doors. He’s in two places at once. But today, he’s just breathing. So, we have to ask ourselves: why?

Signs of Life

If you’re asthmatic, you know the phrase “as natural as breathing” doesn’t always make a lot of sense.

Maybe that’s because breathing isn’t always natural. Sometimes, it’s supernatural.

I come from a family of asthmatics. In my earliest childhood memories, my sister’s nose and mouth are covered with a bulbous plastic mask connected by clear tubes to her transportable nebulizer. The machine whirs loudly as it vaporizes the medication that will open her lungs. In these memories, I watch my sister — her little eyes wide, her chest contracting and constricting with great difficulty — and wonder what it feels like.

Because I don’t have asthma, and I don’t think about breathing, unless I’m climbing a flight of stairs or chasing down one of my kids. It’s such a utilitarian thing, breathing. It’s unimpressive, unremarkable. Literally anyone can do it.

Until they can’t.

Dead men don’t breathe. That’s what I think as I read the words of John’s Gospel: “He breathed on them.” (John 20:22) So much of what Jesus does in his resurrected Body is extraordinary and superhuman, making it unmistakable that here is a Body no longer playing by the rules of the physical world. He’s passing through locked doors. He’s in two places at once.

But today, he’s just breathing.

So, we have to ask ourselves: why? His Blood no longer requires oxygen. If he were asthmatic, neither bonfire nor damp night air could cause his lungs to constrict. His Flesh has been perfected.

But here we see a reality that is as spiritual as it is physical: where there is breath, there is life.

In Genesis, God breathes into dust and creates man. In today’s Gospel, He breathes His Spirit onto man and creates a Church.

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO | 24 de mayo de 2026—Dia de Pentecostes | Juan 20:19-23

El Espíritu Santo llena el vacío que la Ascensión del Señor había dejado en los discípulos. Ahora da comienzo la Iglesia naciente, con la fuerza del Espíritu Santo en sus corazones. Pentecostés es la realidad presente del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo en la Iglesia. Es el Espíritu quien nos sostiene, impulsa y fortalece. Este día, la Iglesia entera se anima con cantos y alabanzas por este gran acontecimiento: *“Dicho esto, sopló sobre ellos y les dijo: ‘Reciban el Espíritu Santo. A quienes descarguen de sus pecados, serán liberados, y a quienes se los retengan, les serán retenidos’”* (Juan 20:22-23).



La Iglesia es una, como lo recitamos cada domingo en el Credo, y es obra del Espíritu Santo. Como dice san Pablo: *“Hay diferentes dones espirituales, pero el Espíritu es el mismo. Hay diversos ministerios, pero el Señor es el mismo. Hay diversidad de obras, pero es el mismo Dios quien obra todo en todos. La manifestación del Espíritu que a cada uno se le da es para provecho común”* (1 Corintios 12:4-7). Esto nos recuerda que nadie es dueño de los ministerios en la Iglesia, ni puede aprovecharse del poder que se le otorga en el servicio. Solo somos servidores al servicio del Señor. El Espíritu Santo está para construir las comunidades, los grupos parroquiales, los movimientos y las organizaciones. Y la mejor manera de construir es obedeciendo al Señor, que nos dice en su Evangelio: *“¡La paz esté con ustedes!”* (Juan 20:21). La paz une, anima y fortalece.

Signos de Vida

Si eres asmático, sabes que la expresión "tan natural como respirar" no siempre tiene mucho sentido. Quizá sea porque respirar no siempre es natural. A veces, es algo sobrenatural.

Vengo de una familia asmática. En mis primeros recuerdos de infancia, la nariz y la boca de mi hermana estaban cubiertas con una mascarilla de plástico abultada conectada por tubos transparentes a su nebulizador transportable. La máquina zumba fuerte mientras vaporiza la medicina que abrirá sus pulmones. En estos recuerdos, observo a mi hermana — sus ojitos muy abiertos, el pecho contrayéndose y constriñéndose con gran dificultad — y me pregunto cómo se siente.

Porque no tengo asma y no pienso en respirar, al menos que esté subiendo una escalera o persiguiendo a uno de mis hijos. Es algo tan utilitario, respirar. No impresiona, no tiene nada de especial. Literalmente cualquiera puede hacerlo.

Hasta que ya no pueden.

Los muertos no respiran. Eso es lo que pienso al leer las palabras del Evangelio de Juan: "Él sopló sobre ellos." (Juan 20:22) Gran parte de lo que Jesús hace en su Cuerpo resucitado es extraordinario y sobrehumano, lo que hace inconfundible que aquí hay un Cuerpo que ya no sigue las reglas del mundo físico. Está pasando a través de puertas cerradas. Está en dos sitios a la vez.

Pero hoy, simplemente respira.

Así que tenemos que preguntarnos: ¿por qué? Su sangre ya no necesita oxígeno. Si fuera asmático, ni la hoguera ni el aire húmedo de la noche pudieran hacer que sus pulmones se contrajeran. Su Carne ha sido perfeccionada.

Pero aquí vemos una realidad tan espiritual como física: donde hay aliento, hay vida.

En el Génesis, Dios sopla en polvo y crea al hombre. En el Evangelio de hoy, Él sopla Su Espíritu sobre el hombre y crea una Iglesia.

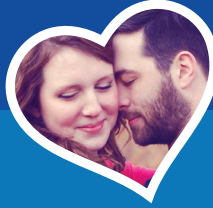


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
