SPIRITUAL CORNER

READINGS FOR TODAY

First Reading: I will raise up a prophet and I will put my words into his mouth. (Dt 18:15-20)

Psalm: If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts. (Ps 95:1-2, 6-7, 7-9)

Second Reading: A virgin is anxious about the things of the Lord, that she may be holy. (1 Cor 7:32-35)

Gospel: He taught them as one having authority. (Mk 1:21-28)

Eucharistic Miracle of MOGORO ITALY, 1604

Mogoro, on the Italian island of Sardinia, on the Monday after Easter 1604, Father Salvatore Spiga, pastor of the church of Saint Bernard, was celebrating Mass and after the consecration began distributing Communion to the faithful. At a certain point, he saw in the Communion line two men who were well-known for the dissolute lives they led. The pastor gave them Communion and as soon as they had taken the Host in their mouth, they spit them out on the stone floor below the altar rail. The two men justified themselves by saying that the Hosts had become as hot as burning embers, and that they were burning their tongues. Then, taken by remorse at not first having gone to Confession, they ran away. Father Salvatore went to gather the Sacred Hosts that had fallen and saw that their imprints remained in the stone as if they had been sculpted there. He ordered the stone to be thoroughly washed in the hope that the imprints would be erased. But every attempt failed miserably. Many historians, including Father Pietro Cossu and Father Casu, described the findings made by the bishop at that time, Antonio Surredo, and by his successors.

Among the most important documents that confirm the miracle is the a public act written by the notary Pedro Antonio Escano on May 25, 1686, in which the rector of Mogoro stipulates a contract for the construction of a wooden tabernacle over the main altar. At the base of the tabernacle, there was to be an opening for the "stone of the miracle," which was to be enclosed in a decorative case and placed in such a way that the faithful could see it. The stone bears the imprint of the Hosts to this day.



PAROCHIAL VICAR'S MESSAGE Fr. Peter Tauf A'Asau, MF Parochial Vicar

Today we are given an opportunity to focus on the power of authoritative teaching. In the First Reading, God, through Moses' mouth, promises to send another prophet who will teach with authority. The psalm is the familiar one which warns us to heed God's message. In the Second Reading, Saint Paul conveys his thoughts about marriage, mindful that at that time in his ministry, he is convinced that Jesus will return imminently. The Gospel presents us with Jesus' teaching authority both by means of words and action.

In the passage from Deuteronomy, Moses is seen addressing the people as he recalls the events that happened at the foot of

Mt. Sinai. At that time, they had been overwhelmed by God's authority, when God communicates directly with the people. The people no longer wanted to experience God so personally. They would rather have God relay information by means of a human spokesperson. Moses reassures them that God will continue to teach them by means of another human prophet, who, like Moses, will speak to the people on God's behalf. Moses also addresses future false prophets who do not speak with God's authority.

In this not too frequently read passage from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians, he shares his views on human relationships in light of what he believes to be the immediate return of the Lord Jesus and the end of time. Since, in Paul's mind, Jesus will be back in the very near future, Paul does not see any reason to become involved in relationships which distract one from being tuned into the ways of the Lord Jesus. Obviously, Paul was mistaken in thinking that Jesus would return during his lifetime. Obviously, also, is the fact that not everyone followed Paul's suggestion of not marrying and having children, otherwise we would not be here today.

As we continue in the first chapter of St. Mark's Gospel, we see Jesus' teaching authority as He ministers in a Sabbath synagogue service in Capernaum. Not only does Jesus teach with His powerful words, but he teaches about God's compassion and love as He exorcizes a demon from a possessed man. He also shows that His focus is to proclaim God's Good News of salvation and not center the focus on Himself.

These teachings must be communicated, as Jesus does, with full authority and clear understanding. All those responsible for handing on these beliefs must do so with conviction. They must be true prophets for God. And in some sense, all believers share in this important process. We are all to live lives which proclaim the Good News of the Triune God's love as manifested in the Godman, Jesus, and His life, teachings, death, and resurrection.

It is important for all of us who are believers to study the teachings of Jesus and His followers. We must learn not only from the words which Jesus spoke and which have been handed down to us. We must also learn from the life and ministry of Jesus and those who have lived out His life in their own lives. Part of the learning process demands that we learn to prioritize the instructions from Jesus and from the teachers who speak in His name. Certain things are essentials, the sine qua non "without which there is nothing" elements of living out the teachings of the Lord Jesus. Other things which are passed down to us through those who teach us are valuable lessons, but do not have the same priority as the essential dogmas and doctrines.

Thus, it is essential that we hear, listen, reflect on God's voice, and harden not hearts. That can only be done by continued reading and studying God's Word in scripture, relating it to how that is presented in the teachings of the Church and other believers. Conscious of the fact that God will lead us the more we are open to the divine Word, we must then live out God's will in a way which invites others to hear God's voice and come into a deep and personal relationship with the Lord Jesus. When we can do that, we will be able to echo the other words of today's psalm: "Come, let us bow down in worship; let us kneel before the Lord who made us. For the Lord is our God, and we are the people God shepherds, the flock the Lord guides."

Milagro Eucarístico MOGORO ITALIA, 1604

Mogoro, Cerdeña, el lunes de Pascua del año 1604, don Salvador Spiga, párroco de la iglesia de San Bernardino, estaba celebrando la Misa. Luego de la consagración comenzó a distribuir la Comunión a los fieles. En ese momento se acercaron dos hombres, conocidos por todos a causa de la vida disoluta que llevaban. Cuando el párroco les dio la Comunión, ambos la escupieron inmediatamente sobre la piedra del balaústre. Explicaron lo sucedido diciendo que las Hostias hervían como carbones encendidos y que les había quemado la lengua. Luego, sintiendo remordimiento por no haberse confesado antes. escaparon. Don Salvador hizo que se recogieran las sagradas Hostias y vio que en la piedra habían quedado como esculpidas las huellas de las dos Partículas. Ordenó que se lavase cuidadosamente la piedra, esperando que las huellas fuesen canceladas. Pero todo intento resultaba inútil. Numerosos historiadores, entre ellos el sacerdote Pedro Cossu y el Padre Casu, describen las pruebas de veracidad realizadas por el Obispo, Monseñor Antonio Surredo, y por sus sucesores.

Entre los documentos más importantes que confirman el Milagro, tenemos el acto público depuesto por el Notario Pedro Antonio Escano, el 25 de mayo de 1686, con el que el Rector de Mogoro estipuló un contrato para la construcción de una pequeña urna de leño dorado en la parte superior del altar mayor y, en cuya base, debería contener una cavidad para acoger la "piedra del milagro". Esta debía ser conservada dentro de una caja decorosa y colocada en modo que sea vista por los fieles. La piedra presenta aún hoy las huellas circulares E de las dos Hostias.

Hermanas y hermanos, la primera lectura nos lleva a hacer una comparación entre Moisés y Jesús. Para apreciar lo que esto significa necesitamos descubrir a Moisés; quiero decir: descubrir en qué sentido Moisés es un profeta. Se suele pensar que un profeta es alguien predice cosas. Y aunque los escritos tradicionalmente atribuidos a Moisés contienen algunas referencias hacia el futuro, por ejemplo: qué pasará cuando Israel sea infiel a Dios, no parece que ese sea el motivo básico de su lugar en el caminar del pueblo de Dios.

Más bien podemos decir que si un profeta habla con propiedad del futuro es porque de algún modo se aproxima a la mirada de Dios, el cual abarca todo. Esta proximidad tiene como fruto inmediato no tanto predecir sino mostrar la voluntad de Dios, que a menudo entra en contraste con los planes humanos. Vemos así que Moisés "el legislador" y Moisés "el profeta" son en verdad la misma persona, uno que con su testimonio y su oración hizo transparente el guerer de Dios para todo un pueblo. Y hay más: no se trata sólo de decir "esto quiere Dios;" se trata de mostrar "cómo nos quiere Dios." Las disposiciones de Dios serían pura imposición si no supiéramos de su amor que libera, de su ternura que es potente, de su sabiduría que rebasa a todos. Y de todo esto ha dado fe uno que supo vivir buscando su rostro: Moisés.

El ministerio de Jesús, según san Marcos, está lleno de obras de poder. Jesucristo no es una idea. No es tampoco un personaje de fantasía al que podamos ponerle las características, cualidades o defectos que a nosotros nos parezcan. Conocer a Jesús no es enterarse de un grupo de ideas, de una colección de anécdotas o de las aventuras de algún personaje extraño y más o menos simpático.

Conocer a Jesús es acercarnos a una vida. Él pertenece a nuestra historia. Aguí se nos habla de "testigos oculares", de una "narración ordenada" y sobre todo de un propósito: "para que conozcas la solidez de las enseñanzas que has recibido". La imaginación puede ser bella, pero no es sólida. Tratándose de Jesús, los hechos tienen la primera y definitiva palabra. Y de esos hechos nace una autoridad incomparable. El que enseña con autoridad y exorciza con autoridad primero ha mostrado esa autoridad sobre la historia nuestra, que en sus manos se reconstruye, limpia y florece.




