# SPIRITUAL CORNER

## READINGS FOR TODAY

### SOLEMNITY OF THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD

**Pope Francis St Peter's Basilica , 24 December 2022**

In order to rediscover the meaning of Christmas, we need to look to the manger. Yet why is the manger so important? Because it is the sign, and not by chance, of Christ's coming into this world. It is how he announces his coming. It is the way God is born in history, so that history itself can be reborn. What then does the manger tell us? It tells us three things, at least: closeness, poverty and concreteness.

Closeness. The manger serves as a feeding trough, to enable food to be consumed more quickly. In this way, it can symbolize one aspect of our humanity: our greed for consumption. While animals feed in their stalls, men and women in our world, in their hunger for wealth and power, consume even their neighbors, their brothers and sisters. How many wars have we seen! And in how many places, even today, are human dignity and freedom treated with contempt! As always, the principal victims of this human greed are the weak and the vulnerable. This Christmas too, as in the case of Jesus, a world ravenous for money, hungry for power and pleasure does not make room for the little ones, for so many unborn, poor and forgotten children. I think above all of the children devoured by war, poverty and injustice. Yet those are the very places to which Jesus comes, a child in the manger of rejection and refusal. In him, the Child of Bethlehem, every child is present.

The Christmas manger, the first message of the divine Child, tells us that God is with us, he loves us and he seeks us. So take heart! Do not allow yourself to be overcome by fear, resignation or discouragement. God was born in a manger so that you could be reborn in the very place where you thought you had hit rock bottom. There is no evil, there is no sin, from which Jesus does not want to save you. Christmas means that God is close to us: let confidence be reborn! The manger reminds us that he was surrounded by nothing but love: Mary, Joseph and the shepherds; all poor people, united by affection and amazement, not by wealth and great expectations. The poverty of the manger thus shows us where the true riches in life are to be found: not in money and power, but in relationships and persons.

*Jesus we behold you lying in the manger. We see you as close, ever at our side: thank you Lord! We see you as poor, in order to teach us that true wealth does not reside in things but in persons, and above all in the poor: forgive us, if we have failed to acknowledge and serve you in them. We see you as concrete, because your love for us is palpable. Jesus, help us to give flesh and life to our faith. Amen.*

### Mele Kalikimaka Merry Christmas

Each Christmas we contemplate the mystery of our God who became man. He is born in silence, poverty, simplicity and purity in Bethlehem, the house of bread. Our God made man later taking bread and wine transforms it into his body and blood; thus is the mystery of his Incarnation continued for us in the mystery of the Eucharist, God made real for us. God becomes man. Bread and wine become God-man. Each time we come to the Eucharist, we come to a new Bethlehem. He, who rested once in a manger, now rests in our entire being, as we receive him in the mystery of the Mass.

This is the true meaning of Christmas. The second person of the Blessed Trinity becomes incarnate. Jesus is true God and true man. He is one person with two natures, a divine nature, and a human nature. "For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man" (Roman Missal, third edition, Profession of Faith). We all have wonderful memories of how we have celebrated Christmas in the past. On this Christmas, we will relive those memories, create new ones, and cherish our fondest memories in the recesses of our hearts. The Lahaina fire should not stop us celebrating the Birth of Christ. The children and adults may not have the joy and excitement of opening Christmas presents; sampling the delicious foods and deserts that our mothers and grandmothers had prepared; the decorating of the tree; the setting up of the manger scene; the singing of Christmas carols; and of course, the gathering together of family members and friends, all make up the wonderful memories of Christmas. May be loss of one who brings joy in our hearts. Still, in the aftermath of the wildfire's devastation, let us find solace in the spirit of Christmas, embodying resilience, and unity. Just as a new day follows the darkest night, let our collective hope and compassion rebuild what the flames sought to destroy. I remember the birth of Christ who removes all darkness and fear from your hearts and family "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone. You have brought them abundant joy and great rejoicing, as they rejoice before you as at the harvest, as people make merry when dividing spoils"(Isaiah9:1-2).

Pope Benedict XVI wrote: "The birth of Christ challenges us to reassess our priorities, our values, our very way of life. While Christmas is undoubtedly a time of great joy, it is also an occasion for deep reflection, even an examination of conscience."

Once again, I wish you all a joyful and Blessed Christmas to all our friends who supported us with your prayers, financial assistance, and time to our parish family during the past months. May the New born child be with you and protect you .And the parish community remember and pray for all those who are affected by fire Remember you are not alone and you may approach us in any time and whatever way with in our limit we are her to support you and pray for you .May the Grace of with the grace of God be with you during the coming year.

### NATIVIDAD DEL SEÑOR - PAPA FRANCISCO Basilica Vaticana, 24 de diciembre de 2022

Para encontrar de nuevo el sentido de la Navidad hay que mirar allí, al pesebre. Pero, ¿por qué el pesebre es tan importante? Porque es el signo —no casual— con el que Cristo entra en la escena del mundo. Es el manifiesto con el que se presenta, el modo con el que Dios nace en la historia para hacer renacer la historia. Por lo tanto, ¿qué es lo que nos quiere decir a través del pesebre? Nos quiere decir al menos tres cosas: la cercanía, la pobreza y lo concreto.

La cercanía. El pesebre sirve para llevar la comida cerca de la boca y consumirla más rápido. Puede así simbolizar un aspecto de la humanidad: la voracidad en el consumir. Porque, mientras los animales en el establo consumen la comida, los hombres en el mundo, hambrientos de poder y de dinero, devoran de igual modo a sus vecinos, a sus hermanos. ¡Cuántas guerras! Y en tantos lugares, todavía hoy, la dignidad y la libertad se pisotean. Y las principales víctimas de la voracidad humana siempre son los frágiles, los débiles. En esta Navidad, como le sucedió a Jesús (cf. v. 7), una humanidad insaciable de dinero, insaciable de poder e insaciable de placer tampoco le hace sitio a los más pequeños, a tantos niños por nacer, a los pobres, a los olvidados. Pienso sobre todo en los niños devorados por las guerras, la pobreza y la injusticia. Pero Jesús llega precisamente allí, un niño en el pesebre del descarte y del rechazo. En Él, niño de Belén, está cada niño.

El pesebre de la Navidad, primer mensaje de un Dios niño, nos dice que Él está con nosotros, nos ama, nos busca. Ánimo, no te dejes vencer por el miedo, por la resignación, por el desánimo. Dios nace en un pesebre para hacerte renacer precisamente allí, donde pensabas que habías tocado fondo. No hay mal, no hay pecado del que Jesús no quiera y no pueda salvarte. Navidad quiere decir que Dios es cercano. ¡Que renazca la confianza!

Pero Jesús nace en el pesebre y allí nos recuerda que no tuvo a nadie alrededor, sino a aquellos que lo querían: María, José y los pastores; todos eran pobres, unidos por el afecto y el asombro; no por riquezas y grandes posibilidades. El humilde pesebre, por tanto, saca a relucir las verdaderas riquezas de la vida: no el dinero y el poder, sino las relaciones y las personas.

Jesús, te miramos, acurrucado en el pesebre. Te vemos tan cercano, que estás junto a nosotros por siempre. Gracias, Señor. Te contemplamos pobre, enseñándonos que la verdadera riqueza no está en las cosas, sino en las personas, sobre todo en los pobres. Perdónanos, si no te hemos reconocido y servido en ellos. Te vemos concreto, porque concreto es tu amor por nosotros, Jesús, ayúdanos a dar carne y vida a nuestra fe. Amén.

Hermanas y hermanos, Zacarías había quedado mudo. Le había pedido certeza al arcángel Gabriel, un modo de asegurarse él, porque no podía sentirse seguro con la sola palabra del mensajero. Ya que no le han bastado las palabras, el ángel le da una dura señal de certeza: lo deja mudo. Si la palabra del cielo no le convence, que se quede sin palabras en la tierra. Mudo y todo, Zacarías hace finalmente caso, ahora que ya se siente seguro: se une a su mujer y en el silencio engendra. De su silencio saldrá la Voz; en el silencio fue concebido Juan, el Bautista.

El evangelio de hoy nos transporta al momento bello y solemne en que ese silencio se quiebra. Todo hay que notarlo: Zacarías es interrogado por el nombre de su hijo, su único, y él renuncia a su propio nombre para dar a su hijo un nombre que expresa y canta la misericordia: "misericordia o gracia de Dios" es el nombre de Juan, según la etimología común. Sus primeras palabras, pues, son para alabar la misericordia, después de haberse desprendido, en cierto modo, de su propio derecho como padre. Todo habría que comentarlo en el cántico de Zacarías. Se le ha llamado resumen precioso de la esperanza del Antiguo Testamento, y así lo es. Fijemos nuestra atención esta vez en lo que ataña a Juan.

Juan es aquí el "profeta del Altísimo", y también el que va "delante del Señor". Anuncia, porque es profeta, y muestra, porque va delante. Su voz tiene el tono ardoroso del que espera y el entusiasmo maravilloso del que ve llegar al esperado. En él se abrazan la esperanza y la llegada. Su alma conoce los dolores de la ausencia y el gozo de la presencia.

Ir "delante del Señor" es mucho más que contar a los demás que el Señor está cerca. Los Evangelios nos muestran el altísimo precio, precio de sangre, que implicó para Juan esto de "ir delante". Ni más ni menos quiere decir que todo cuanto sucedió a Cristo de algún modo sucedió primero a Juan. Y ya sabemos cuál vida fue la del Señor Jesús, de donde entendemos que clase de misión es esta de preceder al redentor del mundo. Juan no es el único precursor. En Lc 10,1 leemos: "el Señor designó a otros setenta, y les dijo: "os envío como corderos en medio de lobos" (Lc 10,3).

Ya está aquí el Niño Jesús, que llega cada año a este mudo, y espera que tu estés con las puertas abiertas de tu corazón para recibirla y lo hagas parte principal de tu vida.

De todo corazón les deseo una Feliz Navidad.




