Fr. Kevin's Korner

Gentleness and Humility



Jesus invites us with these comforting words: **"Learn from me, for I am gentle and humble of heart, and you will find rest for your souls."** In a world that often values power, competition, and self-promotion, gentleness and humility may seem like outdated virtues. Yet they remain at the very heart of Christian discipleship.

Gentleness is often mistaken for weakness. Many believe that to succeed in life, we must be tough and never show vulnerability. But true gentleness is not weakness, it is strength under control. Jesus Himself was gentle, especially with the poor, the sick, the sinner, and

the brokenhearted. Yet He was never timid. When the holiness of His Father's house was threatened, He boldly drove the money changers from the Temple. His gentleness flowed from inner strength, not fear.

It takes courage and confidence to be truly gentle. A gentle person does not seek to dominate others but to encourage and nurture them. As Henri Nouwen beautifully wrote, *"A gentle person treads lightly, listens carefully, loves tenderly, and touches with reverence."* These are qualities that heal relationships and reflect the compassionate heart of Christ.

Humility, too, is often misunderstood. It does not mean thinking less of ourselves or denying the gifts God has given us. Rather, humility means recognizing that every blessing comes from Him. A humble person knows that all they have and all they are is a gift from God's loving hand. This awareness frees us from pride and opens our hearts to serve others with joy.

Jesus promises that those who embrace gentleness and humility will find peace. Imagine how different our homes, our parish, and our world would be if we treated one another with greater kindness, patience, and respect. The proud and insensitive often make life burdensome for themselves and those around them. But the gentle and humble lighten the burdens of others and become instruments of God's peace.

May we strive each day to grow in these Christ-like virtues, remembering the words of **St. Seraphim of Sarov**: *"Acquire inner peace, and thousands around you will be saved."* When Christ's gentleness and humility take root in our hearts, His peace naturally flows into the lives of those we meet.

Dulzura y Humildad

Jesús nos invita con estas palabras reconfortantes: **"Aprended de mí, porque soy amable y humilde de corazón, y encontraréis descanso para vuestras almas."** En un mundo que a menudo valora el poder, la competencia y la autopromoción, la gentileza y la humildad pueden parecer virtudes anticuadas. Sin embargo, siguen estando en el mismo corazón del discipulado cristiano.

La gentileza a menudo se confunde con debilidad. Muchos creen que para tener éxito en la vida debemos ser duros y nunca mostrar vulnerabilidad. Pero la verdadera ternura no es debilidad, es fuerza bajo control. El propio Jesús fue amable, especialmente con los pobres, los enfermos, los pecadores y los desalmados. Sin embargo, nunca fue tímido. Cuando la santidad de la casa de su Padre fue amenazada, Él expulsó audazmente a los cambistas del Templo. Su gentileza fluía de la fuerza interior, no del miedo.

Se necesita valor y confianza para ser realmente gentil. Una persona amable no busca dominar a los demás, sino animarlos y nutrirlos. Como escribió bellamente Henri Nouwen, *"Una persona amable camina con ligereza, escucha con atención, ama con ternura y toca con reverencia."* Estas son cualidades que sanan las relaciones y reflejan el corazón compasivo de Cristo.

La humildad también suele ser malinterpretada. No significa pensar menos de nosotros mismos ni negar los dones que Dios nos ha dado. Más bien, la humildad significa reconocer que toda bendición viene de Él. Una persona humilde sabe que todo lo que tiene y todo lo que es un regalo de la mano amorosa de Dios. Esta conciencia nos libera del orgullo y abre nuestro corazón para servir a los demás con alegría.

Jesús promete que quienes abrazan la gentileza y la humildad encontrarán la paz. Imagina lo diferentes que serían nuestros hogares, nuestra parroquia y nuestro mundo si nos tratáramos unos a otros con más amabilidad, paciencia y respeto. Los orgullosos e insensibles a menudo hacen la vida una carga para ellos mismos y para quienes les rodean. Pero los suaves y humildes alivian las cargas de los demás y se convierten en instrumentos de la paz de Dios.

Que cada día nos esforcemos por crecer en estas virtudes cristianas, recordando las palabras de **San Serafín de Sarov**: *"Adquiere la paz interior, y miles de personas a tu alrededor serán salvadas."* Cuando la dulzura y humildad de Cristo echan raíces en nuestros corazones, Su paz fluye naturalmente en la vida de quienes conocemos.

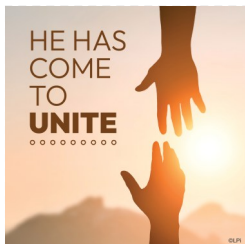

GOSPEL MEDITATION | July 5, 2026
 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time | Matthew 10:37-42
 (Father John Muir)

This weekend, our nation celebrates the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. Unlike most nations, the United States was not founded primarily on a shared ethnicity, language, or culture. Instead, our founders built a political community out of diverse peoples united by a shared vision of liberty. That vision echoes something deep in the Christian mystery revealed in today's Gospel.

Jesus returns to his hometown. The people see only what is familiar: the carpenter, the son of Mary, one of their own. As Mark tells us, **"They took offense at him. Jesus said, 'A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house.'"** Their narrow vision blinds them. Jesus has come to inaugurate a new communion that transcends geography, bloodlines, and culture. He has come to unite all people in himself.

At its best, America's national unity reflects this possibility, which fully subsists only in the Catholic Church. Our unity is not based on ancestry or tribe, but on a shared commitment to higher ideals. For this reason, we can love our country with gratitude while situating patriotism within the broader horizon of faith. Rooted in Christ, we are less vulnerable to the unholy tribalism that threatens civic life and faith. This weekend, let us thank God for our nation and pray that we also live as citizens of Heaven in Jesus Christ.

The Smallness of Great Faith

My children attend Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) for their faith formation. Because of its Montessori basis, CGS atriums, which are something like classrooms, contain lots of objects made from real materials — authentic glass, wood, and ceramic.

This is a polite way of saying there are lots of breakable things in there.

So when my four-year-old entered the atrium on her first day of CGS, my whole body tensed, wondering what she would shatter first. I had to restrain myself from crying out, "Don't touch anything!" She spotted the prayer table — the low, wooden stand which holds an open Bible, candles, a vase with flowers and a statue of the Good Shepherd. It's the centerpiece of every atrium.

She knelt before the table. She made the sign of the cross. And she sat there, still and silent.

I stopped dead in my tracks. How had she known to come here? And where did she learn to make the sign of the cross? (Obviously we've tried to teach her, but she does it wrong every time!) And why was she sitting there so quietly, so expectantly, in front of a book she can't read?

A thought came to me so clearly: *Well, Colleen, you can read that book. But can you understand it?*

It is so easy for us to forget that great faith does not require great intelligence. It does not require great knowledge of the world and its workings. Great faith does not require the believer to possess any answers.

Great faith only requires the believer to know his own smallness.

Vivimos en tiempos donde la gratitud y la confianza en la familia y en la sociedad han perdido su valor. Muy poco se agradece y la confianza está muchas veces a prueba entre las personas. ¿Dónde están esos sentimientos de aprecio por las cosas buenas?

Actualmente, ¿cuáles serán las cosas sencillas que debemos perseguir? La sencillez, la confianza y la gratitud, de seguro, se encuentran en una búsqueda sincera con el mismo Hijo de Dios. La base es la relación personal que llevemos con el Señor por medio de la oración y el acercamiento sincero a los sacramentos de la Reconciliación y la Eucaristía. Los cristianos no debemos permitir que la tibieza y el cansancio nos alejen de la búsqueda de un encuentro íntimo con Jesucristo para aprender de sus enseñanzas. Cada día es una oportunidad para un nuevo comienzo y para seguirlo con fidelidad. Recordemos que *“su yugo es suave y su carga ligera”*. ¡Es la promesa al seguirlo!

Me quedé paralizada en seco. ¿Cómo había sabido que debía venir aquí? ¿Y dónde aprendió a hacer la señal de la cruz? (Obviamente hemos intentado enseñarle, ¡pero siempre lo hace mal!) ¿Y por qué estaba sentada allí tan callada, tan expectante, frente a un libro que no puede leer?

Un pensamiento me vino tan claro: *Bueno, Colleen, puedes leer ese libro. ¿Pero puedes entenderlo?*

Nos resulta tan fácil olvidar que la gran fe no requiere gran inteligencia. No requiere un gran conocimiento del mundo y de su funcionamiento. La gran fe no requiere que el creyente posea respuestas.

La gran fe solo requiere que el creyente conozca su propia pequeñez.

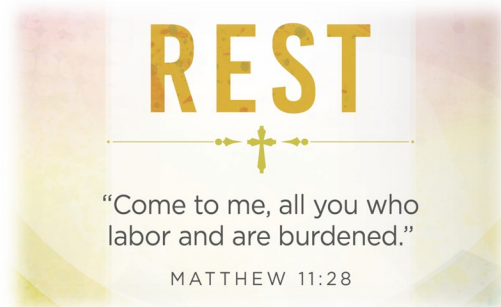

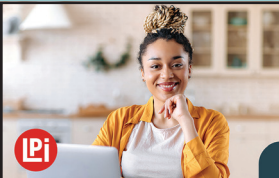

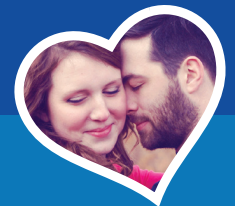
